World Day of Prayer: Our Parish is hosting the World Day of Prayer service for the North Shore area this year. The service is on Friday 6th March at 10.15am in our church. The host country this year is Zimbabwe. We will have morning tea in the Magnificat room after the Service. All welcome.

How to do Lent: St Teresa of Avila discouraged the nuns in her care from doing additional penances. Many were fond of taking on extreme penances such as starvation fasting or all-night prayer vigils, the result of which was that they were unable to do their household chores and fell asleep during their normal communal prayer times. She forbade the nuns from doing such extra penances and instead told them to do the ordinary ways of prayer and holiness well.

As we begin the season of Lent, we might be wondering what penance we can take up. For some of us if we were to heed St Teresa's advice the best penance we could do would be to "do the ordinary ways of prayer well" by being fully present for the whole hour at Mass. Could you plan your Sunday around giving an hour to God at Mass, rather than squeezing it in around other things? Could you commit to be in the church when Mass begins, not hastily running up the stairs? Could you stay to the end and not leave early? Could you leave your phone at home or at least switched off (not just silent) so that you are undistracted? For some of us this might be a big challenge, but it might be the most fruitful penance we could do.

If this is already the way you approach Mass, then you might like to consider what additional penance or discipline you will take up for Lent. A message from Bishop Anthony regarding Lenten penances is on the noticeboards. Please note that only Ash Wednesday and Good Friday require compulsory fasting from meat, with people invited to choose their own appropriate penance on the other Fridays of Lent.

Lent is also a time to make a focus on developing a particular virtue or conquering a particular vice. Many people recognise that the time they spend on social media, gaming and online in general is excessive, and a good Lenten discipline might be to have one or more "digitalfree" days per week, just as many people now have alcohol-free or meat-free days.

There are some other suggestions for Lent in the pages of this newsletter, including doing the Stations of the Cross on Fridays, Adoration on Thursdays, or coming to the sacrament of Reconciliation. – Fr Jim McKeon

KIRK ST CARPARK

For some months the carpark gates have been permanently open due to the gates malfunctioning. These are about to be repaired and will once again be closed during school hours for Mercy College and OLD staff. The parish will still open the gates for weekend Masses and for after-hours events. The gates may be closed again at any time.

BAPTISM FONT

The old baptism font which was removed from the centre aisle has now been reassembled as a holy water stoop in the Marian chapel. A new font has been designed which will use stone to match the altar. The architect's render of the new altar is on the noticeboard in the foyer. It will be octagonal (8 sides represent the 8th day, the new creation, a common theme for baptism fonts), and a glass bowl so that the water can be seen.

THE DAY OF THE UNBORN

As Catholics, we are guided by science and the Church's moral teaching which tells us, contrary to the prevailing culture:

- 1 A new human being comes into existence at the moment of conception.
- 2 This new human being is made "in the image and likeness of God" and enjoys the same dignity and status as any other human being.

Therefore, the killing by abortion of the unborn baby is no less a grave moral offence than the killing of any born person. Our society is therefore confronted with a huge moral catastrophe which claims far more human lives than those other equally real tragedies which make the headlines.

The response to the recent bushfires was overwhelming with people from all walks of life helping in any way possible to overcome them. This is the type of response that would be expected and it should be said that a similar outpouring of effort is the only appropriate response to the enormous tragedy of abortion that exists in our society. Abortion is often looked upon as a means of birth control invoked when a baby is considered to be an inconvenient proposition. All this ignores the inherent dignity and value of the unborn baby.

On Sunday 29 March the annual procession to mark the Day of the Unborn will take place starting at 12 noon from St Mary's Cathedral. This is a peaceful and prayerful procession through the city streets to witness to the plight of the unborn and to call for action to stop the tragedy of abortion. Fr Jim will lead parishioners from Our Lady of Dolours as we join with other concerned people around from Sydney and beyond. Hopefully there will be a huge response especially given the terrible legislation recently passed by the New South Wales Parliament to allow for abortion up to full term. Taking part in this procession is part of our parish pastoral plan for this year to engage with the wider community.

CORONAVIRUS

Across our diocese and many Australian dioceses, we are taking the precaution of not sharing the Communion chalice, even though the risk of transmission of coronavirus or any virus in this way is very small. Health authorities continue to advise that the best precaution is frequent handwashing. There are bottles of hand sanitiser in the church if you need them.

THE PARISH LOGO

You'll notice we have the teardrop logo on the front page of the bulletin. This image of Mary's bowed head and a teardrop is a stylised image of Our Lady of Dolours, reminding us that *dolour* means grief or sorrow. While at other times of the year we want to focus more on the joy of the resurrected Jesus, during Lent it is fitting that we share in Mary's grief-stricken accompaniment of Jesus to the Cross, and that we join ourselves to all the suffering of the world.

Reconciliation Preparation Update




This week 80 children in our parish began preparing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time.

- 4. Pray Pope Francis' prayers from Laudato Si n 245 & 246.
- Download the Brisbane Archdiocese Lenten App, *Lent 2020* Be Opened from Apple Apps & Google Play for under \$3.00.
- 6. Spend time in a quiet space, a park, a garden or a beach, Be attentive to the sounds of life, birds, insects and animals, wind and water. Pray a prayer of thanks to God; reflect on the power of the water of baptism.
- 7. Download, or read and reflect online the Columban Mission Society's Grace of Earth 2020 Lenten Reflections on six earth life support systems. www.columban.org. au Search under Ed Resources.

Living a Laudato Si Lent

... the ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion ... what we all need is an "ecological conversion", whereby the effects of our encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in our relationship with the world around us. LS 217

This time of Lent invites us into closely examining how we live and what we hold in our hearts. It can be a deeply challenging and rewarding journey of repentance and renewal; a time of conversion that opens our hearts to the joy of Jesus' resurrection at Easter.

This Lent, you are invited to reflect on a dimension of conversion: ecological conversion which Pope Francis describes in the quote above from *Laudato Si, Care for Our Common Home*. You may like to choose some of items below to add to your Lenten preparations for Easter.

Fast

- Plan to have one or more meat free days each week.
- Take a break from electronic entertainment - computers, smart phones, TV - pay and free to air. Become more present to the people around you. Become at ease with silence.
- 3. We are blessed with good drinking water in Sydney, use tap water rather than bottled water.
- Reduce shopping by one day a week and resist buying any new things that are not essential.
- Put 'carbon fast' into your search engine to locate many ways of doing a carbon fast.
- Fast from the consumption of news. Focus on one or two stories that have moved you. Pray for the people involved and for the renewal of our earth.
- 7. Fast from the convenience of having appliances constantly drawing power. Turn power off at the wall.

Act

- Read each chapter of Laudato Si. Make a note of possible actions that you, your family and/or community can take.
- 2. Have a week of not using any disposable plastic products.
- 3. Go to www.arcc.org.au the website of Australian Religious Response to Climate Change. Choose one item from many possible actions.
- 4. Even though the dams are now replenished continue to conserve water usage.
- Plan to purchase easter eggs that are Fairtrade, Rainforest Alliance and/ or UTZ certified. Go to www.WFTO.com for information.
- 6. Plan to celebrate Earth Hour on 28 March at 8.30pm.
- 7. Consider ways to reduce your carbon footprint. Try car pooling, public transport, cycling or walking when possible.
- 8. Reduce the use of plastic bags. Use cloth grocery bags. Make use of the supermarkets' soft plastic collection bins.
