



PARISH MEETING ROOMS

In February this year, the Parish opened up its new meeting rooms for the benefit and use by all parishioners. The rooms were in pristine condition with all the facilities that groups could require. We had hoped that our parishioners would value these facilities and look after them. Whilst this is the case in most situations, we have had some incidences of a lack of care. For example, the cooktop in the Magnificat Room has been smashed and most white walls in the rooms have black marks where chairs have been stacked without much care.

When Group leaders signed for their keys to the rooms, they also signed up to the list of Room Protocols. This is shown below as a reminder. Could all members of groups that meet at the rooms please read below so you understand what is required.

One of the key issues currently is with the stacking of chairs. This was a requirement of the old Rotunda but no longer a requirement of the new site. Groups may change the table and chair configuration to whatever best works for the group. All we ask is that when you arrive you look at the configuration and when you finish your meeting, return the tables and chairs to be as you found it. Another issue is with food. It is great for groups to share food in their meetings. We just ask that you clean up and remove all food at the end of the meeting. Special attention is required to the sinks and benches so as not to attract ants. There are cleaning materials in the cupboard next to the fridge in the Magnificat Room. With the warmer weather coming up, the Air Conditioners are there for your comfort. Please use but remember to turn them off.

I am sure you would all like to keep the rooms nice for your meetings and that our requirements are not too demanding.

Protocols for using Parish Meeting Rooms:

Bookings

1. Bookings in advance must be made for all meeting rooms through the Parish Office.

Kevs

2. For regular Parish Groups, a key will be provided to the leader of the group. It is their responsibility to look after the key. If the leader can't make a meeting, they must ensure the key is given to another member of the team to open the meeting room. Spare keys will not be available. Should the group be abandoned, the key must be returned to the Parish Office.

- For non-regular bookings, a key will be provided by the Parish Office within one week prior to the booking date and must be returned to the Parish Office within one week.
- 4. A tip for locking the door is to turn the key as far left as possible then turn back half a turn to remove the key.
- Toilets keys are in the room for the Staff Male and Female Toilets. Please <u>do not</u> use the Girls or Disability Toilets.

Furniture

- Meeting room furniture configurations must be maintained. Furniture can be moved around for the meeting but must be returned to the configuration it was found in.
- 7. Furniture must be kept clean and nothing left in the room.

Group Cupboard Space

8. Each regular group will be allocated a cupboard to store their group information. The Group leader will be provided with a key. Please ensure all your materials are stored in the cupboard and locked at end of the meeting. Like the Meeting Room key, the Leader is responsible for it and must pass on to another group member if they are not attending the meeting.

Kitchens

- 9. Kitchens are there for everyone's use. Please keep the sinks and benches clean, crockery and cutlery washed, dried and returned to its drawers and cupboards / stacked and power points turned off (except for refrigerators).
- 10. Please do not leave anything in the refrigerators. Anything left will be thrown out.

Rubbish

11. All rubbish or materials that are no longer required are **not** to be left in the rooms.

Meeting Finished

12. When the meeting is complete, ensure everything is in order with the above protocols and lock the door. Note, lights turn themselves off once you have exited the room.

Working in a child-related ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay

Paid and volunteer workers who have direct face to face contact with children (under 18 years) are required by law to obtain a Working with Children Check number. Please note though exemptions may apply in some cases. The Parish is the employer of the paid or volunteer worker and therefore is required by law to verify the Working with Children Check number. All paid or volunteer workers engaged in a child-related role must have a clear Working with Children Check to work in a child-related ministry.
