

To all our parish staff, servers, and singers, and in particular to Irene Cheung for her most creative and beautiful decoration of the sanctuary: thank you for enabling our Red Wednesday Mass to be as powerful. We thank Ben Thrum, too, for the great lighting effect both outside and inside our church. The event was the most attended since we have initiated it and we were delighted that the Armenian leader, Archbishop Narajian could join us for the occasion, too. So many stayed after on the forecourt enjoying the great supper. It was a very meaningful way by which to remember all those who are suffering for the Faith and who have died as martyrs.



A special word of gratitude to our Pius X students who have made us **garden beds for our new community garden.** These raised garden beds have been made from the timber of the old pews we removed from the northern transept. Our Pius X students will also be involved next year in the maintenance of the garden. From the garden, we look forward to several new opportunities in the coming year.

This Wednesday, 27 November, we welcome our many **volunteers to come together for Mass at 6.30pm** followed by celebratory refreshments on the Forecourt. This will be a little way to say a huge word of gratitude to so many of our community who gift us with such vibrancy and possibility.

We have nearly 40 people attending the **series of talks being offered by Bishop David Walker** each Saturday afternoon from 3pm on St Augustine and his Confessions. Bishop David will conclude the series next Saturday 30 November. All continue to be welcome to join.

This Sunday, the **Solemnity of Christ the King**, at our 10.30am Mass we have the joy of celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation with four of our parish family: Romina Alfaro, Matthew Zanon, Cathy Seng, and Rena Li. It is a wonderful sign of the Spirit's activity in our community.

And so, the liturgical year comes to its close this week. Next weekend, a new year begins as we commence the Season of Advent.

GOSPEL REFLECTION: WHAT HAVE YOU DONE?

This week I was really missing a friend of mine who passed away a few years ago when we were 28 years old, after a long battle with her mental health. I wish everyone on the planet could have met her, she was so incredibly kind, and funny, and one of the most compassionate people I've ever met. When she passed away, the first prayer I said was, "What have you done, Jesus?".

How could a life like this be taken? Why would you deprive the world of the goodness of this amazing person? Do you know what you've done to all of us that love her, Jesus?

I think in moments like these, we can relate to Pilate in today's Gospel. Pilate, the governor of a mighty empire, used to having the power to control outcomes, to shape the world around him, is suddenly faced with a man who doesn't fit into his neatly structured system. Pilate asks Jesus, "What have you done?" and he isn't asking just about the events that led to this trial. It's a question full of confusion, searching for some kind of explanation in a world that no longer makes sense to him.

How often do we find ourselves in Pilate's shoes? We're confronted with something—or someone—that challenges our understanding of the world, and we ask, "What have you done?". We ask, not because we're curious about the truth, but because we want to make sense of it, to bring it into terms we can control. We want to understand why bad things happen to good people, why suffering exists, why a life like my friend's was taken too soon. In a world where we feel powerless, we look for answers that bring us comfort, that make the pain and confusion easier to carry. We want to distance ourselves from the hard truths that Jesus stands before us with.

Pilate, too, is trying to distance himself. He asks, "What have you done?" because he doesn't know what to do with Jesus, a man who offers a kingdom that turns everything Pilate knows upside down.

Jesus doesn't answer Pilate's question the way he expects. He doesn't defend Himself or explain Himself. Instead, He speaks of a kingdom that isn't of this world—a kingdom of truth, not power. Pilate wants Jesus to fit into the systems he understands, but Jesus is beyond that. For Jesus, this moment is not about what is done, but who He is, where he is from, and where he belongs. The answer is Him.

In the midst of our confusion and sorrow, when we ask, "What have you done, Jesus?" we may not be asking because we want to know Him more deeply. Often, we're asking because we want answers that soothe our fears and doubts. But Jesus doesn't always give us the answers we want. Instead, He invites us into something greater—a relationship with Him, where He asks us a deeper question - the same question he asked Adam and Eve when they hid from him: "Where are you?".

So, as we reflect on Pilate's question, let us remember that Jesus isn't asking us to explain our actions or our pain. He's asking us "Where are you?". Where am I in relation to Him? Am I willing to step into the truth of His kingdom, to let His love transform me? Or do I, like Pilate, remain focused on what I think we can control, asking questions that keep Jesus at a distance?

The question "What have you done?" might be about trying to understand things, but Jesus' answer—through His very presence—invites us to something much deeper: to step into the truth He brings, to find peace not in answers, but in relationship with Him, the King of all the Universe.

Let's ask ourselves not just what Jesus has done, but where am I to His kingdom? In the face of confusion, grief, and suffering, where am I in relation to the love and truth that Jesus offers? Am I willing to let go of my need for control and allow myself to be drawn into His mystery, trusting that His love will meet me right where I am?

Reflecting on the Gospel:

- When you find yourself questioning Jesus in difficult times, what is it you're really asking? Are you seeking understanding, justification, or reassurance?
- Pilate struggled to decide what to do with Jesus. How do you discern what to do with Jesus in your own life?
- Jesus stood calm and unwavering before Pilate. How do you respond when your faith is challenged or questioned?





- Catherine is celebrated for her intelligence. Tradition holds that she converted 50 philosophers who were sent to debate her. Inspired by her wisdom, they embraced Christianity!
- The infamous "Catherine Wheel," a torture device named after her, actually broke when she touched it, according to legend. Her miraculous escape led to her becoming the patron saint of wheelwrights and mechanics.
- Her relics are said to have been discovered by monks on Mount Sinai, where angels are said to have carried her body. Her remains are housed in the monastery named after her.
- St Joan of Arc credited St Catherine as one of the voices that guided her during her mission to save France.
- The famous Monastery of St Catherine at the base of Mount Sinai was named in her honor. It's one of the oldest Christian monasteries still in use today.





BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

'BORN FOR THIS'

The apocalyptic messages of the last weeks now arrive at the climax of our liturgical year: it is the end! In the first reading Daniel regales us with the vision of 'one like the son of man' coming on the clouds of heaven. Our psalm response chants, 'The Lord is 'King'.

We are taken to the passion narrative of John's Gospel: 'Are you the King of the Jews?' It is Pilate who asks. In this moment Jesus speaks with the clarity of the truth: 'My kingdom is not from this world'. Questioned further, he declares, 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'

This short passage confirms what we already know that Jesus the Christ is 'the Word' who 'became flesh and lived among us, and we saw his glory, the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth.' (1:14). The 'I Am' statements in John's Gospel proclaim Jesus as 'the bread that came down from heaven' (6:41), 'the bread of life' (6:48), 'the living bread' (6:51), 'the light of the world' (8:12), 'the gate for the sheep' (10:7), 'the good shepherd' who lays his life down for his sheep (10:11), 'the resurrection and the life' (11:25), 'the way, the truth and the life' (14:6), 'the true vine' (15:1), 'the vine, and you are the branches' (15:5). This litany reveals the One in whom we believe and to whose voice we listen. Today we celebrate the One who was born for this.




