

The Importance of our Volunteer Catechists

I want to express my gratitude to our volunteer Catechists (SRE Teachers) who dedicate their time to teach scripture in our state schools each week. Although you may not see the immediate impact of your work, I want to affirm the tremendous job you are doing by teaching Catholic (and sometimes non-Catholic) students about Jesus, our Gospel values, and the Catholic faith.

In our Sacramental Programme, we recently prepared 85 children for their First Holy Communion, with 30 of these children coming from our state schools. Many of these families acknowledged their child's Catechist for educating them about God's love. Among these 30 children, 8 recently completed the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIC) to become Catholic. Once again, it was their attendance and teaching from the Catholic Special Religious Education (Scripture) classes in their state school that contributed to this milestone.

The role of our volunteer Catechists in the lives of Catholic children in our state schools cannot be overemphasised. Not all families are able to send their children to a Catholic School, so our volunteer Catechists fill the gap by bringing Gospel values to these children once a week.

We often refer to the Catechist ministry as the 'Silent Ministry' because it occurs in our state schools and is often not widely recognised within the parish. In our parish, we have 4 state schools within our boundary: The Entrance Public School, Bateau Bay Public School, Brooke Avenue Public School, and Killarney Vale Public School. Teaching days are Wednesdays and Thursdays during the school term.

Currently, we have 14 catechists and we would love to have more people join them in teaching our Catholic faith to children in our state schools. You will need to obtain a Working With Children Check number and complete some free training, which is also a great way to connect with other like-minded people. All resources will be provided, and we only ask for about 1-2 hours of your time each week.

Without these wonderful volunteers, 30 children may have missed the opportunity to welcome Jesus into their hearts.
