Farewell Fr John: This is Fr John's last weekend as Assistant Priest here at Our Lady of Dolours Parish. We thank him for his priestly ministry to us this last three and a half years. Fr John has faithfully offered Mass and other sacraments for so many people over his time here. He also brought the gift of his cultural perspective and reinvigorated our parish feast day celebration. This weekend we will present him with a card signed by many parishioners and the gifts given to him.

Clergy moves: On Wednesday Bishop Anthony announced a number of clergy moves across the diocese, including that Fr Jim will be moving to Epping – Carlingford in January, and that the incoming Parish Priest here at Chatswood will be Fr David Ranson. Fr David is presently Parish Priest at Wahroonga. This may come as a shock to many people, and it is indeed a big transition for a parish to have both of their priests move in such quick succession. Let's focus on farewelling Fr John this week, and we'll have information about Fr Jim's finishing and Fr David's starting dates next week.

Changes to Covid restrictions: The NSW Premier has announced that the 4sqm per person rule will be reduced to 2sqm pp from Monday, which is great news for our parish. It means that we can have up to 300 people at any Mass, 36 people in the Magnificat Room, 18 in the St Paul Room and 16 in the St Peter Room. At the time of writing we are unsure whether there will be any changes to the ban on singing or the requirement to wear masks which we will clarify next week. We anticipate that contact tracing will continue to be required, so please continue to use the trybooking portal on our parish website.


