In today's gospel (Mark 1:21-28) Jesus and his disciples reach the fishing village Capernaum, and there he teaches in the synagogue on the Sabbath. Here he is presented as one with a teaching that is new. Here also we find one of the characteristically Marcan structures, where an episode is sandwiched between two parts of another construction. In this case, two synonyms indicate the "sandwich" of this device in v.22 and 27, but the first is weakened in our Lectionary's translation: exeplessonto (from ekplesso) became "made a deep impression on them" rather than the more direct amazed/astounded", with "thev were its ethambēthēsan (from thambeō), "they were astonished". They are first amazed by his teaching, and their astonishment is confirmed when his authoritative teaching is demonstrated in action, the sandwich's filling. In it is a man with an unclean spirit, and such unclean spirits are the first to recognize Jesus for who he really is. But when the man speaks, it is in the plural, "What do you want with us? Have you come to destroy us?" This sometimes trips people up into thinking of the man as one possessed by many demons who fear what Jesus will do to them. But even the order Jesus gave, "Be muzzled!", is in the singular. So, who is the "us" the man speaks for?

From Fr David

Dear friends

As you may have heard, the NSW Government has reviewed its level of restrictions last Wednesday. As from this weekend, we will be able to now receive as many people in our church as the 4sq metre principle allows. This means that we can now increase our number at each Mass from 100 to 150. Masks remain mandatory for places of public worship and choirs are limited to 5 without congregational singing. The Government has indicated that the restrictions will be further eased in two weeks' time if things remained contained. We certainly hope this will be the case.

At the beginning of December, Bishop Anthony wrote a Pastoral Letter to our Diocese outlining his vision and priorities for our local Church. Regretfully, it did not seem to arrive at our Parish! We now have copies available, and I encourage us to take one and spend some time with what Bishop Anthony shares with us. Maybe some of our parish groups would like to take it and use it for shared reflection? We will return to it, too, during our forthcoming Season of Lent.

It has been a joy for me to continue to learn of the many activities and groups that makes our parish so strong. Into the mix, we would like to introduce a Mass in Spanish once a month, given the number of people with South American background. The Mass will be celebrated by Fr Joey Frez. We would like to schedule this at 12noon on the 3rd Sunday of the month, which means our first one would be on Sunday 21 February. This will mean that we have Masses in three cultural groups: Filipino, Indonesian and Spanish – a great testament to the multicultural vitality of our community With this introduction, going forward, we will celebrate Baptisms on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.

We welcome back to school all our students and teachers. It is extraordinary that we have over 2000 students at our precinct each day. This last week I have been meeting the various Principals and leadership teams of our schools and planning the year ahead. We have quickly identified a real need that Mercy College has in respect to its severe limitations in bringing its students together. Once a month, therefore, the girls will come to the church for assembly. This will take place between 10am and 11am, after the morning Mass and Rosary.

On these days, **just once a month**, we will, however, delay Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament until 11am, continuing with Benediction in the usual way at 12 noon and Mass at 12.15pm. We will give notice the weekend before each of the occasions. The first one will be this coming Wednesday, 3 February. I am grateful for your understanding and for the way in which we can generously accommodate the College which is operating under very significant constraints. I am confident that there will be a grace for the girls becoming more familiar with our church.

Don't forget, too, to spread the word about our new youth initiative, led by Deacon Aldrin – a group for those in Years 7-9! This will mean that we have three groups for young people: one for those in years 7-9, one for those in years 10-12, and a young adults group.

May the first week of the school year be one of blessing for all!

Sr Michele Connolly rsj is a Sister of St Joseph of Lochinvar in the Hunter Valley. She taught in Catholic Secondary Schools of the Maitland Diocese, including a stint as an R.E. Co-ordinator, for about ten years. She studied theology at YTU Melbourne, and in the USA, graduating in 2008 with a PhD from GTU, Berkeley, CA. Michele's principal area of interest is the Gospel of Mark.
