Community Dinners: Mother Teresa said that the greatest poverty is loneliness. There are so many people who live in a busy place like Chatswood yet feel alone. There are people who eat every meal on their own. Perhaps they have family and friends, but these live far away, and there are others who for whatever reason find themselves isolated and lonely.

Jesus brought people together for meals. Table fellowship was part of his bringing about the Reign of God, where everyone is invited to have a seat at the table. As disciples of Jesus we are asked to do the same, and so we as a parish are going to launch "Community Dinners" which will be a free open weekly meal for anyone who wants to share a meal in good company.

These dinners will be for everyone, Catholic and non-Catholic alike. Apart from praying grace before the meal there will be no explicitly religious presentation other than that it is we as disciples of Jesus who are hosting and serving the meal. The dinners will be free and subsidised by the parish and any grants we can obtain.

Other parishes (Narraweena, Waitara, Kincumber) have had great success doing this. It has become a hub of community for the parish itself, and a substantial outreach to the local community, meeting the needs of people who are both physically hungry and those who are socially isolated. For many people it becomes the only meal which they eat at a table, off a plate, and with others. Relationships form, barriers are broken down, and the Church is enriched and enlivened by giving to others. Parishioners and whole families who are not "in need" also come along to build relationships so that the dinner feels like a big family meal rather than a soup kitchen.

There are many people in our parish with great good will to serve, but often they don't know where to start, or feel inadequate to do a "religious" ministry like serve or read at Mass, take communion to the sick or teach scripture (they shouldn't, but that's another story). But just about everyone can cook, and if you can't cook you can serve, wash up, greet guests and create that family atmosphere.

We are looking for volunteers willing to commit to cook and serve on one Saturday night each month. We will form 4 teams who will each cook and serve once each month, so that no one is overly burdened.

We will have a launch meeting to meet one another, create teams, and answer questions on Saturday June 29^{th,} 6.30pm the parish hall (Harrington Hall, across the OLD school yard). At this meeting we will determine if we have sufficient volunteers to go forward and to launch the dinners in September.

Within the Parish

THE PRESBYTERY at 100 Archer St has had not had significant maintenance for some time. It has numerous problems including cracks in the foundation and walls, deteriorating roofing beams, broken guttering, ceiling leaks and flaking and cracking internal paint. The building is nearing the end of its life cycle. However, one urgent problem needing immediate rectification is the retaining wall and fence on Wattle Lane. An engineering report has discovered that it is of risk of collapse and a threat to safety. Therefore, in the coming weeks the fence will be removed, the ground behind it excavated (which may require the removal of the screening trees), ground anchors installed to support the retaining wall, and a new fence installed. You will see this work take place in the coming weeks.

WHO ARE WE? Each week of May we have been counting the number of people at Mass, as we and every parish in Australia have done each May for 20 years. This allows us to see the trends in attendance both within our parish, across our diocese and across Australia. The general trend across Australia is an average of 3% decline year on year. The good news is that we have bucked this trend this year with a healthy improvement. The average weekend attendance across all Masses is 1485, up from 1344 last May. Our two evening Masses have remained steady with 237 at the vigil Mass and 270 at Sunday night. The growth has been on Sunday mornings, with 7.30am up from 120 to 147, 9am up from 283 to 345 and 10.30am up from 342 to 384. The growth in numbers is also striking because last May included first communion Masses which added 550 people to one weekend. Our average also includes the Filipino and Indonesian Masses. Let's celebrate the growth and life of our parish.

PARISH PARKING

There may be some confusion as to what parking is available to our Parishioners. Hopefully the following clarifies the situation for all:

<u>Weekday Parking</u> (Monday to Friday). We have 2 carparks available:

- Large Carpark in Kirk Street This is used by Teachers for Our Lady of Dolours Primary School and Mercy College. After 9am, any spare spots can be used by Parishioners. Lights switch on at 5pm and switch off at 6pm. Entry and exit via top gate.
- Smaller Carpark adjacent to Parish Meeting Rooms – Opened about 8.30am for the use of parishioners attending Mass or other parish functions only. These gates are open in the evening until about 8pm however if there is a group meeting on, the last person out to shut.

