

The Season of Lent: The forty days of Lent are a time for us to be intentional about our Christian discipleship. We are invited by the Church to take up some prayer, fasting or almsgiving which will cooperate with God's grace to bring about the transformation of our lives. We offer you the following opportunities.

Ash Wednesday is on Wednesday March 6th. There will be Masses at 7am, 9am, 12.15pm and 7pm at which you will receive ashes on your forehead as a sign of your commitment to be transformed during Lent.



The Light Is ON For You is our diocesan Initiative to have the sacrament of Reconciliation available in every parish in our Diocese from 7pm – 8pm on Friday nights of Lent starting March 8th. We will also have Reconciliation available at 8am

on Wednesdays in addition to the usual Saturday 9.30am and Sunday 10am.



Discerning the Way of Jesus

Based on the practice of *lectio divina* as a way of reading the Scriptures that is prayerful and transformative. The booklet includes an introduction and step by step guide to *lectio divina*; weekly reflection questions for you and reflections from: Fr David Callaghan MGL; Sr Elizabeth Brennan SGS; and David Ranson. The booklets are available for no charge at the entrances of the church. An audio CD can be purchased for \$5 from faith.formation@bbcatholic.org.au.

The Stations of the Cross offer us an experience of praying with Jesus through the events of his passion. Stations of the Cross will be prayed in the church every Friday at both 11am and 7pm, with different groups and people offering a range of versions so that we can be enriched by many perspectives.

Project Compassion is the Lenten almsgiving challenge of Caritas Australia, the Australian Catholic aid and development charity. Project Compassion boxes will be available on Wednesday.

The Gospel of Luke with Bishop David Walker has attracted seventy people to the Tuesday morning and Thursday evening sessions. Bishop David is offering wonderful enrichment to the Gospel we are hearing proclaimed this year. The sessions will resume on Tuesday 12 March and Thursday 14 March after Bishop David enjoys a break.

Lawrie Crowley, a long time parishioner will be buried in a family-only service on Monday. We will celebrate the 12.15pm Mass on Monday as a memorial for him, and friends are invited to join us for this Mass.

Within the Parish

WELCOME TO BERNADETTE HO who is taking up the role of our parish's New Parishioner Engagement Coordinator. This is a new pastoral associate role, funded by the generosity of our planned givers, which allows us to be intentional about reaching out to and engaging with the many new people who come in contact with the parish, but who often slip through the cracks. Bernadette will be working particularly with families who are having their children baptised and with families with children coming into kindergarten.

Like each of our pastoral associates (catechist coordinator, children's ministry coordinator, youth ministry coordinator and adult faith formation coordinator), the coordinator part of this role is significant. Our pastoral staff don't do all the parish's ministry, but instead support and resource us as parishioners to do the work of ministry which is entrusted to us at our baptism. In the coming months Bernadette will be looking for people to get involved in these welcoming ministries, including greeting people at the door of the church at each Mass.

Many men have had fathers who were absent or distant. 

A Letter to the People of God of the Diocese of Broken Bay Very Rev Dr David Ranson Diocesan Administrator 28 February 2019

It is difficult indeed to fathom the ramifications of the dramatic and historic events that have marked these days, resulting in the remand into custody of Cardinal George Pell, subsequent to his recent conviction. The verdict of guilt will be tested now in the Court of Appeal and will either be validated or questioned, and this will take some months. When that time comes, we will be impelled to reflect again on events, one way or another. Now, our thoughts and our prayers go always to those who have been so greatly wounded by the crime of sexual abuse, particularly from within our own community of faith.

The verdict of guilt by a court of law is one thing, shocking enough as it is. Our reactions to this outcome will be diverse and complex. However, the social reaction and the widespread commentary to the verdict is another. We cannot ignore or underestimate the community's response to the verdict that has been given, and which further adds to our distress. In different ways, the energy of this social response highlights the remarkable collapse of the credibility of the institution with which we are identified - whether by our belonging to our local Catholic parish, or by our association with our Catholic schools or agencies. It places our affiliation under extraordinary stress. It is shameful for us to have to stand before the constant analysis, the critique, and the commentary about our Church, and the declarations of its failures and inadequacies. It forces us to address the question, "Why would we wish to be identified with an institution condemned with such widespread disdain?" We cannot avoid this question. This is the crossroad to which moments such as this bring us. We must answer the inevitable question put to us by the sad circumstances of this week with humility, integrity and courage, such that a new sense of purpose might motivate and guide us into the future, not with stoic resignation, but with genuine Christian hope. In this way, this dreadful moment in the life of our Church in Australia can act to purify and clarify our discipleship.

