

## **Inseparable Actions**

The scribe asked Jesus what the greatest commandment was. He was right in asking because there existed hundreds of statutes and commandments. It was important for a law-abiding scribe to get the opinion of Jesus as to which commandment was to be given priority. Jesus' answer combines two distinct verses found in the Old Testament: loving God with one's whole being (*Deut 6:4*) and loving one's neighbour as oneself (*Lev 19:18*). For Jesus love of God and love of neighbour are inseparable actions, like two sides of the same coin. Loving God automatically leads one to loving one's neighbour who is a child of God. Right relationship with God presupposes right relationship with our brothers and sisters. Forgiving our brothers and sisters is a precondition for obtaining forgiveness from God. Jesus the High Priest who offered the one and ultimate sacrifice to God for our sake is our intercessor before God in our effort to love and serve God and neighbour.

## Pastoral Works Broken Bay Appeal

Our Pastoral Works are at the forefront of our community, serving those in need. The Appeal mainly supports two key Diocesan ministries which get little or no government funding: The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD), which takes the Gospel to approximately 12,000 public school children; and Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Programme, visiting more than 3,000 individual patients in our hospitals. Funds raised go directly to these ministries. Our Appeal will be held next weekend 9/10 November, with donation envelopes available on the pews. Our quota for this year is \$56,127.00. Through very generous donations we have received \$29,390.00 already, leaving a balance of \$26,737.00 owing. Donations are 100% tax deductible.

### The Ears of Our Hearts

The great commandment given by God to Israel begins with the words: 'Listen, Israel.' The word, 'listen' is very important. We can only love God with all our heart and our neighbour as ourselves if we are willing to listen deeply to the voice of God and the cry of our neighbour.

The conversation between Jesus and the scribe in today's Gospel is an encounter of deep listening. Each listens to what the other is saying. The scribe asks Jesus: 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' He listens closely to Jesus' reply and acknowledges the truthfulness of Jesus' words. At the end, Jesus praises him saying: 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.'

The greatest respect, indeed, love, that we can show to anyone is to listen to what they are saying, to listen with humility and patience, to listen with the ears of our hearts, to take the risk of allowing what the other person is saying to change us in some way. Perhaps a good resolution for this week is to listen deeply to what one person is saying to us, perhaps a very familiar voice that we hear all the time and pay attention to only rarely. This week, let us seek to listen deeply to that person with the ears of our hearts.

The words 'I love you' imply a total commitment of heart, soul, mind and strength one to another, a promise given freely and for all time. This is the kind of commitment Jesus speaks about to the scribe - loving God unreservedly, loving myself and my neighbour in the same way that God loves me. What awe-inspiring words 'God loves me'. God loves me unreservedly. God is there for me no matter what. In return, I want to love God and to express that love in real ways. Jesus commends the wisdom of the scribe who seemed to really understand that this was the only way to keep the commandments. Why not take a few moments today to hear God saying 'I love you'. As Moses said to Israel, let these words be written on your heart. What do I want to say in return? Can I respond wholeheartedly in the psalmist's words: 'I love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour'?


