PROCEDURE ON RECEIVING COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS

In the Diocese of Broken Bay it is permissible, and recommended, that the laity receive Holy Communion under both kind at all Masses.

The procedure to do so is:

As you process up to the Communion point be in prayer for the great mystery you are about to receive.

As the person in front of you receives Communion you make a sign of reverence by bowing your head. (Please do not genuflect as you may kick the person behind you and this becomes an W.H.S. issue.)

If you are to receive Communion in the hand when standing in front of the minister of the host place your left hand in the right making a cup and hold it out so that the minister does not have to stretch to reach your hand.

The minister will hold up the host in front of you and say "The Body of Christ".

You reply "Amen."

The host will be placed in your hand.

Take one step to the right or left, depending on which line you are in, and using your right hand take the host and consume it.

Reverse this procedure if you are naturally left-handed.

If you wish to receive the host on your tongue come close to the minister so that he/she does not have to stretch to reach you. Open your mouth wide and extend your tongue so that the host can be placed on it without the minster getting saliva on his/her fingers.

If you are to receive from the chalice again make a reverent bow of the head as the person in from receives the chalice.

As you stand in front of the minister he/she will say "The Blood of Christ" and you reply "Amen".

Receive the cup from the minister and take a sip and hand it back to the minister.

The minister will wipe the cup at the point you drank from and rotate it so the next person does not drink from where you drank.

Quietly proceed back to your seat.

(The practice of Intinction whereby you receive the host and then take it to the chalice and dip it in the Precious Blood is not allowed.)

For young children or others who are not receiving communion, they may come forward in the communion procession with their hand on their heart, or both hands crossed on their chest, to receive a blessing.
