In the gospel (John 15:1-8) we hear another of John's unique explanatory images, although they do have sources in the Hebrew Scriptures. For example, Psalm 80(79) opens by addressing God as Shepherd of Israel (related to last Sunday's image) but it soon likens Israel to a vine, taken from Egypt and planted in a new land. This vine, the psalmist laments, has been ravaged, cut off and burned. Three rare words in the Hebrew (two being the Bible's sole instances and the third being one of only two) are found in that Psalm: kanna, which may be stock or (grafted) shoot; kirsem, which here means ravaged but may also be cut off; and kasah, also meaning cut off. These appear to lie behind John's true vine passage, but the image has been reworked. In the former usage (including in Isaiah 5 and Ezekiel 17) the land of Israel was the vineyard, the locus, and the Israelites the vine transplanted to it, but in John Christ himself as the vine is the locus, and his disciples are grafted shoots and branches. This is an inclusive reworking of the original imagery, for it no longer applies to a single tribe or nation, but people of any nation may be grafted on. This inclusive universality is also expressed in today's responsorial Psalm 22(21), for all the earth shall return to God, and all families of the nations shall worship—a theme established by the mere mention of Saul/Paul.

Motherhood of Mary



As we celebrate Mother's Day next Sunday, let us not forget to make room in our homes and in our hearts for Mary our Heavenly Mother. As stated by the Second Vatican Council: "Mary has by grace been exalted above all angels and men to a place second only to her Son, as the most holy mother of God From the earliest times the Blessed Virgin is honoured under the title of Mother of God, whose protection the faithful take refuge together in prayer in all their perils and needs."

There are many ways we can honour Mary and show her our love. As Catholics we honour Mary just as Jesus honours her. True devotion to Mary will always lead us to her divine son Jesus. When we

admire a painting, we pay tribute to the artist. Our Heavenly Father created Mary without sin so that He can send His only Begotten Son to redeem us. She is God's masterpiece - so when we honour Mary we are also glorifying God our Heavenly Father. Jesus came to us through Mary – so it is natural for us to go to Jesus through Mary.

We honour Mary under her many titles. Here in our parish, we have a weekly devotion to her under the title **OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP.** In 1866 Pope Pius IX entrusted the guardianship of the original image of Our Mother of Perpetual Help to the Redemptorists and commissioned them to spread everywhere devotion to her and "**MAKE HER KNOWN THROUGHOUT THE WORLD**."

The picture of Our Mother of Perpetual Help is called an icon which is the Greek word for image. An icon tries to convey an idea to the mind rather than portray a resemblance for the eye. In an icon, everything has a meaning: the colours used, the lettering, the pose, every last detail. The Golden Crown placed on the original picture of Our Mother of Perpetual Help by order of the Holy See in 1867 is a token of the many miracles wrought by Mary invoked under that title. The Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help falls on 27 June. **DEVOTION TO OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP IS HELD EACH SATURDAY AT 10.00 AM IN THIS PARISH – PLEASE JOIN US IN PRAYING FOR THE NEEDS OF THE PARISH, ITS COMMUNITY AND FOR THE WORLD.**
