

The word Advocate in the first verse of the gospel (John 15:26-27; 16:12-15) is found as Paraclete in Communion antiphons around this time (Sixth Sunday, and Wednesday and Thursday of the Seventh week) as well as in today's optional solemn blessing, so a lexical mismatch may be experienced today. Both are loan words in English: advocate, from Latin, entering English first, then paraclete a century later from Greek. Later evidence in early Jewish Aramaic sources, specifically Targumim (free translations from the Hebrew, mostly into Aramaic) and the Talmud, confirms that it became a loan word due to its being a technical term in legal contexts for one who defended another, or pleaded or interceded for another. In broader use it may apply to one who testifies on one's behalf, and to teaching, both features of John's text as it unfolds. In this case the Spirit is Christ's witness to us, hence also teacher of his teachings, but as recipients of the Spirit Christians too are witnesses for Christ before the world. The word also functions as a minor thread in John, where all four instances apply to the Holy Spirit (14:16,26, 15:26 and 16:7).

From Fr David

Pentecost! The Great Amen to the journey we commenced 90 days ago when on Ash Wednesday we were sprinkled with ash. Now through our journey of Lent and Easter, the ash springs into life to be a mighty flame, to enSpirit us and embolden us to go out and to give witness to the promise we have received in Christ. May today be both a joyful celebration of the power of the Spirit of God and also one by which we pray for our renewal of heart and of life.

To mark this special moment in our liturgical year I have written a Pastoral Reflection to you. It seeks to capture my impressions of my first months with you and to set the scene for the journey together ahead of us. I hope that you might spend some time with its themes, especially the long prayer that I have included at the end of my Reflection.

Our sympathy to Gerard Say on the death of his muchloved sister Margaret Majarich who passed away on 12 May. We pray eternal rest for Margaret and peace and consolation to Gerard in his loss.

Our annual May Mass Count concludes this weekend. Over the last three weeks our numbers have been: Week 1 over 6 Masses, 1,184; Week 2 over 5 Masses, 869; Week 3 over 7 Masses (1,062). Last week we also had to register the number of females (621) and men (441). This weekend we need to register age ranges and we will do that by a small 'card' in the pews.

This weekend we are commencing our annual appeal for Jesuit Refugee Services. JRS reaches out to many people who have come to Australia with very little, and who struggle to establish themselves in our city. Details of the Appeal are in the bulletin on page 2. Please do keep this in your mind over the coming weeks and in early June we will deliver what we are able to collect. We are also looking for volunteers to pack what we collect and to deliver the goods at a drop off point during the week of 7 June. Your assistance will be greatly appreciated!

On this Monday, 24 May, the Feast Day of Our Lady Help of Christians, we celebrate 200 years of Catholic Education in Australia. At 10.30am in every parish and school in Australia this will be commemorated by a special Mass. Our own church will be full of cohorts from each of our schools: Our Lady of Dolours Primary School, Mercy College and St Pius X College. The Mass in the church will be livestreamed to each of the three campuses so that all our students may be able to participate.

Then, on Wednesday 26 May at 7.30pm we are offering a very special Liturgy of Lament and Supplication for the Pandemic, mindful especially of all those affected so dreadfully in nations such as India. We invite you to join us in our church and to bring along photos of those who

may have died of the virus. The evening will be a poignant occasion of solidarity with the world's suffering.

Next Friday 28th and Saturday 29th May there will be some construction work occurring on the Mercy College classrooms and our meeting rooms on Kirk St. The panelling on the demountable buildings requires attention and therefore we ask that the use of our meetings rooms be limited over these days.

Since my arrival I have been acutely aware of how the weather, especially when it is inclement, roars into the foyer of the church. When it is raining, this makes the floor of the foyer very slippery and unsafe. To address this, we are to install automatic opening glass doors at the main entrance. We will retain the existing wooden doors; the new glass doors will stand just inside the other side of the entrance pillars. We have now ordered the doors and their equipment, and I am hopeful installation will occur over the next few weeks. Not only will this assist in protecting the interior of our church from the weather but hopefully it will also keep us all a little warmer during the winter months.

As we come to the end of Volunteers Week in Australia, we are looking for some new volunteers for our own community. Next week we will have a range of opportunities available for your consideration. We give thanks for the many, many people who contribute to the building up of our parish!

requests are currently being accepted for any Sunday during 2021. There is now a general flower fund to donate money for flowers when no memorial or celebration is allocated. Altar flower arrangements can be in memory of a loved one, or in honor of a special occasion; birthdays, anniversaries, baptisms, marriages, etc, and who they were given for will be announced at the beginning of Mass for that weekend. The suggested donation for flower memorials is \$100. Volunteers will then beautifully and simply arrange the flowers for Sunday.
