

#### From Fr David

#### Dear friends,

What a magnificent celebration we enjoyed last weekend with Lunar New Year—from our parish stall at the Chatswood Lunar New Year Festival, to the Lantern Parade in Chatswood in which our Indonesian community participated with such energy, through to our beautiful multi-lingual Mass on Sunday Morning celebrating the Presentation of the Lord ,and our joyful festivities on the church forecourt afterwards. Again, our profound gratitude to our parish Chinese Catholic Association under the leadership of Hannah Fong, along with the whole team of volunteers, for the extraordinary amount of work that went into the occasion. A special thank you to the Indonesian choir for singing with the Parish Choir for our 10.30am Mass. In our bulletin this week we showcase the energy of the day. Such celebrations are very important. They highlight the importance of culture in our life of faith. Our Catholic understanding of Revelation highlights that God comes to greet us in and through our culture, not apart from it. We might recall how Pope St John Paul II gave this very particular demonstration by the way in which, upon alighting from the plane, he would immediately kiss the ground of the country that he was visiting. It was a powerful gesture of the sacredness of the land and the culture he was visiting. We, too, honour the rich cultural diversity of our parish family and the many ways by which people encounter God

Our Lunar New Year celebration has also become a very significant means to raise funds for Pastoral Works Broken Bay which supports in particular the ministry of our parish catechists. #### FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / C

9 FEBRUARY 2025

I AM A SINNER. In today's Scripture readings the prophet Isaiah, the apostle Paul, and the apostle Peter each acknowledges that he is a sinner: 'I am a man of unclean lips,' cries Isaiah; 'I persecuted the Church of God,' confesses Paul; 'I am a sinful man,' says Peter. They know their need of forgiveness but they are also aware of the power of God at work in them. We too are sinners, but if we have faith in the grace of God working within us, we can be great missionaries as well.

And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boats to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### INTO THE DEEP

Today's Gospel powerfully illustrates the nature of discipleship and the role which Peter will play in Luke's writings, first in the Gospel and then in the early chapters of the Acts of the Apostles. Luke reworks the account in Mark's Gospel of the call of the first four disciples (Simon, Andrew, James and John (Mark 4:18-22) to focus on one—Peter. It is set within the context of Jesus' preaching from a boat to an enthusiastic crowd of listeners on the Galilean shore.

He invites Peter to move out into deep water to let out his nets for a catch. We learn that Peter and his companions have already tried to fish earlier, but without success. It is because of Jesus' word (literally, though the translation has "but if you say so") that Peter responds. Then, overwhelmed by the great catch of fish which almost sinks his boat, Peter recognises his utter unworthiness and sinfulness, in the presence of one so holy. Finally Peter, along with his colleagues, leaves everything to become Jesus' disciple.

There are several features of this unique story worthy of deeper reflection about discipleship and church life today: Peter's call comes from within his regular life; it is in response to Jesus' word and initiative; it is about the "catch", a metaphor for the missionary focus on the lives of human beings; it requires humility; it entails letting go of those things which separate the disciple from Jesus, including past failures; the call is not private or solitary but occurs with others.



### Honouring the Word of God in Liturgy

One of the primary ways in which the faithful honour God's Word in the liturgy is by faithfully listening to the proclamation of the readings and the homily, and by discerning the various ways in which God's Word applies to their lives. Within the liturgical celebration itself, the Church's General Instruc8on of the Roman Missal (2012) offers concrete guidelines for honouring God's Word at Mass. One most visual sign is proclaiming the Word from a dignified Lectionary or a specially decorated Book of the Gospels at the ambo (cf. GIRM 349). Holding the Book of the Gospels aloft during the entrance procession and carrying the Book from the Mass altar to the ambo during the singing of the Gospel Acclamation is a way of highlighting the Lord's Word to be proclaimed. Incensing the open Book of the Gospels and arranging servers to hold lighted candles on either side of the ambo are ways of reverencing the sacredness and light of Christ's presence during the proclaiming of the Gospel. As a sign of love for Christ and his message, the Book containing the Gospel reading is also kissed by the priest or deacon after the reading, like the altar which is venerated by the presiding celebrant at the beginning and end of Mass (cf. GIRM 123, 134, 169). Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter Aperuit Illis (30 September 2019) suggests that on Sunday of the Word of God, the book containing God's Word might be "enthroned" or given due honour in the church. It is a point also made in Benedict XVI's Apostolic Exhortation Verbum Domini (2010) n. 68, so the faithful can reflect upon God's Word. An important point to remember here is the Second Va:can Council's insight that Christ's presence is recognised in the actual "proclaiming" of the Word, when the Church believes that Christ is present and speaking to those assembled through the words of the Church's minister [Sacrosanctum concilium (1963) art. 7], rather than in the physical book itself.
