**New Year's Eve Mass:** Come and give thanks for 2019 and pray the new year in as we celebrate Mass at 7pm on New Year's Eve with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament following until 9pm.



**Christmas Day Collection:** Every Sunday two collections are taken up, with the first collection supporting all the clergy of Broken Bay Diocese, and the second collection supporting all the other works of the parish including all ministries, maintenance, staffing and improvements.

To make things simpler on Christmas Day we will take up only one collection and then distribute 50% of loose cash to the clergy fund and 50% to the parish fund. Any "Christmas Dues" envelopes go directly to the clergy fund.

The parish will be donating its part to our sister parishes of Bourke and Brewarrina in drought stricken western NSW as part of our social justice partnership, and it is our privilege to support them in this way.

child attending preparation sessions together in a small group with other children and families.



**A**t the heart of Christian faith is the reality that God who is love and mercy has become one with all of humankind in Jesus of Nazareth. As we celebrate this beautiful mystery of Christmas, it can also be a time to ponder Jesus' invitation to each of us to live the liberating message of God's love and mercy, as a sign that all of humanity is embraced by God in the incarnation of Jesus.

In this liturgical year, we listen to the Gospel of Matthew. Next Sunday, on the feast of the Holy Family, we will hear a part of the Christmas story that is far removed from Luke's account of angels singing and shepherds coming to worship Jesus. Matthew describes Joseph and Mary, after the birth of Jesus, having to hastily flee Bethlehem with him at night, to save Jesus from being killed by Herod. In other words, they were forced to leave a life-threatening situation to seek refuge in another country. We can see from the Gospel that they remained in Egypt for a few years. They could never return to Bethlehem because after Herod's death, his son was just as threatening. They eventually settled further north in Nazareth.



It is a challenging story which might be tempting to put aside in this time of Christmas, when we want to focus on joy, peace and the comforting familiarity of the Christmas story. It is difficult to imagine Jesus, Mary and Joseph as refugees, yet that was clearly what they were. God came to us at the first Christmas as a vulnerable refugee baby seeking welcome and safety.

### A DELEGATION OF CATHOLIC LEADERS TO PAPUA NEW GUINEA

At a public forum on 4 December, three members of a Catholic delegation to Papua New Guinea, Bishop Vincent Long, Diocese of Parramatta, Fr Peter Smith, Promoter of Justice & Peace, Archdiocese of Sydney and Carolina Gottardo, Director of Jesuit Refugee Services shared their experiences. They had travelled there to see first-hand the situation of people seeking asylum/refugee status and to understand their experiences. The forum happened to coincide with the announcement of the repeal of our government's MedeVac bill. Behrouz Boochani, who had escaped Manus Island in November was skyped into the forum from New Zealand.

Bishop Vincent said, ***“What we witnessed and heard confirms an alarming destruction of the physical and mental health of people already harmed by the offshore detention system. It is the result of systematic cruelty. Detainees are malnourished and not getting basic food, medical treatment and other support. Some have been in detention for up to seven years.”***

Behrouz Boochani expressed his deep concern for the fate of the men who are waiting in the Bomana detention centre in Port Moresby for the result of voting on the MedeVac bill. Carolina Gottardo is also concerned about what the future holds for these men who are denied visitors, phones and access to a lawyer.

Fr Peter reminded everyone that ***“We have power as a Church. We represent the Gospel...we can make a difference in this world. We can make a better Australia. We can make ourselves a better people by living the Gospel message that every human person on this planet is important: that was what Jesus said and lived – and that’s we need to echo.”***

All those who are sick, deceased, having anniversaries at this time or recently deceased. Please keep them and their families, in your prayers.

#### COMMUNION RECEPTION

Those going to Communion need to receive the host either on the hand or the tongue. The chalice is also offered at many of our masses and given to be sipped and then handed back to the Minister. "Self Intinction" (dipping the host into the chalice) is forbidden as only a priest is able to receive Communion in this manner.
