Changes from July 1st: From July 1st there will no longer be a 50 person limit to how many people can gather in churches and other indoor venues, rather, 4 square meters per person will be the only limit. This means that 150 people can attend any Mass at Our Lady of Dolours.

For Sunday and vigil Masses we will continue to use the trybooking portal on the parish website. If you cannot access the internet, phone the parish office after 2pm Monday to book for the following weekend. This will continue as long as the government requires us to collect contact tracing information

You may now come to Mass every weekend (we are grateful to people for their generosity in coming alternative weekends while the limit has been 50). Please book ahead (bookings are open until 15 minutes before Mass begins) rather than just turning up. We have had to turn many people away.

St Pius X College playground will now be available for parking. Please note that the gates will be locked 30 minutes after the 10.30am and 5.30pm Masses finish. The Kirk St carparks will remain open during the day and be locked 30 minutes after the 5.30pm Mass. Disabled parking will also be available behind the parish office via Archer St.

Entry will be via the front (Archer St) and rear (St Pius side) doors only (not the side doors). This will be until there are no limits to numbers and contact tracing is no longer required.

Thank you to our welcomers who have taken up the role of scanning people's tickets as they come to Mass. We are working to iron out the glitches with the scanning system to ensure a quick and contactless way of welcoming people to Mass.

Weekday Masses: From July 1st Monday Mass will move back to 12.15pm as it was pre-Covid. We will also have an additional Mass on Wednesdays at 12.15pm, with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament between the 9am and 12.15pm Masses. Anointing of the Sick will follow the 12.15pm Mass on the 3rd Wednesday of the month.

No booking is needed for weekday Masses, but we will continue to sign in for weekday Mass or for visits to the church as long as the NSW Govt requires the collection of contact tracing details.



The Parish library: We are refreshing the parish library which is in an alcove on the left-hand side of the church. Bishop David Walker has donated several boxes of books which has given us the opportunity to sort out the existing books and to put some new material (including some older and classic writings) on the shelves. In April, Sydney Alliance contacted NSW members of parliament with their first-hand stories of people in crisis who had been left behind because of their visa status. On 3 June Acting Minister for Multiculturalism Geoff Lee said that the NSW government would provide \$6 million in funding to ensure that the most vulnerable temporary visa holders in the State, including victims of domestic violence have access to food, medicine, and housing.

This allocation of funding is in addition to \$20 million in temporary crisis accommodation for international students in need.

The funding will be distributed through organisations such as Jesuit Refugees Services (JRS), greater detail is yet to be announced. In the past two months JRS alone has seen a 224% increase in demand for its services and has delivered food parcels to 3,800 people who are facing homelessness, risk of suicide and despair.

Our Work with Sydney Alliance

Since last month, Sydney Alliance has facilitated zoom meetings of church and community leaders from the lower north shore area. The initial aim was to work together to address issues impacting people seeking asylum and refugees. Fr Jim, Gail Gill, Anthony Seeto, Brendan Tertini and Bernadette Ho are attending these meetings.

Our first shared task is to open dialogue with Gladys Berejiklian in her capacity as MP, by thanking her for the \$6 million funding. We are continuing to research the focus for working together as a Lower North Shore group. More information soon!

DEVOTION TO OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP:


