

REPORT FROM FINANCE & FACILITIES OFFICER

Most of you would have noticed the new building on our Parish property on the corner of Archer and Kirk Street Chatswood. This new building is almost complete and includes:

- 3 Parish meeting rooms
- An Atrium
- 10 classrooms for the Mercy College.

The major work has been completed. There will still be some minor defects which will be addressed in the near future.

The Parish Team is very proud of the new centre. We are sure that it will provide fantastic facilities for the numerous Parish groups that meet regularly and for the children in the Atrium.

The room facilities will be kept locked throughout the day and night. The car park will be open for parishioners during the day and be locked by the last user of the meeting rooms at night.

Use of the meeting rooms will only be available to groups whose Group Leader has obtained a key from the Parish Office. The process for Group Leaders is to visit the Parish Office Reception between hours of 9am to 4pm Monday to Thursday and 9am to 1pm on Fridays. The person requesting the key will need to:

- Sign a key register
- Hand back key held for former meeting facilities
- Receive and read meeting room protocols.

For regular groups, the key may be held by the leader for as long as the group needs meeting room access. For non-regular meetings, the key obtained must be returned to the Parish Office within 24 hours. Lost keys will only be replaced at the cost to the group.

The centre has toilet facilities, but they will be kept locked as well. Keys to the Staff Male Toilets and Staff Female Toilets will be located in each room. When finished, please lock the toilet door and return the keys to the room.

The centre also has a lift for those less mobile or for parents with prams. The lift will also be kept locked. If attending a meeting and you need the lift, please inform the Group Leader and they can unlock the lift for you. A lift key will be located in each room with the toilet keys.

We also have cupboard space for groups to store their meeting materials. The cupboards are in the Magnificat and St Paul Rooms and you can only use those numbered between 1 and 15. If your group would like to use a cupboard, please select one, lock your materials inside, take the key and let the Parish Office know what your group name is

and what number key you took. This can be done via email to chatswoodoffice@bbcatholic.org.au. Please note that group materials should not be left anywhere else in the rooms.

Please note that it is recommended that people attending a Parish meeting room, should enter via the Kirk Street entrance.

The rooms are currently in a beautiful condition. They are the property of the Parish and its parishioners and we hope that everyone works together to keep them in this condition. We also hope that everyone works together to keep them safe and secure. The Meeting Room Protocols handed out with the keys sets out everybody's responsibility in looking after the rooms. There is also a checklist on the wall next to each meeting room door setting out your responsibilities when leaving the meeting room. The key things are:

- Leave the table and chair configuration the way it was before your meeting (previous process used in the old Rotunda centre of stacking all the chairs no longer applies).
 Please be careful of the walls if moving chairs
- Clean the room and any cutlery/crockery used.
 Cleaning materials are provided in each room and broom, mop or vacuum provided in Magnificat room.
- Take away your rubbish.
- Turn off all appliances (except fridges and dishwashers)
- Lock away your materials.
- Lock windows and the door as you leave. If the lift was used, make sure it is locked.

Please note that the removable wall between Magnificat and St Paul rooms can only be opened by Parish staff. Please do not try to open yourself as very complicated

Working in a child-related ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay

Paid and volunteer workers who have direct face to face contact with children (under 18 years) are required by law to obtain a Working with Children Check number. Please note though exemptions may apply in some cases. The Parish is the employer of the paid or volunteer worker and therefore is required by law to verify the Working with Children Check number. All paid or volunteer workers engaged in a child-related role must have a clear Working with Children Check to work in a child-related ministry. This disclosure references the legislation, *Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012.*
