Parish Communications: As the life of our parish grows there is the need to find ways to effectively communicate the many events and invitations to our parishioners and beyond. Printed parish newsletters continue to be a mainstay of our communication, but this is increasingly supplemented with digital communication: the website, the emailed newsletter, and the electronic screens.

This year we will be trying to use our parish newsletter differently, printing a new newsletter on the 1st and 3rd weekends of each month, but having it available on the 2nd, 4th and 5th weekends for people who were not there the previous week. We hope in this way to reduce duplication (the same article is often repeated for many weeks) and the use of paper. We'll also be removing some of the information which can be found elsewhere, including the ministry rosters which each minister already receives, and the scripture readings and feast days which can be found in missals, online, and in the "God's Word 2020" book which is available in the piety store in the foyer. This increases the room available for other information.

This simplification of the bulletin will allow our parish secretary Nicole more time to develop the parish website and to make greater use of the screens in the church for announcements.

Ash Wednesday is on Wednesday February 26th. Come and mark the beginning of the season of Lent. We will have Masses at 7am, 9am, 12.15pm and 7pm. We can start to prepare ourselves now – what prayer, or fasting, or almsgiving will we take up as our Lenten project this year?

Centenary of laying of the foundation stone

On 18 April 1920 the foundation stone of our current church was blessed. On Sunday 19 April this year (the first Sunday after Easter) Bishop Anthony Randazzo will celebrate the 10.30 am Mass to commemorate the centenary of the laying of the foundation stone.

On Sunday 9 February there will be a meeting at 11.30 am in the parish meeting rooms to organise a function to be held after Mass on 19 April. If you would like to offer ideas or assistance then please come to this meeting. A finger food luncheon in the primary school playground (the site of the earlier church) is currently contemplated. It would be good to have a number of people (representing all groups) organising food so that the burden on any one person is not too great.

This is also an opportunity to revisit the history of our church building and its people and to tell that story. Perhaps you have family or friends who were parishioners here in the early days. Perhaps you have stories that deserve telling or pictures you wish to share of life in the early days of our parish – in particular, the 1920s version of the church or pictures of the sanctuary with Altar rails. SUNDAY NIGHT COMMUNION MINISTERS

From the start of the new roster in February we will no longer have a roster for Communion Ministers at Sunday night 5.30pm Mass. Instead, wooden crosses corresponding to the number of Communion Ministers needed will be on the offertory table in the middle of the church. We invite trained and commissioned Communion Ministers to take and wear a cross so that we have clarity about who will be giving Communion, and only those people wearing a cross to come forward.

CORONAVIRUS

Although there is little evidence of seasonal colds and flus being transmitted by the Communion chalice, it seems prudent that we take some measures of social distancing to prevent the spread of the new coronavirus. We will discontinue offering Communion from the chalice for the next two weeks. We do this regrettably, as receiving both the Body and Blood of Christ is the fullest experience of Holy Communion, however this was the precaution taken in 2003 with the SARS virus. People might also consider receiving Communion on the hand, not the tongue to avoid ministers having their fingers near their mouths. Otherwise, please come at the end of the communion line if you do still want to receive on the tongue. Communion Ministers will receive a message from Gerard Ryan with more details.

HOW DO WE MAKE THE ASHES FOR ASH WEDNESDAY?

We burn the palms from last year’s Palm Sunday. If you have a palm from last year, please bring it in and put it in the box in the foyer so we can create this year’s ashes. Who gives the ashes at Ash Wednesday Masses? You don’t need to be a Senior Server or even a Communion Minister, any adult can do this. You’re invited to volunteer for one of our four Masses by putting your name on the list in the foyer.

MUSIC MINISTRY WORKSHOP

Hospitality is about making people feel welcome

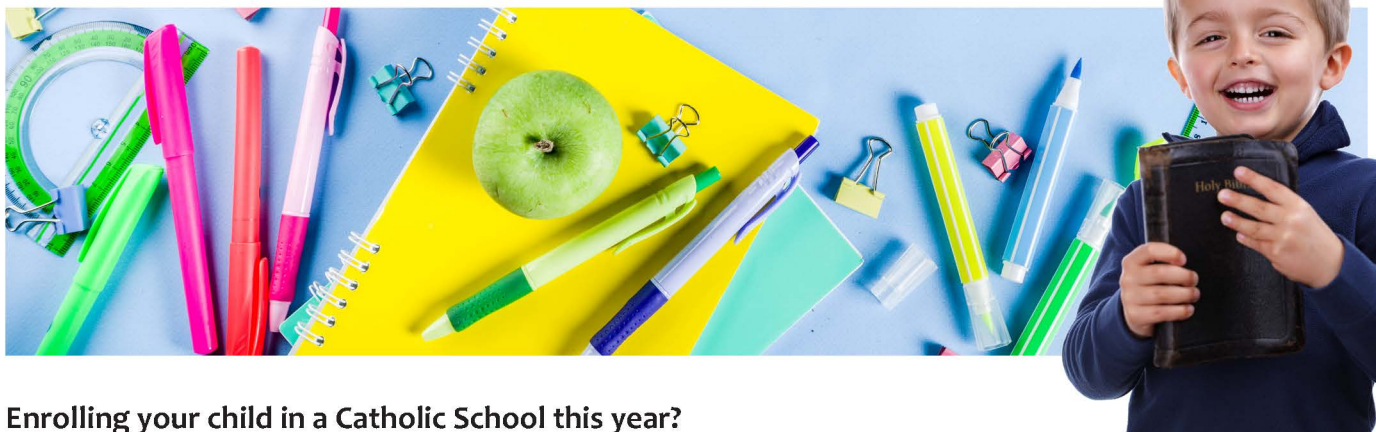

On Tuesday 21 January, around 25 parishioners gathered for a meeting facilitated by David Barrow, the lead organiser from Sydney Alliance. David explained the work of Sydney Alliance. He guided us through several processes that offered a 'taster' of the training for community organising that will be available over the coming months. The Sydney Alliance approach to community organising draws strongly from the Catholic Social Teaching of the Common Good for all of its initiatives. In early March some of the those who

participated on 21 January will attend a Sydney Alliance Council Meeting. This will be a chance to meet and listen to other Sydney Alliance members.

WHAT KIND OF WORLD DO WE WANT TO LEAVE TO THOSE WHO COME AFTER US?

Pope Francis put this question to the global community in *LAUDATO SI Care for our Common Home*. It is now five years since Pope Francis wrote *Laudato Si* and positioned the document in the body of Catholic Social Teaching.

Have you read *Laudato Si*?

Are you familiar with the issues it addresses and its recommendations?

Pope Francis sees climate change and unresolved issues of global hunger and poverty as resulting in increasing conflict, violence and displacement of peoples.

He writes that "Peace, justice and the preservation of creation are three absolutely interconnected themes, which cannot be separated and treated individually ... Everything is related and we human beings are united as brothers and sisters on a wonderful pilgrimage, woven together by the love God has for each of his creatures ..." LS 92
