"Mary arose and went in haste!"

Today, in the Gospel reading we are told that Mary went "in haste" to the hill country of Judea to visit her cousin Elizabeth. We also know that Mary going in haste was informed by the news she heard from the angel Gabriel about the state of her cousin Elizabeth—that she was pregnant at an advanced age. There is something to be learned about the action of Mary as we prepare to celebrate the joy of Christmas.

The essence of Christmas is to be there for one another, offering a helping hand and giving and receiving love irrespective of our difficulties and vulnerabilities. Mary had heard a "devastating news" of her own, she was to bear a son. But she never allowed her own difficult life to stop her from reaching out to her cousin Elizabeth. She stands up in confidence and goes to see her. We are told of what happened in the encounter and the blessings both women received at the sight of each other.

We are invited to walk with and in the midst of those suffering in our own time and place. We are also called to live together the call to intercultural, international and intergenerational community. In both calls, Mary can be a model to us, that amidst our own personal challenges we could rise in haste and respond to the call to be compassionate and loving.

As we approach Christmas, let us reflect on the true essence of the festival we celebrate. Let us rise in haste and reach out to those in need, with either our time or presence. When we do, like Mary, our souls truly will be filled with the joy of the season, and truly be about the work of resurrection.


