### **Better Still**

Jesus offers the bread "come down from heaven." He himself is the bread, and his words are words of eternal life. Jesus invites the people to "communion" of this bread through faith - to believe in the One whom God has sent: Jesus himself. Faith here involves total trust in Jesus and holding on to his revelation.

In the Mass, the faithful are nourished at two tables: the table of the Word and the table of the Eucharist. We will understand and appreciate better our communion of the Body and Blood of Jesus if we listen attentively to the Word of God that makes our hearts burn. Then, the "signs" in the celebration of the sacrament "will begin to speak" in our hearts and in our lives (John Paul II, *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, 14).

Sometimes, people ask what part of the Mass they must catch to make it "valid" as fulfillment of their Sunday obligation. Is it all right to arrive after the homily or after the collection is passed around? Rather than be "legalistic" about it, the faithful should be present at both the liturgy of the Word and the liturgy of the Eucharist. Better still, people should come even before Mass starts and make their personal preparation in silence and in prayer.

## Food for the Journey

Jesus takes the opportunity to teach the people how to live. Do not go looking for the spectacular, he says. Do not go just looking for your own daily advantage and pleasure. That would be aimless living, a waste of a good life. Instead, look for the things that endure to eternal life. Look for true bread that forever nourishes your heart and mind and soul. That is going to demand a spiritual revolution inside you. Stop the selfish impulses inside you. Stop the me-culture, the I-want-it-now culture. Stop the doing-as-others-do culture.

Learn a different way of living. Set your heart on Christ Jesus - God's promise of eternal life to us. Feed from this source every day of your life. "Give us that bread always," the Jewish people said to Our Lord. We should say the same, and say it every day. In reply, the Lord tells us, "You will never be hungry. You will never thirst."

The journey of life is hard. Of that there is no doubt. Many people find it to be an uphill struggle. But once you accept that life is hard, it ceases to be a problem. So says Scott Peck, the American psychiatrist and theologian. If we fully embrace this hardness of life, and willingly set out on the journey, prepared each day to face its challenges and set-backs, then we can help each other along the road. For now life is no longer a problem we cannot handle. Rather it has become the great adventure that leads us to the land of promise, and we are given food for the journey by the Lord himself.

#### Parish Works

n Tuesday and Wednesday, we will be taking down the old screen on the sanctuary and the old projector. On the sanctuary we will be replacing the spotlights which are mainly not working with new spotlights to complete the work begun last month.

At present we also have the bricklayers at work in the parish with two important projects. They are replacing many of the lower bricks at the back of the parish centre as the mortar has come out and they are badly affected by the weather.

Secondly, they are constructing 64 new niches at the side of the church. When complete the statue of St Therese will be placed on top of this new section. The parish will then have some 389 niches. So far, we have a total of 314 niches with the ashes of loved ones in them or prepurchased for future use.
