And then on Sunday 15 September, our Parish Feast Day, we welcomed Adam Clarkson, Sue Woodall and Atsushi Shibaoka into our Catholic Church and confirmed them along with Justine Kim, Potiphar Aurestila, and Mizuki Naito. What a wonderful indication of the activity of the Spirit of God in our faith community! We congratulate all the children from our parish primary school for the beautiful concert they staged at the Chatswood Concourse last Tuesday evening! It was quite spectacular with 800 people in attendance!

This week is the last week of Term 3, and for our Year 12 students their last week of classes before the HSC commences in Term 4. This week our church will host the Graduations of both Pius X students and Mercy College students. Please note that the Pius College Graduation this year needs to be at 9.30am. Therefore, our normal 9am Mass and Rosary on Wednesday 25 September will be suspended for this week only. Mercy College Graduation will be at 4.00pm on the same day. We congratulate all our graduating students and wish them every blessing in the time ahead.

Congratulations are also in order for our remarkable Parish Director of Music, Titus Grenyer. Last Wednesday, Titus performed the world premiere of his Organ Symphony – the first composed by an Australian – at St Mary's Cathedral. Then, on 1 October he will perform his next Sydney Town Hall recital, "Organ Music of the Future", at 7.00pm. This is a free event and goes for one hour. But then on 4 October, Tim Li, our talented organ scholar, performs with his chamber ensemble at Australia Hall, 150 Elizabeth St; 7:00pm, 1 hour. The chamber orchestra project led by violinist Tim Li presents an exciting program featuring the early works of 19th and 20th century composers Edward Elgar, Carl Nielsen and Benjamin Britten. We are so gifted to have such talent in our parish! A number of our parishioners were at St Mary's Cathedral last Wednesday and I know many will also be present at the other grand occasions.

Our preparations for Carlo Acutis Feast Day are now well underway. Our online novena leading to the Feast Day commences on Thursday 3 October, and then on Friday 11 October we will celebrate the Vigil Mass of the Feast Day in which our relic of Carlo will be made available for public veneration for the first time. Our 7.00pm Mass on 11 October

will then be followed by Eucharistic Adoration through the night until the 9.00am Mass of the Feast Day on Saturday 12 October. However, given constraints we have on the Saturday, our main celebration will be on Friday 11 October. Our immense gratitude to John O'Brien our architect who is managing the creation of our Acutis Chapel brilliantly.



# THE GOSPEL FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF THE CHILD JESUS HOLDS

As I sit in Jesus' arms, the conversation among the disciples swirls around me. They are arguing about who among them is the greatest, but I don't understand what they mean. Greatness is not something I think about. I know Jesus, though—He sees me. He holds me gently, like I matter, though I am small and often overlooked by others.

Jesus speaks to His disciples, and His words are surprising: "Whoever receives one such child in My name receives Me, and whoever receives Me, receives not Me but Him who sent Me." I don't fully grasp all of His words, but I feel the love and importance of what He is saying. Somehow, in being held by Jesus, I am not just a child; I represent something bigger. I represent Him.

In this moment, I realize that what Jesus is teaching His disciples isn't just about welcoming me, but about seeing the world through my eyes-through the eyes of one who depends on others, who trusts, who is vulnerable. Jesus values this kind of openness, this kind of heart. When people welcome someone like me, small and unnoticed, they are welcoming Jesus Himself. It isn't about power or who is the strongest or the most important. lt's about humility, and trust.

In His embrace, I feel safe. He values me, even though I am little. I sense that what matters to Him is not how important someone seems, but how open their heart is to love and serve others. And in that, I understand that true greatness in His Kingdom is about being small, trusting, and ready to love—just like me.

Through Jesus, I see that even the smallest among us carry the presence of God. To welcome one like me is to welcome the love of God into the world.

THE BATTLE WITHIN. Today's readings highlight the battle between good and evil. The virtuous person in today's First Reading, and Jesus in the Gospel, both suffer greatly at the hands of the godless. But as James notes in today's Second Reading, and as we see in Jesus' disciples, the battle between good and evil is waged within each one of us as well. While we give thanks to God for the good within us, we also acknowledge the part of ourself that is drawn to evil and humbly seek God's mercy.

#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### **'...LAST OF ALL AND SERVANT OF ALL'**

Our first reading from Wisdom alerts us to 'the righteous man' who is God's child. The words here will echo in the Gospel with the second of the predictions of Jesus' death. The passage from James also has synergy with the ambitions of the followers of Jesus addressed in the Gospel.

Beginning with the second prediction of Jesus' death - 'The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed he will rise again' - we find Jesus teaching his disciples as he moves through Galilee. We hear that they did not understand but were afraid to ask. Arriving in Capernaum, inside the house, we see Jesus ask them what they were arguing about. The silence was of embarrassment because their discussion was of who was the greatest. The focus is now even smaller as Jesus now sits down with the Twelve, his closest companions, in the house. It is to these that he says, 'Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.' Servant is here diakonos, servant or deacon. His message to his leadership team is clear as to how they need to model and live their responsibility and call. His further exemplar of placing a child among them, broadens their understanding of welcoming Jesus among them, challenging their orientation to Jesus and to God, 'the one who sent me.' Let us pause to reflect on our orientation to Jesus and to God. Where do we stand?

#### SAINT PIUS OF PIETRELCINA (PADRE PIO)

#### MEMORIAL 23 SEPTEMBER

- Padre Pio was known to have the miraculous ability to be in two places at once! Numerous accounts from people all over the world claimed to have seen him, even though he had never physically left his monastery in San Giovanni Rotondo.
- In 1918, Padre Pio received the stigmata—the wounds of Christ—which remained with him for 50 years until his death. They were visible, painful, and bled, but interestingly, his body had no signs of decay when exhumed.
- Padre Pio could spend up to 15-19 hours a day hearing confessions. He had the spiritual gift of reading souls, meaning he could tell if someone wasn't being honest or was hiding a sin.
- Padre Pio had a soft spot for animals, and there are many stories of his interactions with them, including a time when a bird flew into the confessional and didn't leave until the confession was finished!
- Padre Pio was known for his simple but profound spiritual advice. One of his famous sayings is: "Pray, hope, and don't worry. Worry is useless. God is merciful and will hear your prayer.".


#### **Statue Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

#### **SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL**

#### MEMORIAL 20 SEPTEMBER

- In order to raise funds for the poor, St. Vincent de Paul started the first recorded charity auction. Wealthy benefactors donated items, and the proceeds went directly to those in need.
- Along with St. Louise de Marillac, St. Vincent founded the Daughters of Charity, the first non-cloistered order of women. Unlike most religious orders of the time, these sisters lived in the world, serving the poor directly.
- Despite his humility and dedication to the poor, St. Vincent de Paul was highly regarded by the French royalty. He served as a spiritual advisor to Queen Anne of Austria and had connections at the highest levels of society.
- St. Vincent de Paul was captured by pirates and sold into slavery in North Africa. He spent two years in captivity before converting his master to Christianity, which eventually led to his release!
- In 1625, St. Vincent founded the Congregation of the Mission (also known as the Vincentians), a society of priests and brothers dedicated to serving the poor and educating clergy.
- In his early years, some of St. Vincent's beliefs were considered controversial, especially when he emphasized the need for reform in the Church. However, his deep faith and devotion won over his critics, and he went on to become one of the Church's greatest saints.
