**Memorial Mass:** During the past few months you may have been unable to attend the funeral of someone you love, due to the restricted numbers, limitations on travel, or self-isolation. We want to create an opportunity for you to come together for a memorial Mass at which we can pray for the many people whom we haven't yet fully grieved. We'll have Mass at 12pm on Saturday August 1st (please book via

www.bbcatholic.org.au/chatswood/mass-times/sunday-mass-times). We invite you to bring a photo of that person, or a flower to represent them, which we will place in front of the altar as we offer Mass for them.

Reading the bible – where to start? Many people eagerly dive into the bible by starting on the first page of Genesis. Few get very far before they are bogged down in ancient genealogies and confusing legends. So where to start? A great place to start is St Paul's Letter to the Philippians. It's a short (4 pages) and simple book which is positive and encouraging in itself, but also becomes a key to understanding Paul's other letters which make up the majority of the New Testament.

So, during August we're going to read and discuss Philippians in small groups of 6-10 people, both face to face, and via Zoom. Face to face in the parish meeting rooms: Mondays 10.30am & 7pm, Fridays 2pm and Sundays 6.30pm. Zoom: Mondays 7pm and Wednesdays 8pm, starting the week of August 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Feast of St Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop) is celebrated on Saturday August 8<sup>th</sup> at 9am. We'd like to decorate the sanctuary with Australian native flowers to honour our Australian saint, so please bring any native flowers to the church on Thurs 6<sup>th</sup> and Fri 7<sup>th</sup>.

**Feast of the Assumption** is celebrated on Saturday August 15<sup>th</sup>. It will not be a holy day of obligation this year, because Bishop Anthony has temporarily dispensed us from the obligation for Mass on Sundays and holy days. It remains a significant feast day which many people will want to celebrate, so we will have a vigil Mass on Fri Aug 14<sup>th</sup> at 7pm, as well as Saturday Aug 15<sup>th</sup> at 9am. Weekday Mass Times: Monday – 12.15pm, Tuesday – 9am, Wednesday – 9am & 12.15pm with Adoration between, Thursday - 9am, Friday – 9am & Saturday – 9am.

Booking for Mass: It appears that the NSW Govt will continue to require churches and other indoor venues to gather names and contact tracing details. We will therefore continue to use a booking system for weekend Masses. This can be accessed on the parish website <a href="www.bbcatholic.org.au/chatswood">www.bbcatholic.org.au/chatswood</a> under "Mass times & bookings" from midday Monday each week for the following weekend. If you cannot access the internet, phone the parish office between 9.30am and 4pm Tuesday – Friday. You are now welcome to come to Mass every weekend. #### CatholicCare Diocese of Broken Bay

# Reading the Bible

Scripture is at the centre of everything we do together as Church. The word of God shapes our prayer and worship. It helps us to understand how we are called by God to live as Jesus showed us how to live and how to relate to each other and to all of God's creation.

'Today Jesus speaks these same words to you: "Take heart, I am here with you, allow me to enter and your life will change". That is why the Lord gives you his word, so that you can receive it like a love letter...' Pope Francis

The Bible is not a single book, it's an amazing collection of different writings from the Jewish and Christian traditions. It's written by different people, in different places, over many centuries. In effect it's a whole library, rather than an individual book.

It brings together history, poetry, song, prayer; legal documents, moral codes, religious instruction. It speaks about God's love for all people; God's special love for the Jewish people; the coming of Jesus Christ; his death and resurrection; the gift of the Holy Spirit; and the beginnings of the Christian Church.

The Bible is for all of us, but sometimes finding our way into it can be overwhelming. There are some resources in the next column to get you started if you haven't picked up a bible before and others to take you a little further.



#### www.bibleproject.com

This is a great place to start. It's free and offers a number of ways to engage with the bible. It offers a number of animated videos which include a 'what is the bible and a how to read' the bible. Worth looking at before you look at individual books. It also offers a weekly email with video, scripture readings and questions.

# Light of Torah

The first five books of the bible, known as Torah, are Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. This resource was written by Teresa Pirola and is grouped according to the Jewish calendar of reading. There is a weekly leaflet available that is very easy to follow and as well as insights for each section of the Torah reading, provides scripture tools for everyday life.




