What is a Family Group? A family group is for all who wish to belong, whether they are young or old, church-going or not, married, single, widowed, separated or divorced. The family group's aim is to get to know each other and support one another through good times and bad, sharing each other's joys and sorrows.

Family groups are usually made up of 10-15 families including all ages, just like an extended family. They have activities which are varied and organised by the members of the group... picnics, BBQ's, special celebrations and weekends away.

The Passionist Family Group Movement was established in 1972 by Fr Peter McGrath cp at St Anthony in the Fields Catholic Church, Terry Hills in the northern suburbs of Sydney. From humble beginnings, the movement has now spread to New Zealand, USA, UK and Ireland.