In this inevitable personal struggle, I am reminded of the words of the famous Scripture scholar, Walter Burghardt, who put it this way once in a homily he gave at a baptism. He said to the woman, being baptised,

"Sonia Maria, before we welcome you through symbol and ritual into this paradoxical people, this community of contradictions, let me make an uncommonly honest confession. In the course of more than half a century, I have seen more Catholic corruption than most Catholics read of. I have tasted it. I have been reasonably corrupt myself. And yet, I take joy in this Church, this living, sinning people of God; I love it with a crucifying passion. Why? In spite of all the

Catholic hate, I experience here a community of love. For all the institutional idiocy, I find here a tradition of reason. For all the individual repression, I breathe here an air of freedom. In an age so inhuman, I touch here tears of compassion. In a world so grim and humourless, I share here rich joy and earthly laughter. In the midst of death, I hear an incomparable stress on life here. For all this apparent absence of God, I sense here the presence of Christ. I pray, Sonia Maria, that your life within this community, your experience of a strange God and a still stranger people, will rival mine".

For many, the paradox presents as a contradiction too difficult to reconcile. But there will be those of us who can enter the paradox and discover a new possibility there.

In all that is transpiring, we are challenged not to lose sight of what is actually happening around us locally. Can we see that love into which we are invited by Christ exercised in our local communities? Does my parish family demonstrate this for me? Do I see this love exercised in my school community, in my agency? I can find the resource to continue to belong to this parish, or to this school, or to this agency if I see there the mystery of Christ's sacrificial love being lived out in a way that calls me forth to the sense of what is really true, what is really beautiful, what is really good. I know that this truth, beauty and goodness is evidenced in abundance by the remarkable witness, generosity and faith of those who are present with us in our parishes and in our schools and in our agencies.

Through all this, we hold in our hearts all who are so deeply affected, in so many ways, by the crime of abuse in all its different manifestations and dimensions. The ripples of this wound at the heart of our life together stretch out in incalculable ways. Each time we are confronted with its reality is an opportunity for us to reaffirm our diocesan commitment to ensure the safety of our children and vulnerable adults. It is a commitment underscored by our faith in Jesus Christ in whom we hold the fundamental sanctity of every human person. It is our moral, legal, and spiritual obligation to safeguard all within our community. Only in this way can we genuinely foster communities of safety and care for our people and be the Church that we so desperately want and need to be. May the Lord of the future lead us there.

In these days let us care for one another, and especially all those who have been hurt by the crime of abuse. Be mindful of those resources available for our personal support, including those of CatholicCare. Lent - a time to pause, see and return to the tenderness of God

Pope Francis suggests Lent as a time to pause a little from the many things that fill busy lives. The word Lent comes from an Old English word that means 'springtime'. That is obviously more relevant in the northern hemisphere than it is to us here. However, we know spring as a time of preparation for growth in creation, pruning away what will prevent growth, nourishing plants and trees to encourage flowers and fruit. The growth and flowering that we prepare for in Lent is growth in our relationship with the Risen Jesus at Easter.

In the fourth century, St Gregory of Nyssa wrote: 'So let us go forth, flowers for a day, from beginning to beginnings which never end.' This Lent may be your 20th or your 70th + Lent. It may become the time when you pause to form a fresh pattern of prayer during the days and weeks of Lent, or to engage with any of the suggestions on the front page of this bulletin. You might perhaps consider a short retreat as part of your preparation for Easter. There are a few suggestions below:


Praying with St John of the Cross

"For well I know the spring that flows and runs although it is night." John of the Cross speaks of the song of the soul that rejoices in knowing God through faith.

A new book from Fr Richard Leonard SJ



This is a wonderful new book on the sacraments, carefully researched and accessible in Fr Richard's engaging style. He summarises complex history and debates that assists understanding. As Fr Richard says in his Introduction, books on the sacraments usually fall into three categories: catechetical material for children; material for adults in RCIA programs or scholarly theological texts. This book bridges these three categories and offers a refresher for Catholics or it could also be a basic text for catechists, teachers, co-ordinators, parents and facilitators of sacramental programs for children. It also offers understanding for parents seeking baptism for their children and couples preparing for marriage.

At first glance, the title may sound glib, however, Fr Richard refers to a prayer from the Rite of Ordination, and suggests that this should be sung at the celebration of every sacrament.

May God who has begun this good work in you, bring it to completion.

'May that be true of us as these Christ events hatch us into new life, match our lives to be more like Christ's, and actively prepare us for the moment when we are all dispatched into life eternal.' P.173


Your prayers of support will strengthen them on their journey and the children, parents and parish staff thank you for this support.
