HOW ARE PEOPLE PRAYING DURING SOCIAL DISTANCING?

We've been hearing some great stories about how people are praying in new and different ways, either on their own or with their families. A few stories follow:

"Our family with 5 children took up the idea of praying the Stations of the Cross in the street on Good Friday, using telegraph poles as markers for each station. It created lots of discussion and conversation as we rode our bikes and scooters, and explained to our neighbours what we were doing. It became known as "the stations of the poles"! It was much more meaningful than watching it on TV and it is a tradition we will now continue" – Bernadette.

"As well as watching your homilies and videos, we also took up your suggestion of 'telegraph pole' Stations of the Cross. On Friday morning, we did the 14 Stations on the road together. It is one of the most memorable Stations we have done." – Giselle and Brent

"I have had the most wonderful prayerful Easter season. I started on Palm Sunday with a Mass from the Philippines. Monday of Holy Week I "went" to Mass in America. Then I discovered the Mass on Demand from Lavender Bay so I celebrated with just the priest and an assisting nun on Tuesday and Wednesday. The rest of the week was celebrated at St Mary's Cathedral and I also loved listening to Fr Jim's wonderful uplifting messages too. I'm also going for a 2km cardio walk every day as I have to look after my physical wellbeing as well as my spiritual. So, I have been walking and singing along to all my choral music especially Handel's Messiah which has been so wonderful in this Easter season. Smiling and waving to people along the way definitely lifts the spirits too. I've also continued with my wonderful Spiritual Director Terese on the phone but hopefully by next month I will have mastered Zoom so we can have a face to face meeting. I will be forever grateful to the parish for introducing the Spiritual Director program to me as it has filled a huge gap in my spiritual life" – Joan.

EMAIL SCAM

Some parishioners received an odd email this week purporting to be from Fr Jim, but it was a scam.

These do go around from time to time. You can usually tell such things are fake by a) the odd email address (which the scammer wants you to reply to), b) the odd language used - this one began "Calvary salutations....", and c) grammatical errors. Such scammers trawl a website to locate the leader's (or sometimes the finance officer or payroll clerk's) name and then they send a dummy message to every other email address which appears on that website, which in our case is group and ministry leaders. It doesn't mean that that parish database has been hacked. It is only drawing on public information from the website, annoying though this is. If you receive a suspicious email which suggests that it is from the parish please send it to chatswoodoffice@bbcatholic.org.au and Nicole can send these through to our IT provider and website host.

NO MORE FOOD AND FACE MASKS

Some very kind people have been dropping in both food and face masks to the parish office and presbytery. Please don't bring food, as we have more than enough. And we are not using face masks. The government has advised that people do not need to wear them in ordinary circumstances and not to buy them so that they can be available for health workers who do need them.

SUPPORTING YOUR PARISH

Even though we can't gather together for Mass on Sundays, much of the life of the parish is continuing. Two-thirds of our parish income comes from cash given at Mass, either in envelopes or loose on the second collection.

As there are no Sunday Masses during the present shutdown our parish income has therefore dropped by two thirds. Like many organisations who are also struggling we are doing all we can to reduce our costs. For example, I personally have taken a pay cut, and we are looking at ways to reduce parish staff costs in conjunction with also assessing how the Government's JobKeeper program may assist. However, unfortunately most of our costs are fixed, such as insurance, utilities, IT contracts, phone lines and maintenance.

Therefore, if you are able to, I am hoping that you can update the way that you give to the parish by filling out and returning the giving form sent out last week or by clicking <u>here</u>. You can arrange a monthly EFT donation into the parish's account named Chatswood Parish:- (Our Lady of Dolours), BSB 062-784, Account *#* 1073 8005 and use "PG" & your name as the reference, or you can phone Nicole in the parish office on 9410 9000 to authorise a credit card donation.

Of course, if you are one of the many people who has lost or significantly reduced your income in recent weeks then I am not asking you to give. But if you have a steady income and you are not already giving by either credit card or direct debit, I am asking you to make this commitment to support your parish so that we can keep going during this difficult time and also be ready to respond as soon as we are allowed to gather as a parish again.

Your monthly donation will give the parish a reliable income so that we can be here to support people who are in need right now, and to be ready for you when we can worship and celebrate together again.
