Racing for the Finish

The readings today are a reminder that God has done, and will continue to do, great things in our lives. Isaiah, however, reminds us that there is no gain in continually dwelling on the past; rather we are called to notice God 'doing a new deed' as God calls us into the future. The woman brought before Jesus knows she has already been judged by the crowd around her and expects the same from Jesus. Yet, in her misery she finds Jesus offering her mercy and compassion. He releases her from her past and offers her a future full of possibilities. Paul says all he wants is 'to know Christ and the power of his resurrection'. What a great mantra for this final week of Lent! We too are 'straining ahead for what is still to come ... racing for the finish'. We only have a few more days with Jesus before he enters Holy Week. Can we allow him to look at us in the way he looked at the woman - to accept the mercy and compassion he offers and to be rescued from behaviours and judgements that may in the past have been harmful to others? There is still time to glimpse the new deed God is doing in us.

Congratulations First Reconciliation Students!

This week we commend our students on completing their preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation! Well done to you all and your families who have supported you throughout the programme.

A Catholic's First Reconciliation is a significant milestone in their spiritual journey. It marks the beginning of their understanding of sin and forgiveness, and it provides them with an opportunity to experience God's mercy and grace. Learning how to go to confession is an essential step in this spiritual process.

Children generally experience their first Reconciliation in our Diocese from the age of nine, when they begin to develop a more mature understanding of right and wrong, and the need to say 'sorry'.

Before their first Reconciliation, the children have participated in classes which have taught them about the concepts of sin, forgiveness, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They have learnt how to examine their conscience, which is a critical part of preparing for confession.

In the Examination of Conscience the children are encouraged to reflect on their actions and thoughts, identifying any instances where they have fallen short of God's teachings. This introspection helps them develop a deeper understanding of sin and the need for forgiveness. The examination of conscience is a key practice in preparing for both a child's first and all future confessions.

Then the children are guided through the process of going to Confession, which involves expressing their sins to the priest. They are encouraged to be honest and remorseful, seeking God's forgiveness. The priest may offer guidance and encouragement, addressing any concerns or questions the child may have. He may also assign a penance, which is typically a prayer or act of service that helps the child make reparation for their sins. The priest then, acting in the person of Christ, absolves the child of their sins, restoring their relationship with God. This is a moment of great spiritual relief and renewal for the child.

The Verdict

It is a poignant and significant scene: Jesus, and the woman surrounded by malicious men with stones in hand. The accusation over, Jesus bends down and doodles on the ground; the woman, weak in every sense, stands in the middle trembling. There is silence, pregnant, significant, and suffocating. The woman is silent as she knows she is guilty. The men are silent as they wait with bated breath for the verdict. Then from the depth of his being comes the unexpected and unsparing verdict: "Let him who is without sin...." The case is settled justly - everybody getting their due. Jesus tells the woman: "Neither do I condemn you." St John in the very first chapter of his Gospel stated that God sent his only Son not to condemn but to save. To share in the salvation brought by Jesus, she has to stop sinning. Hence the injunction of Jesus: "Do not sin again." So far she led a sinful life. Like the prodigal son, she too was dead, now she is restored to a life of dignity and holiness. Making responsible use of her freedom, now she has to nourish and grow in this life.
