St Paul's Letter to the Ephesians: Over the next few weeks we have some fantastic scripture readings at Sunday Mass. From July 28th weeks we take a detour from the Gospel of Mark to hear chapter 6 of the Gospel of John.



This is the famous "I am the Bread of Life" discourse, which begins with the multiplication of loaves and fishes. This is a time when many people reflect on the Eucharist. However, this year I'll be looking at St Paul's Letter to the Ephesians which we read for 6 weeks starting last weekend. While the gospels narrate the events of Jesus' life, death and resurrection, St Paul's letters answer the question "What does the life, death and resurrection of Jesus mean?". St Paul's answer is that God's great plan of salvation is revealed in Christ, that we are become adopted children of God in Christ, and we become incorporated into the Church which is Christ's Body on earth which becomes the place of God's ongoing mission of salvation (the missio Dei) on earth.



Please come along to support Hien, and pray for him during his preparation.





The annual Peter's Pence Appeal 2024 for the Diocese of Broken Bay will be held in parishes on the weekend of 27-28 July. We are all encouraged to support the appeal and Pope Francis' mission from the proclamation of the Gospel for the promotion of development, education and peace.

Peter's Pence also aims to support a range of charities which bring aid and comfort to the poor, children,

families, the elderly, the marginalised, victims of war and natural disasters, refugees and migrants.

The practice of providing to those most in need and the work of evangelisation originates in the Holy Scriptures. In His public life, dedicated to the proclamation of the Good News, Jesus received material aid to support himself with the twelve Apostles and those in need.

Later, St Paul, in the Churches he founded, instituted the collection in support of the Mother Church of Jerusalem. As a donation to the Successor of Peter, Peter's Pence became more widespread from the seventh century. Today, support for the Holy Father's mission extends throughout the entire world, supporting numerous charitable works.

In his message for Peter's Pence 2024 Pope Francis said; "The hope that we have been given never divides us from others. Instead, it is an extraordinary gift of which we are called to make ourselves 'channels', with humility and simplicity, for everyone. So our boastfulness is because we have as Father a God who opens his house to all human beings, beginning with the least and the most distant, so that as his children we may learn to console and support one another."



Our parish is part of the 'Sydney Alliance,' through which we can participate in advancing the common good and achieving a fair, just, and sustainable city.

Reflection on the Sydney Alliance **Foundations Training by Jordan Abrahams**



Reflecting on the 'Sydney Alliance Foundations Training,' I enhanced my understanding of the mechanisms of policy and action. This training emphasised identifying power dynamics through discernment, research, planning, and the importance of storytelling in creating connections. These connections allowed me to meet individuals from diverse backgrounds.

One such story was Helen's, who, through her work in Darwin with Indigenous Australians, deeply engaged with the community, focusing on service and learning. Upon her recent return to Sydney, in her new role in Parramatta, Helen aims to apply her skills and faith to improve the lives of refugees and migrants who now call the community home. Hearing stories like Helen's gave me hope for the work different civil society groups do within the community.

It was inspiring to meet like-minded parish members and other dedicated individuals and organisations passionate about making a difference in the community and wider society. Hearing the passions of others and understanding how community networks and organising could better address 'wicked issues' such as concerns of affordable housing in a cost of living crisis, environmental concerns in sustainable living, or challenges of belonging through the story and struggles of refugees was enlightening.



Building teams and coalitions to transform private concerns into public action is crucial for a stronger and better community. It was rewarding to attend on the parish's behalf with other incredible individuals. It allowed me to create meaningful connections and listen to impactful stories, giving faces to issues that affect our community.

One particularly impactful story was Deb's, which shed light on the struggles of vulnerable women in Sydney's CBD. Her work helps those facing complex circumstances, such as homelessness or domestic violence, to increase belonging, safety, and choice for women at risk of marginalisation. This story deepened my understanding of often-overlooked problems and inspired me to apply to volunteer at the corresponding legal centre.

I encourage community members to listen and share important burdens. By uniting around shared public concerns, we can become impactful leaders. Addressing the tension between private and public spheres helps us understand our legacy and place in the world as Stewards of Creation and Messengers of the Word of God. ~ Jordan
