

#### SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Lev 13:1-2,44-46; 1 Cor 10:31-11:1; Mark 1:40-45

The first reading (Lev 13:1-2,44-46) and gospel (Mark 1:40-45) both touch on a primal fear concerning some types of disease. In today's passage Jesus breached the fearful and lawful separation of lepers by reaching out to touch the man; and the man is set free from his disease and is sent to comply with the Law so as to be able to return to his family a renewed man. He also becomes the first to do what Jesus tells him not to do: he tells everyone about it. There is a cost to Jesus again such that he then cannot go anywhere openly.

Mark says he now had to stay outside the towns, in places where nobody lived; he becomes something like a leper himself in having to live apart. Perhaps last Sunday's gospel acclamation would have worked better today: "He bore our sickness, and endured our suffering" (Matthew 8:17, adapting Isaiah 53:4).

But, to be honest, it was the short second reading (1 Cor 10:31–11:1) that caught my attention as the question popped unbidden into mind: How does one eat or drink for the glory of God? What can this mean? Almost immediately there came to mind flashes of scenes from the movie based on Karen Blixen's short story "Babettes Gaestebud".

French refugee Babette had found sanctuary with two kindly Puritan sisters on the Jutland peninsula, becoming their cook and catering also to the ill to whom the sister took meals. It seems she was oblivious to how her handling of the stuff of this world, food, even in the bland cuisine of the region, affected people. Winning France's national lottery enabled her to give a gift that was not wanted: a feast to celebrate the centenary of the birth of the sisters' father, the founder of their peculiar sect. When some idea of what she was doing came to the attention of the sectarians who would be feasted, they kindly, not wanting to give offence in return, determined to eat and drink as if all were tasteless, all without merit. At the meal, however, not only were they conquered by what they received, slowly learning to delight in it all (even the cheering wine), but their reciprocal wrongdoings and hurts that had earlier been exposed were both acknowledged and set aside. For the first time in a long while, they were at one with one another, forgiving each other, even to the extent of sedately dancing their aged frames in a ring around the town's well—a scene that calls to mind Fra Angelico's "Day of Judgment" altarpiece that now resides in Florence's Museo del Convento di San Marco.

#### From Fr David

Dear friends

Our warmest new year greetings to our many brothers and sisters from our Asian cultures! This weekend is one of very special celebration and we pray that the new year will bring many blessings to us all. We are delighted to acknowledge this important occasion at the entrance to our church, and next year we will find ways to enter the celebration more fulsomely. Hopefully, many of us will be able to enjoy the festivities taking place in our city.

It was a privilege to acknowledge our Readers last weekend on Word of God Sunday. This weekend we salute our Catechists who take the Word of God to the many Catholic children at our five government schools. We have over 40 Catechists and it was a delight for me to meet many of them last Monday. We have a number of new catechists this year, too, which is a wonderful sign of the spiritual health of our community. Our special thanks to our marvellous Catechist Coordinator, Maricel Malapira who brings great care and professionalism to this ministry.

From time to time, it is important for us to be mindful of those trends and practices in our society that are not reflective of God's dream for us. We see these in such legislative developments around matters regarding abortion and euthanasia and the lack of care for creation. This week our Marian Catholic Action Group brings to our attention possible developments in euthanasia. There is also a petition in the foyer of the church for us to register again our objection to abortion. This is an opportunity for us to ensure that our voice is heard in a context in which religious perspective the becomes easily marginalised.

This week we begin our season of annual renewal and conversion in preparation for the great Festival of Life, Easter. Lent commences on Wednesday 17 February with Ash Wednesday. We will offer four Masses for Ash Wednesday at 6.45am, 9.00am, 12.15pm and 8.00pm. From Ash Wednesday we will have available a brochure that outlines the Season of Lent and the many ways our parish is engaging its opportunity. Amongst the various ways will be Praying the Stations of the Cross. These will take place during Lent on Wednesdays at 11am (prior to the 12.15pm Mass) and on Fridays at 7.30pm. On Thursday evenings during Lent, beginning 18 February, we will also pray a special Holy Hour with special music and during which I will share a Lenten Reflection.

Do be sure to collect one of the brochures "Celebrating Lent at Our Lady of Dolours" that will be available through the coming weeks. From next Sunday we will also introduce a new Sunday resource, "Our Sunday Celebration." This will be available for everyone attending Mass to use whilst in the church and to take home with them. It will contain all the parts of the Mass along with the Readings for the Sunday, and inside will be formative reading for our spiritual nourishment.

This week, from Thursday 18 February we will reintroduce in our church Morning Prayer from the Church's Liturgy of the Hours. This will be prayed at 8.45am before each weekday 9am Mass.

Our schools are celebrating their Commencement Masses this week. Our Lady of Dolours Primary celebrated on Friday 12 February, Mercy College on Monday 15, and Pius College (at Oxford Falls) on Tuesday 16 February.

Thankfully, from last Friday the COVID restrictions have been further eased by the NSW Government. We can now receive up to 300 people in our church, and masks are no longer mandatory in our church. We have also removed all the cords on every second pew so that every pew is now available. As I write this, we are awaiting clarification about singing at church. Let us pray that we will be able to maintain this level for some time without 'going backwards' as it will enable us to return to much of our community life!
