






Carlo Acutis' Canonisation to Sainthood

The Significance of the Feast of Christ the King



I am writing this article on the Feast of Christ the King. Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925. In his Encyclical Letter, Quas Primas, he wrote, "That these blessings may be abundant and lasting in Christian society, it is necessary that the kingship of our Savior be as widely as possible recognized and understood, and to that end nothing would serve better than the institution of a special feast in honor of the Kingship of Christ."1 In the world of 1925, and even more significantly, in 2020, it is often easy to be distracted and forget that Jesus Christ is not just our Lord and Savior, but He is also our King. Like loyal subjects, we MUST serve our King faithfully with our whole heart, mind, soul, and strength.

In the materialistic society we live in today, many people focus more on making money and acquiring things than they focus on serving God. Jesus tells us, "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon (material wealth)." In today's world, it seems more people are serving mammon than serving God. Look at how many people, especially in political discussions, seem to despise God. We NEED the Feast of Christ the King to bring our focus back to where it belongs - to Jesus Christ.

We can only have one King. Either Jesus Christ reigns or the Evil One reigns. To quote Canon David Silvey, of the Oratory of St. Leo the Great, "We cannot be for Christ, and yet deny His authority over all people everywhere, even in the public square." If we are for Christ, we must be for Christ EVERYWHERE. At Mass, at home, at work, in the public square, and in the voting booth. We must allow Jesus to reign over our entire lives. If there is any part of our lives over which we do not allow Jesus to reign, we must honestly ask ourselves why. Jesus said, "He who is not for me, is against me." Are you with Jesus or against Him? If you are with Him, acknowledge His Kingship and allow Him to reign over your life completely.

Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

Communion Antiphon Psalm 28:10-11

The Lord sits as King for ever. The Lord will bless his people with peace.

REFLECTION by Diane Bergant

Each one of the readings depicts the enthronement of Christ who is revealed as the messiah-king. Until his trial, Jesus himself refused to be identified as king. The royal messianic expectations that prevailed during his lifetime were predominantly political. If he assumed them, his followers might have instigated a rebellion against the Roman occupiers. When finally he did acknowledge his royal identity, he insisted that his rule was not like that of other kings. Enthroned in heaven, Christ is revealed as the faithful witness to all that God has done and will continue to do. As first-born from the dead, his resurrection is the promise of our own resurrection. The dominion that he received from God is universal and exclusive and it will last forever. When he comes again on the last day, he will be revealed in all his glory. Christ's kingdom is a kingdom of truth and life, of holiness and grace, of justice and love and peace. We need not stand at a distance from him, afraid to approach because of our human vulnerability. He is the one who loved us so much that he handed himself over to suffering and death so that we might live. He has already brought us to birth in this kingdom through Baptism and he has taught us how to live in it. Today we look to that time when his glory will be revealed, when we will all be gathered into the embrace of God, there to sing praise to that glory forever.


