THE ADVENT JOURNEY

Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year, a time of joyful anticipation as Catholics prepare for the coming of Christ. The word "Advent" (in latin ad+venire) means "coming" or "arrival," and during this season, the Church invites us to reflect on three distinct aspects of Christ's coming: His Incarnation at Christmas, His presence in our daily lives, and His glorious return at the end of time. To guide us in this spiritual journey, the Church uses symbols that are rich in meaning, helping to deepen our understanding and experience of this sacred season.

Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath, as we know it today, originated in 16th-century in Germany, but it became more widely used in Catholic tradition in the 19th century. Its use has since become an integral part of Advent liturgies and family devotions, symbolising the anticipation of Christ's coming and the light He brings into the world.

Circle: The circular shape of the wreath, with no beginning or end, represents the eternity of God and the everlasting life promised through Christ.

Evergreens: The greenery in the wreath symbolises eternal life, a reminder of God's unchanging nature and the hope of resurrection.

Candlelight: In Scripture, light symbolises the presence of God and His guidance. Jesus is often referred to as the "Light of the World" (John 8:12).

Four Candles: The four candles symbolise the four weeks of Advent, each representing a growing light as Christmas approaches.

First Candle (Hope): Often called the "Prophet's Candle," it reminds us of the hope foretold by the prophets, particularly Isaiah, who spoke of the coming Messiah (Isaiah 9:6-7).

Second Candle (Faith): Known as the "Bethlehem Candle," this candle symbolizes the faith of Mary and Joseph as they journey to Bethlehem, trusting in God's plan.

Third Candle (Joy): This is the "Shepherd's Candle" and is pink (or rose) in colour, symbolising joy. It is lit on Gaudete Sunday (the third Sunday of Advent), which reflects the joy of the nearing birth of Christ.

Fourth Candle (Peace): Called the "Angel's Candle," this candle represents the peace that Christ brings to the world.

2. Advent Calendar

The Advent calendar originated in the 19th century in Germany, where children would mark the days of Advent by chalking lines on a door or lighting a candle daily. It became a tool for teaching the faithful about the journey toward Christmas.

Meaning and Symbolism:

Each day of Advent is marked with a small window or door on the calendar that can be opened to reveal a Scripture verse, an image, or even a small gift. The calendar emphasises the passage of time, the anticipation of Christ's coming, and a focus on daily reflection during this holy season.
