Our students actively engaged in the annual Mater Chess Tournament, with over forty participants from various year groups competing to accumulate points for their respective Houses.

It has been a busy week for our Year 10 students. The Faith-in-Action group visited the Catholic parish of Mount Druitt with Jesuit Social Services to learn about ongoing initiatives and how Mater Maria can contribute. They also brought along goods donated for the annual Year 10 Christmas Appeal.

Our annual Year 10 Enrichment Program included sessions on Aboriginal spirituality, an Adulting 101 workshop, self-defence and mindfulness.

Year 10 students travelled to Killalea Regional Park for a three-day camping trip, where they collaborated to bring food supplies, tents, and all necessary camping gear for their adventure. This program is designed to cultivate friendships, encourage challenges and promote a growth mindset.

Students in Years 8–11 participated in The Samba Experience, where elective Music students immersed themselves in the vibrant rhythms of Brazilian samba, fostering teamwork and musical skills as they learned to play various instruments and create a dynamic ensemble performance.


Year 11 Drama students attended the production of Dear Evan Hansen at the Roslyn Packer Theatre in Sydney to assist in developing their individual projects.


Year 12 students held a \$15 Formal as a community builder and charity fundraiser, with all funds raised donated to Caritas Australia's Project Compassion.

Advent: A Guide for the Perplexed



Advent is not only one of the great seasons of the Church's year; it's the beginning of the new liturgical year, though maybe it doesn't always feel that way. For some of us, perhaps, Advent is not a season we fully engage with. As the work year hurtles towards its conclusion and we get caught up in all the busyness, Advent tends to recede into the

But Advent is supposed to be a time of spiritual renewal: a chance to start again, to come home if we've drifted away, to rediscover the joy of knowing Jesus Christ. Jesus comes to make his home among us and within us. Advent offers us a chance to rediscover this.

So it's worth spending some time thinking about what Advent is, why it exists and how we might enter into it more intentionally.

The History of Advent

The origins of the season are a bit fuzzy. In Rome, a season of preparation for Christmas didn't appear until the sixth century. Before that, evidence suggests that it developed within a few local churches before spreading elsewhere. For instance, in Spain and France, it was common by the fourth century to observe

feast of the Epiphany. It was only in 581, in France, that a longer season was established and Christians would pray and fast from 11 November (the feast of St Martin of Tours) until Christmas. In this way, Advent takes inspiration from Lent.

What does 'Advent' mean?

The word advent comes from the old Latin word adventus, which refers to an 'arrival, an approach or a coming'. In the context of the leadup to Christmas, it refers to the coming of Christ.

A Season of Anticipation

So while Advent was inspired by Lent, its spirituality is quite different. There is a sense of both waiting and preparation, ideas that are both captured in the concept of anticipation.

Anticipation is not simply a feeling of waiting or expectation. It is a doing, even if it's a slow doing. The word anticipation comes from the Latin word anticipare, which means 'to take possession of beforehand' or 'take care of ahead of time'

The Four Themes of Advent

There are four themes corresponding to each week of Advent, beginning with the Sundays.

First Sunday of Advent: Hope
Hope doesn't come from nowhere. The
hope of God's people in the Bible comes
from the fact that God made them
specific promises: of peace, of an eternal
kingdom to be established by the
Messiah, of a creation finally healed and
at rest. So the readings for this week
focus especially on God's promises.
Becoming acquainted with these
promises is a good first step in coming to

Second Sunday of Advent: Preparation

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths' (Luke 3:4). As we dwell on these words of St John the Baptist, our sense of anticipation begins to ramp up in the second week of Advent. The promises of God continue, and there's a greater focus of one promise in particular: 'he is coming to save you' (Isaiah 35:4). The message this week is clear: get ready to be saved.

Third Sunday of Advent: Joy
When promises are fulfilled, when a
long-awaited hope has been met, there is
only one reasonable response: joy. When
the Magi from the East saw the star
above the place where Jesus was,
Matthew says, 'they rejoiced with very
great joy' before prostrating themselves
in worship (2:10). The shepherds
likewise 'went back glorifying and
praising God for all they had heard and
seen, just as they had been told' (Luke
2:20). The third week of Advent is an
opportunity to experience the 'very great
joy' of knowing Jesus.

Fourth Sunday of Advent: Love
Finally, we come to the ultimate theme of Advent, the one that makes sense of everything else: love. The readings for this week focus on how the birth of Jesus through Mary is one of the deepest revelations of God's love. One of the antiphons in the leadup to Christmas reads: 'O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!' The coming of Jesus to live among us and to share our humanity confirms this truth: God really does love us.

When Christ comes may he strengthen your hearts in holiness.

May the Lord be generous in increasing your love and make you love one another and the whole human race as much as we love you. And may he so confirm your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless in the sight of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus Christ comes with all his saints.

Finally, brothers, we urge you and appeal to you in the Lord Jesus to make more and more progress in the kind of life that you are meant to live: the life that God wants, as you learnt from us, and as you are already living it. You have not forgotten the instructions we gave you on the authority of the Lord Jesus.

REFLECTION



The readings of the First Sunday of Advent set the stages for our reflections on the entire season. They contain a number of promises, all pointing to peace and fulfilment. Each reading depicts a dimension of suffering that was often brought on by the people themselves. The promises are assurances that the end of their suffering was in sight. The promises reveal a loving and provident, a merciful and forgiving God. These are promises full of hope. The coming of the Lord is clearly a time of expectation, not of fear and trembling. Although the earlier tradition about the Day of the Lord included punishment of the wicked, the focus here is on redemption. The time of expectation may be preceded by apocalyptic signs in the heavens and dismay on earth, but this cosmic shift will bring fulfilment, not destruction. The love and providence, the mercy and forgiveness of God will be made manifest.

What is expected of those who receive the promise? An Advent way of life

exhorts us to 'wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ'. This way of life is both simple and profound. It does not necessarily require unusual behaviour on our part, but it calls us to live the usual unusually well. It affects the everyday events of life; it directs the way we interact with people; it informs the attitudes that colour our judgments and motivations. It is as ordinary as the birth of a child; it is as extraordinary as the revelation of God.


