Church repairs: We have begun repairs on the extensive cracks in the church walls which extend to both the interior plaster and the exterior brickwork. The brickwork is being stitched together in such a way which will make it resilient to future movement of the church which sits on footings in the clay. The interior will then be rerendered. We've deemed that this is important enough to delve into the parish's 'rainy day' account to ensure the church walls don't deteriorate further.

The Trybooking email has a box to "print tickets" which will allow you to either physically print from your PC, or to bring up a scannable code on your phone. Aldrin Valdehueza: Bishop Anthony has appointed Aldrin Valdehueza to our parish, commencing mid-July. Aldrin is a final year seminarian, at the same stage as Sam French. Aldrin will be here through to his ordination as a deacon which we presume will be in the latter half of this year, and his ordination as priest which we presume will be in the second quarter of next year. Aldrin was born in the Philippines, is now in his mid-thirties, and has done some of his seminary formation in the Philippines and the last 4 or 5 years at Homebush. This will be quite different to Sam's placement here last year which was a time of gaining experience at the service of discernment of his suitability to proceed to ordination. Aldrin has already had that experience and will be coming here to prepare for and to begin his life as an ordained ministry. Sam French has been appointed to Pennant Hills Parish.

The Church will be closed this Tuesday 16th June from 10am until 2pm for Mike Atwell's funeral. The family will not be live-streaming the mass.

THE PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL met again on the 2nd of June for our fifth meeting of the year via video conference. As coronavirus restrictions continue to ease, we are hopeful that we can soon resume meeting face to face.

In the meantime, the reopening of our church for private prayer, and more recently mass for up to 50 people (until restrictions ease further) has been a welcome change.

The profound changes over the last few months led us to discuss some of the positive changes that we wish to continue to pursue. These include (i) to improve and encourage the profile and awareness of the wonderful groups, ministries, volunteer opportunities and parishioners of our parish and (ii) to develop a broader communication strategy including the effective use of social media mediums for the parish. We will keep you updated with our progress on these endeavours.

As part of our spiritual reading, we also reflected on how social injustice has been so pervasive in the past, that it is likely to have shaped our perspectives today. While we may see some of the social injustice, inequality, racism and sexism with the benefit of hindsight, there is still much inequality and injustice we are blind (or ineffective) to today. The first steps for change are to bring these perspectives we have into the light. *Parish Pastoral Council*

Sydney Alliance Welcomes \$6 million for Vulnerable People

In April, Sydney Alliance contacted NSW members of parliament with their first-hand stories of people in crisis who had been left behind because of their visa status. On 3 June Acting Minister for Multiculturalism Geoff Lee said that the NSW government would provide \$6 million in funding to ensure that the most vulnerable temporary visa holders in the State, including victims of domestic violence have access to food, medicine, and housing. This allocation of funding is in addition to \$20 million temporary crisis accommodation for in international students in need.

The funding will be distributed through organisations such as Jesuit Refugees Services (JRS), greater detail is yet to be announced. In the past two months JRS alone has seen a 224% increase in demand for its services and has delivered food parcels to 3,800 people who are facing homelessness, risk of suicide and despair.

Our Work with Sydney Alliance

Since last month, Sydney Alliance has facilitated zoom meetings of church and community leaders from the lower north shore area. The initial aim was to work together to address issues impacting people seeking asylum and refugees. Fr Jim, Gail Gill, Anthony Seeto, Brendan Tertini and Bernadette Ho are attending these meetings.

Our first shared task is to open dialogue with Gladys Berejiklian in her capacity as MP, by thanking her for the \$6 million funding. We are continuing to research the focus for working together as a Lower North Shore group. More information soon!


RELEASE OF PLENARY COUNCIL DISCERNMENT PAPERS
