

#### Taste the Wine

I may strike us as slightly curious that the first miracle performed by Jesus in John's Gospel is not a cure or exorcism of some kind, but rather it is the conversion of water into wine - fine wine and in a generous quantity. Wine is an almost universal symbol of celebration and joy, and reveals much of Christ's vision of human life. He came, after all, that we may have life and have it more abundantly. Christian life is thus a gift and an expression of God's gracious love, not merely a duty or a trial. It is good to ask ourselves from time to time, 'Am I enjoying life? Am I taking the time to do things that make me happy?' Such a question is born not of mere selfishness, but rather reflects true gratitude for God's gifts. Moreover, we have very little chance of being kind, patient and generous with others unless we are firstly kind, patient and generous with ourselves that is to say, unless we take the time to drink the wine (real or metaphoric) of the good things of creation.

#### **Family Blessings**

Throughout the world, a wedding is a time of celebration, shared food and drink, community rejoicing and family bonding. In many traditions the couple's community and family are more than mere bystanders, and even active participants in the ceremony, there to witness to and bless the new state into which the couple are entering. Indeed, in some marriage services, after the couple have given their consent, the congregation are asked a question as part of the service – "Will you, the families and friends... support and uphold them in their marriage now and in the years to come?" The response is, "We will."

Without that support, the blessing of friends and family, a marriage has a much more difficult path. Families and friends can't make a marriage work, but they can certainly destroy it. So getting their consent to "support and uphold" the couple in their marriage is vital. The blessing of such an occasion is therefore not just for the couple, but also for all who are present – and that blessing comes through sharing hopes, prayers, songs, food, drink and laughter. ### **Joyful Celebration**

The banquet in God's kingdom for all people, for the whole of creation, is that place where enmity is over and sharing begins – where people who arrive as strangers depart as friends, where blessing is found in the simplest of things – good food shared with love and good drink shared with delight. To picture God's banquet as a wedding feast invites us all to begin with a smile, a relaxation of the tension that we so often carry around with us, and which leads to dis-ease and disharmony between us and our fellow human beings.

In today's Gospel reading Jesus appears to be uncertain whether the time is right to show what God's kingdom looks like. So his mother intervenes and the blessing of wonderful wine for everyone is given. As this story shows, God is not mean with blessing. The guests will have drunk a lot already and here is a further abundance – enough to last for days! When we meet in worship, do we do so in a spirit of joyful celebration, or is it a grudging display of piety? Is our sharing of God's abundance too limited in our lives, in our communities? Do we dare to make room for more people, and share with them in a spirit of delight and joy? Are we bold enough to let God's blessing alight on whom it will, rather than keep it for ourselves? This is the challenge of our Gospel today.

#### **New Interment Fees**

Cemeteries & Crematoria NSW (CCNSW) is the regulator of cemeteries and crematoria in NSW. They have introduced levies to fund their work which will take effect from 1 July 2025 as follows:

Cremation \$41

Ash Interment \$63

: \$63 Burial \$156

This will affect all Ash Interments in our Memorial Walls. The fee of \$63 will be payable to the parish at the time of interment, when the Plaque Engraving cost is paid, and the parish will have to pay these fees to CCNSW quarterly. More information available at the parish office.
