N obody said that living through turbulent times would be easy for anyone. Even when our lives seem far removed from those who are more directly affected by current strife. We should not underestimate the power of our shared humanity, nor do we need to feel survivor's guilt when we are shaken by events happening to other people, in other parts of the world. Through our faith and hope in the Lord, we find the trust to face any adversity, knowing that our redemption is drawing near. "My words", says Jesus, "will not pass away." In stormy times, our hope is anchored in the eternal promises of God.
