

Sr Michele Connolly rsj is a Sister of St Joseph of Lochinvar in the Hunter Valley. She taught in Catholic Secondary Schools of the Maitland Diocese, including a stint as an R.E. Co-ordinator, for about ten years. She studied theology at YTU Melbourne, and in the USA, graduating in 2008 with a PhD from GTU, Berkeley, CA. Michele's principal area of interest is the Gospel of Mark. In 2018 her doctoral thesis was published by T&T Clark, under the title, *Disorderly Women and the Order of God: An Australian Feminist Reading of the Gospel of Mark*. Michele has taught in Sydney since the 1990s at CTU, Hunter's Hill and since 2001 at Catholic Institute of Sydney, Strathfield. Michele speaks regularly at seminars and conferences on the role of Scripture in our lives.

#### **Dear friends**

I have been with you just two weeks now, and it has been a very exciting time for me meeting many of you and coming to learn all the ways and processes of the parish. Thank you for your patience with me as I keep learning and discovering, and most importantly as I seek to remember your names.

I am especially grateful to our parish staff who have made me so welcome and helped me enormously over these first weeks with you. Already, I am working with our Finance and Facilities Manager, Michael Mercer on a range of different projects to enhance our beautiful church and parish buildings. We think of our teachers, students and their families who are all preparing to return to a new year. Let's hope that this year may be much less disruptive for them than the last.

We remember in our prayers the Vacarro family. Margherita, a longterm parishioner of our community, passed away recently and we will farewell her this Thursday, 28 January.

As we celebrate Australia Day on Tuesday let us pray also for our nation, for its safety and well-being during these challenging times.
