Proclaiming Pentecost: Each year Christians have gathered together in different churches at Pentecost to pray for their local area, and this year, we are hosting this gathering for the first time. Called "Proclaiming Pentecost" it will be a night of prayer, praise and intercession on the eve of Pentecost, Saturday June 8th, in our church from 7pm. Come and join us in praying for Chatswood and the North Shore.

Thurs May 9th: We will be joined by Our Lady of Dolours School for a special Mothers' Day Mass at 9am. Everyone is welcome, but know that this will be a longer Mass than usual. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will commence a few minutes after Mass and continue through to midday as usual.

Sunday morning teas: Every Sunday scores of people have morning tea on the forecourt after the 9am Mass. It creates a wonderful sense of community where people stay and talk, rather than rushing away. We'd like to begin having morning tea after our other Masses too, starting with the 7.30am Mass this week. We'll continue monthly, or more often if there are enough volunteers. Would you like to serve morning tea after the 10.30am Mass? Contact Fr Jim.

The Charitable Works Fund: This weekend you'll find contribution envelopes on your seats for the Charitable Works Fund (CWF) collection which will take place next week. The CWF is a levy the Diocese places on each parish, to fund some of the collective works of the Diocese: hospital chaplains, catechist resources, and St Edmunds and St Lucy's special schools. Our levy for this financial year is \$58,000. If we estimate that we have 1500 parishioners (although there are 1200-1300 any given weekend) then that equates to around \$39.00 per parishioner per year, though of course many of those 1500 parishioners are children or unwaged, so we are grateful to the people who can afford to give more to relieve the burden on those who cannot afford to give as much. Please take an envelope home this week, and complete your details if you want to give by credit card, cash or cheque, and if you would like to claim the 100% tax deduction available. Thank you for your generosity.

May Census: During May we take a census (a head count) at each Mass. The results help us, the Diocese and the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference plan ahead. This is always done in May, so that over many years there is consistency, and attendance trends can be observed. If you're taking up the collection plate, please count the number of people in your section of the church and write it down in the purple book on the table in the narthex. This is best done during the homily, as you stand at the back or side of the church while everyone else is seated. Thanks for your help.

Ramadan: Muslims, our fellow believers in God begin their holy month of fasting, Ramadan, on Monday, which is a parallel to our season of fasting in Lent. During this time healthy adults do not eat or drink during daylight hours, and break the fast together with a communal iftar meal in the evening. In a time when relationships between Christians and Muslims are more important than ever for the future of civil society, let us create solidarity and respect together.

Within the Parish

AUTUMN AND WINDOWS: Autumn has finally arrived, and at the moment we have pleasant days and chilly evenings. Our church has no heating, so we need to use the windows and doors wisely. Please close the windows and the interior doors at 3pm or 4pm as the afternoon begins to cool, to keep in whatever warm air there may be in the church. On warm days please open some windows again mid-morning, whenever it is warmer outside the church than in.

CHURCH AND STATE: In recent weeks our parish has been involved in a number of local civic events. Teresa Ng laid a wreath on behalf of the parish at the Anzac Day dawn service. Deacon Kevin attended an RSL lunch with civic leaders on behalf of the parish. Fr Jim represented the local Christian churches at last month's citizenship ceremony at the council chambers. Did you see the "Christ is Risen" banners flying in Victoria Mall during Easter week? These were designed by our Acclaim youth, paid for by the combined local churches, and installed by Willoughby Council. These are important moments of engagement with the broader community. It is important to remind ourselves of the opportunities which we as a church and we as individual Catholics have to take part in our society, particularly when there are voices saying that Christians and Catholics are under attack.

7PM MASS Apologies to the dozens of people who turned up for the Easter Vigil Mass at 5.30pm. The Easter Vigil will always start later as it needs to begin after sunset. To prevent further confusion, we'll have all evening Masses in the parish at 7pm, so whenever there is an extra Mass for a feast day such at Ash Wednesday or Assumption, it will be 7pm, as will Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil.

WHO SHOULD CATHOLICS VOTE FOR? The Church doesn't tell us which party or candidates to vote for, but it does help us to inform out consciences The Australian Catholic Bishops have published a guide for us called Politics in the Service of Peace which is available at www.catholic.org.au This document addresses a wide range of issues, including "We ask for a renewed urgency to the commitment to closing the gap between Indigenous Australians and the rest of the population. This is a running sore at the heart of the nation. Through our agencies, the Church plays a critical role in working with Indigenous peoples in health, education and welfare. But Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples continue to suffer grave disadvantage and should not have to keep waiting for justice. Now is the time to act." Fr Jim

Working in a child-related ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay

Paid and volunteer workers who have direct face to face contact with children (under 18 years) are required by law to obtain a Working with Children Check number. Please note though exemptions may apply in some cases. The Parish is the employer of the paid or volunteer worker and therefore is required by law to verify the Working with Children Check number. All paid or volunteer workers engaged in a child-related role must have a clear Working with Children Check to work in a child-related ministry. This disclosure references the legislation, *Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012.*
