

This is the only statement where all the Bishops of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) release a joint reflection on a particular topic annually. This year it focuses on why it is so important that we as a community respond to the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor.

All are welcome to the launch of the statement which will take place online at 5:30pm-6:30pm on the 5th of August.

You will hear from guest speakers including Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFM Conv, Chair of the ACBC Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service. He will respond to our launch speaker and you will have the opportunity to ask your own questions about the statement and the inputs provided at the launch.

The statement Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor focuses on building the theological foundations of caring for our common home and our human family. It will also serve as a launch pad for the ACBC's 7-year journey towards the <u>Laudato Si' Goals</u>, creating a wholly sustainable Australian church.

SRE PROVIDERS COVID-19 RESPONSE – LEARNING FROM HOME

SRE Providers have negotiated with the Department of Education to ensure that *Learning from Home* SRE resources are made available for families. The Department will advise schools of the availability of three portals that contain the links

to the Approved SRE Providers' Learning from Home materials to allow schools to inform their school communities.

The Catholic Learning from Home resources are available either through the Department's Christian SRE portal Christian SRE OR directly on the CCRESS website Catholic Learning from Home Lessons - CCRESS is the network of Catholic SRE Providers across NSW. The Learning from Home lessons have been developed in the Diocese of Broken Bay and are available for parents and students across NSW. They are provided in a user-friendly Click n Learn PowerPoint format. New lessons have been uploaded to the website this week and the CCD team is developing more lessons should they be needed.

Catechists' News

As you will have heard, the Premier announced ongoing restrictions in response to COVID-19, with the lockdown in Greater Sydney continuing until 30 July 2021. See https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19 for current advice from the NSW Government.

The Department of Education's website provides advice for families in relation to current restrictions for schools. See the <u>Department's website</u> for latest information. The site is updated regularly. The Department of Education has worked closely with NSW Health to develop a framework for COVID-19 response settings for public schools.

Department of Education Framework for COVID-19 Response

This framework includes four levels of restrictions in the school setting:

- Level 4: Students learning from home, but schools open for students and their families who need it. For those on school sites, masks mandatory for all staff and all students in Year 7 and above (noting exemptions apply).

 Note: This is the current situation in the Diocese of Broken Bay, with only some school staff and children of essential workers on site.
- Level 3: Students learning at school, with non-essential visitors restricted from school sites, reduced mingling between student and year cohorts and restrictions on activities; masks mandatory for all staff and all students in Year 7 and above (noting exemptions apply). It is anticipated that schools in Greater Sydney will move to Level 3 when the current learning from home period finishes. The timeframe for this will be subject to NSW Health recommendations.
 - <u>Note:</u> Because SRE falls under the NSW Education Act, it is considered an "essential" part of the curriculum, however the "reduced mingling" requirement prevents SRE from returning in Level 3.
- Level 2: Students learning at school, with non-essential visitors restricted from school sites, and certain activities modified to be COVID-safe; masks recommended indoors for all staff and all students in Year 7 and above (noting exemptions apply).
- Level 1: Students learning at school, with all activities occurring in a COVID-safe way.

The Department of Education has advised SRE Providers that Special Religious Education (SRE) will be permitted in schools in Level 2 and Level 1.

The Chatswood Parish is seeking to recruit a part-time Children's Ministry Assistant, 15 hours per week, 2 days per week (Tuesdays and Wednesdays), with an occasional Sunday morning as required. This role plays an important part in the Parish team, supporting the Children's Ministry Coordinator to ensure the smooth running of all ministries for children and families in the Parish.

The ideal candidate will have experience working with volunteers in a Catholic environment, is comfortable working autonomously and an understanding of the need for accountability and ownership in a role, excellent administration and time management skills and proficiency with Microsoft Office Suite. You'll also have a good understanding of, and commitment to, Catholic values and teachings.

The role provides support for occasional Sunday morning mass, monthly online Liturgy of the Word, Sacramental programs, Playgroup and Good Shepherd Catechesis Atrium activities. You will be working closely with Our Lady of Dolours Primary School to strengthen the relationship between school and Parish.
