Booking in for Mass: We have now celebrated our first week with an open church and small, ten person Masses. As expected there has been a high demand for Sunday Masses, but a surprisingly low demand for weekday Masses. This allows us to recalibrate how often each person may attend Mass as we seek to share out this precious experience.

At this stage, people may only attend one Sunday Mass per month. The four Masses (8am, 9am, 10am and 11am) on Sunday 24th are already full, but bookings may be placed with the parish office for Sunday May 31st and Sunday June 7th. Contact <u>nicole.gorman@bbcatholic.org.au</u> or 9410 9000, giving the names and a contact phone number of each person who will be attending (this is a NSW Health Department requirement for contact tracing). The parish website will give you a more up to date notice of which Masses are available.

People may also attend one weekday Mass, 9am Monday – Saturday each week, in addition to any Sunday Mass. This may open up further in the weeks ahead once we know the level of demand. People who are able to attend on a weekday might consider attending just on the weekday, to allow people who are only available on Sundays to take those days. There is also plenty of time to stay and pray after Mass on weekday. To book for a weekday, please place your name on the list in the foyer of the church. Thank you to everyone for your patience and graciousness as we adjust to this new, and hopefully temporary situation.

Adoration: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration in the church on Thursdays from 7pm – 8pm, and Saturdays from 9.30am – 10.30am. We will look at reinstating Thursday morning adoration once the number of people allowed in the church increases.

I haven't been to Mass for weeks; can I go to Communion without going to Reconciliation first? None of us have been to Mass for many weeks, and Bishop Anthony gave a dispensation to all the diocese from the obligation to attend Mass. This dispensation continues, because with the limited places available many people still will not be able to attend. The only obligation the Church gives people regarding Reconciliation is to attend once per year. I recommend people go around their birthday, which is better than everyone trying to come in the week before Christmas. The notion that everyone should go to reconciliation before receiving Communion is simply impractical: for 1500 people to spend even five minutes in confession each week would take the priests 120 hours, leaving no time to even celebrate the Masses, let alone do anything else! Be gentle with yourself. Come to Reconciliation from time to time when you recognise patterns of sin or major actions which require forgiveness, but trust in God's mercy and love at all times. We come to Communion not because we are good enough, or in a "state of grace", but because Jesus invites us, and He is good enough. - Fr Jim

We will continue to offer a videoed Mass on facebook on Sunday mornings and an interactive Liturgy of the Word on Sundays at 9am until such time as everybody is again able to attend Mass in the church.

WITHIN OUR PARISH

MEETING ROOM BOOKINGS: Meeting rooms are now able to be used again, with strict guidelines from the Government. Please contact Nicole in the Parish Office on 9410 9000 or nicole.gorman@bbcatholic.org.au if you wish to resume your meeting room booking, or wish to make a new booking. As numbers allowed in meeting rooms have changed, please do not begin your meeting again without checking with Nicole in the Parish Office as you could have been moved.

There are guidelines on each meeting room door detailing how many people are able to be in each meeting room at the same time, within the 1.5m restrictions. Each and every person in your meeting, must sign in with their full name and phone number, as per Government requirements. All the instructions for these rooms are typed up and in each meeting room. Please contact Nicole if you have any questions. Please help us to follow these strict Government rules, to prevent the spread of Covid-19. If these rules are not followed, we could see the closing of the Church and meeting rooms again, possibly for a much longer time. Thank you.

MINISTRY ROSTERS: In our present circumstance of having very limited numbers of people at Mass, the existing ministry rosters will remain on hold. If, having registered in the manner described on the front page you are taking part in Mass and you are a Minister of the Word or an Altar Server, you will be welcome to exercise that ministry during Mass. We have not yet made provision for music ministry, and as Communion from the chalice continues to be suspended there will not be a need for Communion Ministers in the short term.

FEAST OF OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS (SUNDAY 25 MAY 2020): The Australian Bishops have decided to entrust Australia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary under the title of Our Lady Help of Christians given the difficulties currently facing Australia. The Bishops first consecrated Australia to Our Lady Help of Christians in 1844 mindful of Mary's powerful intercession at Lepanto in 1571 when the then Pope St Pius V exhorted all Catholics to pray the rosary to preserve the Church from the onslaught by opposing forces. On that occasion Catholics responded in great numbers to the Pope's plea and the Christian forces prevailed over a much stronger opponent. The bishops of America, Canada, South America, and England have already consecrated their countries to Our Blessed Lady.

To mark the occasion of the Bishops entrusting Australia to Our Lady, parishioners are invited to pray the rosary in the forecourt of the church at mid-day Sunday 24th May. Additionally, parishioners may join a Zoom rosary at 2pm on that same day. Those interested in participating may send an email to mctan@optusnet.com.au no later than Saturday evening. All parishioners are reminded of Our Lady's call at Fatima to pray the rosary daily. (Marian Catholic Action Group)



Pray an Ecological Examen to begin this special Anniversary Year

Begin the Examen with an awareness of the breath of the Holy Spirit breathing within you.

There are six steps in this Examen. Move at a pace that works for you: pause at the sections where you choose to spend more time.

GRATITUDE

Give thanks to God for all of creation and for being wonderfully made in the image of God.

Where have you felt the presence of God today?

AWARENESS

Ask for the grace to see creation as God does - in all of its beauty and suffering.

Do you see the beauty of creation and hear the cries of the earth and the cries of the poor?

UNDERSTANDING

Ask for the grace to see how your life choices impact creation and the poor.

What challenges and joys do you experience as you recall your care for creation?

How can you turn away from a throwaway culture and stand in solidarity with all of God's creation and with the poor?

CONVERSION

Ask for the grace of conversion towards ecological justice and reconciliation.

Where have you fallen short in caring for your sisters and brothers and all of creation?

RECONCILIATION

Ask for the grace to reconcile your relationship with God, creation and humanity.

How might you make choices that are consistent with your desire for ecological conversion?

PRAYER

Pray a closing prayer for the earth and the vulnerable throughout the world
