Today's gospel reading (John 15:9-17) continues where last Sunday's ended. When read in two sections like this, and if the references are ignored, it is not obvious that they form one unit within the farewell discourses given between the departure of Judas from the meal (13:29-31, read on Holy Tuesday) and his re-appearance in the garden (18:2-5, read on Good Friday); there is no mention of the vine here. However, there are common threads connecting the two, one being that of bearing fruit, which does belong to the vine image, but the "much fruit" phrase links back to the single grain that must die to yield more (John 12:24, Fifth Sunday of Lent, B). Here in the midst of the discourse at the Last Supper that famously has no mention of bread or wine we find the thematic threads of wheat and grapes, and talk of self-giving in the face of rejection, and of unity of the members. The interpretation of the eucharistic symbols of loaf and cup as Christ's self-giving (my Body given up) and forgiveness (my Blood for forgiveness of sins), and as the members' unity in him (a loaf from many grains; wine from many grapes) is much developed by the liturgical traditions. John, in his unique and poetic way, has woven these together before they were highly developed in more explicit ways in later Eucharistic Prayers.

Grant that they may know the joy of fulfilling this motherly calling of women, whether in teaching, nursing, religious life, or in other work which recognizes and fosters the true dignity of every human being created in Your image and likeness.

We beseech You to send Your Holy Spirit, the Comforter, to all mothers who sorrow for children that have died, are ill or estranged from their families, or who are in trouble or danger of any kind. Help grieving mothers to rely on Your tender mercy and fatherly love for all your children.

We ask your blessing on all those to whom You have entrusted motherhood. May Your Holy Spirit constantly inspire and strengthen them. May they ever follow the example of Mary, mother of Our Lord, and imitate her fidelity, her humility, and her self-giving love. May all mothers receive Your Grace abundantly in this earthly life, and may they look forward to eternal joy in Your presence in the life to come.

From Fr David

Dear friends,

On this Mother's Day we wish all our mothers God's richest blessings! May this day be a special one of affection and gratitude, and for those whose mothers have gone before us now, a day of gentle memory.

This weekend we more formally conduct our third Charitable Works Fund Appeal for this financial year. This is the fund that finances all the resources from which all our wonderful catechists draw. Our, some 50 catechists visit 5 government schools in our parish bringing the Good News and sharing our Faith with some 600 Catholic children in the schools. They can only do this because of all the structure and resources supporting them. Your generosity to the Appeal which we conduct over 3 occasions each financial year directly assists them. It is our way of expressing our support and our gratitude to them. The Fund is also used to finance our chaplaincy program across the five major hospitals in our Diocese. It is of great assurance that when we need to go to hospital there will be a Catholic pastoral presence there for us. At each Mass this weekend we will have a short video presentation and one of our Catechists will briefly speak about the importance of the appeal to their ministry. So, if you are able, your generosity to this CWF Appeal is deeply appreciated. THANK YOU!

On Wednesday 12 July I travel to the Diocese of Ballarat in Victoria to present some talks to Priests and Principals over Thursday and Friday. The Diocese has recently incorporated its parish schools into a single diocesan entity, and I have been asked to provide some frameworks of how best to consider the ongoing relationship between parishes and schools. I return from Victoria on Friday, and Fr Joey Frez departs for the South for the second of his residential weekends in the Siloam program he is currently undertaking. This program is for the formation of spiritual directors.

Elisabeth Lee joins us on Saturday 15 May and Saturday 22 May to offer two days of retreat focussing on the Gospel accounts of meeting the Risen Christ. She will situate these reflections in the context of our current experience of COVID and our emergence from the pandemic. Even so, given developments in recent days, we recognise that we are still quite vulnerable to the virus. The Risen Christ meets us where we are, in all our uncertainty and with all our questions. What a wonderful opportunity, then, to reflect on this nature of our discipleship.

Do consider setting aside one or both Saturdays! It will be a great way to bring the Season of Easter to completion. Be sure to let the parish office know of your interest and registration. The cost is simply by donation.

The week of Monday 17 May to Sunday 23 May is Volunteers Week. We have so many volunteers giving our church and community such particular vibrancy. 


MOTHERHOOD OF MARY

As we celebrate Mother's Day this Sunday, let us not forget to make room in our homes and in our hearts for Mary our Heavenly Mother. Here in our parish, we have a weekly devotion to her under the title **OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP.** In 1866 Pope Pius IX entrusted the guardianship of

the original image of Our Mother of Perpetual Help to the Redemptorists and commissioned them to spread everywhere devotion to her and "MAKE HER KNOWN THROUGHOUT THE WORLD."

The picture of Our Mother of Perpetual Help is called an icon which is the Greek word for image. An icon tries to convey an idea to the mind rather than portray a resemblance for the eye. In an icon, everything has a meaning: the colours used, the lettering, the pose, every last detail. The Golden Crown placed on the original picture of Our Mother of Perpetual Help by order of the Holy See in 1867 is a token of the many miracles wrought by Mary invoked under that title. The Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help falls on 27 June.
