**Sunday night music:** The Acclaim youth group have been leading the music ministry at every Sunday night Mass. In revisiting their group's mission recently, they have decided to refine this to playing twice a month, in order to focus better on other areas of their group's mission, namely, spiritual, social justice and community. This also creates an opportunity for other parishioners to step forward to contribute to the music ministry on Sunday nights. We are looking for someone who can sing and / or play an instrument, or gather a few people with them, to provide music on the first Sunday of the month, starting in September. **Community Dinners:** We've had a wonderful response to this project and nearly 50 people have volunteered to cook and serve a meal each Saturday night, starting on September 14<sup>th</sup>. We will invite people to RSVP to come to the dinners later in August.

**Scripture readings at Mass:** Hearing the Word of God proclaimed is an intrinsic part of every Mass. There is a spirituality of *listening* which harkens back to the Old Testament "Hear, O Israel" (Deut 6:4) and to the Rule of St Benedict "Listen and attend with the ear of your heart". However, in an attempt to make the scripture readings more accessible, we, and many parishes now project the readings on the screen, and unfortunately this has resulted in many people just reading along, rather than truly listening.

The parish Liturgy Committee have been considering this for some time with Fr Jim, Fr John and Deacon Kevin, and we would like to find a way to foster that spirituality of listening, whilst also allowing for people who truly need to have the text in front of them to access to it. So, from September, we will no longer project the scripture readings on the screen, but will have some printed copies available near the bulletins for people who need it.

A better approach though, is to use a missal, or a website like <a href="https://www.universalis.com">www.universalis.com</a> or an app like Laudate to read the scripture readings the day before you come to Mass, so you come prepared to listen, or, to read them again the following day, to reinforce what you have heard. We'd love to hear how this works for you.



# Voting is now open

The Chatswood Parish Community Dinner Project is seeking a government grant of \$22,000 to help set up out and equip our hall to be able to provide the weekly community dinner.

# Why should you vote for this project?

- This will provide healthy food and social engagement to the lonely, those in need and the homeless in our community.
- It will allow people in our church community to share our resources and give back to the wider community.
- The church will cover the labour and operations. The grant will cover the set-up costs and some food staples.

LEGISLATION TO LEGALISE ABORTION has been introduced into the NSW Parliament. At present abortion is not legal, unless the physical or mental health of the mother is at risk. Regardless of how broadly this may be interpreted, it at least provides some safeguards for unborn children. This new bill, The Reproductive Health Care Reform Bill 2019 would allow for abortion up to 22 weeks and is strongly at odds with our Catholic belief that life begins at conception and that all life in the womb should be inviolable. The best thing we can do, as well as pray, is to write to our state MP, who for those of us in Willoughby electorate is Premier Gladys Berejiklian, 280 Willoughby Rd Naremburn 2065. - Fr Jlm McKeon

**THANKS** to the generosity of our parishioners who are committed givers by credit card, direct debit or envelope, we have reached our giving target in the past year and been able to do some great things in the parish:

- Installed fans in the church to cool us on hot days
- 2. Re-padded all of the kneelers in the church
- Installed an access ramp at the back of the church
- 4. Furnished and fitted out our new meetings
- 5. Made improvements to the toilets.
- Employed Bernadette Ho as our new parishioner engagement coordinator who is doing a great job of reaching out to new families and new parishioners
- 7. Given name badges to over 300 parishioners to build up a sense of community.

As we look to the year ahead there is so much more that we can do together. The parish is growing, with over one hundred more people attending the parish each weekend compared to one year ago, and we expect further growth. We will be seeking your generosity to fund some new projects:

- a) Upgrade the sound system in the church to overcome the reverberation and lack of intelligibility (\$100,000)
- b) Build a new baptism font on the sanctuary in stone to match altar (\$10,000)
- c) Start Community Dinners every Saturday night from September (\$15,000 set up costs & \$10,000 p.a. running costs)
- d) Employ a new staff member to be a *small* groups co-ordinator. We have so many new people approaching the parish that we now need to be able to facilitate their ongoing involvement in the parish (\$36,000 p.a.).
- e) Offer a Ministry Scholarship to a university student to engage them in a range of parish ministries. (\$15,000).
- f) Run the Alpha program in 2020, and other pastoral programs (\$10,000).

If you are new to the parish, or haven't yet become a committed giver, in September we will be asking you to join us in giving towards these goals.

# THE PORT OF BOURKE ON THE DARLING RIVER $4^{TH}$ JULY 2019



## St Pius X College Bourke Red Dirt Expedition

In the first week of July, 52 students and staff from St Pius X College travelled in 5 vehicles on what we called the Bourke Red Dirt Expedition to western rural and remote NSW. We visited the Catholic schools, towns, Aboriginal communities and archaeological sites.

The students from Year 7 – 11 who self-selected to participate in this Social Justice and Pastoral Care outreach to some of the most rural, remote and unique communities and locations in Western NSW, were exemplary in their representation of the values of our College and the Chatswood community. They received high commendation from the Schools, National Parks, Visitors centres, Museums and towns we visited.

The expedition involved camping for 3 stunning days and 3 sub-zero nights in the picturesque Warrumbungles National Park, climbing the igneous Breadknife and Grand High Tops geological features. A visit to the Sandstone Caves, Dandry Gorge and Sculptures in the scrub Aboriginal archaeological sites, School visits to run sports days with St Lawrence's Coonabarabran, Coonabarabran High, St Joseph's Walgett, St Patricks Brewarrina, and St Ignatius Bourke, both of which are sister Parishes to Our Lady of Dolours, Chatswood. We met and exchanged gifts with Mary Ann Gordon a lay person who puts much effort in to running the parishes in Bourke and Brewarrina and she thanked us on behalf of the community support which flows from Chatswood to the red dirt outback.

We learnt about the 30,000 year old Brewarrina Fish Traps site and Aboriginal Cultural Museum. By far the most significant of our experiences was simply connecting with the young people and community members of these remote communities who are showing incredible resilience in the face of one of the worst droughts in living memory. In so many ways these people are just like us, and they manage to live such positive and

happy lives in situations we would consider very isolating and hard, is incredibly uplifting, and something we will remember and enjoy for a long time to come.

Let us pray for and continue to support the people of remote and rural NSW, The Bourke Red Dirt Expedition Team visited many remote sites, communities and schools, experienced first-hand, something of the story and plight of those unique people and places.



So, it is not surprising that Jesus would first ask his disciples who people thought he was. Then Jesus very directly asks the disciples 'But who do you say that I am?'



Imagine Jesus looking directly at you and asking 'Who do you say that I am?' What would you answer? How does this question make you feel? Jesus often used questions in his teachings and we can take these questions into our prayer life to continue to ponder them as we journey with Jesus. Just some of the questions Jesus asks are 'Whom are you looking for?', 'Do you want to be made well?'



Sherry Weddell, the author of **Forming Intentional Disciples**. **The Path to Knowing and Following Jesus**, writes that she frequently encounters Catholics who consider 'personal discipleship with Jesus as a kind of optional spiritual enrichment.' What do you think of that statement? She also observes that many Catholics regard it as normal to not talk about their relationship with God. Is this your experience? Growing in faith needs the support of a community where sharing the actions of God in each of our lives is both enriching and inspirational.




