Set Apart


It is prescribed in the law of Moses (cf Lv 12:2-8) that after the mother's period of purification, the child is to be brought to the temple as an act of consecration to the Lord (cf Ex 13:2, 12). To be consecrated means to be "set apart" to do the works of God. From his birth, Jesus has been set apart for a mission-to do God's works. Mary and Joseph are presented in the Gospel as devout and pious Jews, obedient to the Mosaic law.

Our baptism makes us children of God and members of the mystical body of Christ, the Church, a divine and human institution with laws to be followed. The Church is also called "Mother," a fitting image indeed. A mother nurtures, protects, and comforts her children. This is perfectly embodied in our Blessed Mother, given to us by Jesus at the foot of the cross (cf Jn 19:27).

Solidarity with Humankind

The feast of the Presentation helps us realise three important points: 1. Christ Jesus, although Son of God, makes himself humble enough to obey what the law prescribed. His solidarity with humankind was total in all respects. He also identifies himself with the lowly in choosing to make the offerings of a pair of turtle doves or two young pigeons. 2. His purification ceremony and offering in the temple foreshadows his self-offering on the cross for the salvation of humankind. Simeon recognises him as "a light of revelation for the gentiles and glory for your people Israel". The babe who was offered in the temple is the Saviour of the world. 3. Like Simeon and Anna we need to recognise the Saviour in our midst and receive him into our lives. This is possible only if we long for him through prayer and meditation on the word of God.


