Voting well: Next weekend most of us will be voting in the Federal election. This is a privilege which not all nations offer their citizens. The Australian Catholic Bishops have published a guide for us called *Politics in the Service of Peace* to help us to choose wisely, which is available at www.catholic.org.au
This document emphasises a range of issues including: For more than a century, the Catholic Church has advocated for the value of work, a just living wage and dignifying employment conditions, while endorsing the good of economic prosperity. Government policy plays a crucial role in promoting the right economic balance between advancing the dignity of workers and encouraging entrepreneurial creativity.

To recognise human dignity is to value the lives of all people, including those at the beginning and the end of life. Euthanasia and assisted suicide put some of the most vulnerable people in our community at risk by endorsing – and legislating – the judgement that some people's lives are no longer of value. Governments must provide better funding and resourcing for palliative care so that all Australians have access, not just the few. Access to palliative care for older Australians receiving aged care, especially in regional and rural settings, is a critical area of need

Proclaiming Pentecost: Each year Christians have gathered together in different churches at Pentecost to pray for their local area, and this year, we are hosting this gathering for the first time. Called "Proclaiming Pentecost" it will be a night of prayer, praise and intercession on the eve of Pentecost, Saturday June 8th, in our church from 7pm. Come and join us in praying for Chatswood and the North Shore.

The Parish Finance Committee met this week. This committee assists Fr Jim in the oversight of parish financial, business and governance matters. This week we reviewed the parish's insurances, the agreement between the parish and Mercy College for the use of the Kirk St corner block, the constitution of the St Peter & St Paul Fund, and prepared the 2019-2020 parish budget.

Sunday morning teas: Every Sunday scores of people have morning tea on the forecourt after the 9am Mass. Last weekend we saw the first morning tea at the 7.30am mass and we had a number of people stay and talk, rather than rushing away. We'd like to begin having morning tea after our other Masses too. Pope Francis

Did you know that following Pope Francis' visit to the United Arab Emirates last February, Pope Francis and the Grand Iman of Al-Azhar, Ahmad Al-Tayeb issued a joint document On Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together?

The opening line of the document states: Faith leads a believer to see in the other a brother or sister to be supported and loved. In the General Audience following his journey to Morocco, Pope Francis recalled a similar journey bringing a message of peace and fraternity made by St Francis of Assisi 800 years ago. Pope Francis said that 'with our Muslim brothers and sisters, we have sealed this fraternity in the document of Abu Dhabi. '

The document concludes with the hope that it may be a 'witness to the greatness of faith in God that unites divided hearts and elevates the human soul' During this time of Ramadan, we might support our Muslim brothers and sisters in prayer, especially those who are seeking asylum here and those who are enduring the hardship of extended delays in recognition of their refugee status.

Working in a child-related ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay

Paid and volunteer workers who have direct face to face contact with children (under 18 years) are required by law to obtain a Working with Children Check number. Please note though exemptions may apply in some cases. The Parish is the employer of the paid or volunteer worker and therefore is required by law to verify the Working with Children Check number. All paid or volunteer workers engaged in a child-related role must have a clear Working with Children Check to work in a child-related ministry. This disclosure references the legislation, *Child Protection (Working with Children) Act* 2012.