<u>Weekend Parking</u> All carparks available for all parishioners and gates are opened for Saturday night and Sunday Masses as follows:

- Kirk Street Carpark Lights will turn on at 5pm and turn off at 7pm. Entry and Exit via the top gate.
- **St Pius Yard** Closes at 7pm. Both Kirk Street and Ferguson Lane entries are opened and lights will turn on at 5pm and turn off at 7pm.
- Smaller Carpark adjacent to Parish Meeting Rooms – Open for morning Masses and will be closed at 8pm however if there is a group meeting on, the gates are to be shut by the last person out.
- The Archer St entry to the rear of the Parish Office is also open and is reserved for people with mobility needs. It is shut during the Sunday 9am Mass for the safety of children going to children's liturgy.



pondering ways we might provide welcome and practical support to these people forced to leave their homeland. National Refugee Week is 16-22 June so for two weekends in June we will be collecting food items and toiletries to donate to House of Welcome in East Granville. This organisation provides welcome and a host of support services to assist people seeking asylum and refugees as they struggle to find their feet in Australia. One such service is a Food Bank to which you are invited to contribute.

You are asked to choose items from the list below and leave them in the boxes at the entrance of the church on 22/23 June and 29/30 June:-

Cooking oil, basmati rice, flour, sugar, canned tomatoes, chickpeas, lentils, canned fruit, tinned tuna, breakfast cereal, biscuits, cooking spices, jam, honey, shampoo, laundry detergent, sanitary pads, toilet paper, tissues, nappies (larger sizes), household cleaning items.

Take the Next Step

There is no 'one-size-fits-all' discipleship with Jesus. Each of us is called to respond to the call of Jesus as it touches us in our particular personal context. The call of Jesus is a call to become who we really are, who we are called to be and who we can still become. One of the pathways to experiencing belonging in our parish is to grow as a disciple of Jesus by participating in some faith formation each year.

What do I desire? Where can I find life? Where is God in my life?

Are these questions that you can relate to? Then you might like to start thinking about participating in the Ignatian First Spiritual Exercises which will begin in August. An Ignatian spiritual exercise is a structured prayer that does three things very well.

- I. It brings my desires to light and into the presence of a personal God.
- It brings my own life experience into this relationship using various methods of prayer.
- 3. It takes me quickly and deeply into prayer. According to Ignatius, just as physical exercise benefits the body, so spiritual exercises are activities which benefit the soul.

What's involved?

You would need to make a commitment to participate in five weekly 90 minute sessions. Fr Jim, Sam French (our resident seminarian) and Gail Gill will facilitate these sessions. There is a limit of 12 participants for each group. **Registrations will open on Monday 15 July.** In the meantime, you can explore the First Spiritual Exercises at www.fsecloud.life

Margaret Silf, an Ignatian writer, teacher and spiritual director, says this about prayer: Prayer is time taken out of the linear journey of our days, and it is our most profound reality. When we pray, we move inward to our God centre. Then we move out again . . . To our situation in the world. This movement into the centre and out again brings about an act of transformation. This is not to say that we will come out of prayer transfigured, like Jesus on the mountain (though our prayer experience may sometimes be dramatic). Noting so spectacular! Usually there is a subtle, gentle, almost indiscernible change in our way of being that will carry its healing, changing power out through the layers of our lived experience and infuse the Where of our lives with its Kingdom values. This happens every time we pray, whether we are aware of it or not.

Working in a child-related ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay

Paid and volunteer workers who have direct face to face contact with children (under 18 years) are required by law to obtain a Working with Children Check number. Please note though exemptions may apply in some cases. The Parish is the employer of the paid or volunteer worker and therefore is required by law to verify the Working with Children Check number. All paid or volunteer workers engaged in a child-related role must have a clear Working with Children Check to work in a child-related ministry.
