Late for Mass? We've all been there. You're almost out the door (or already in the car) and your child decides that now is the time they really need to go to the bathroom. Or a car accident causes a traffic jam that backs up your street. These unexpected events might cause us to be late for Mass from time to time.

However, increasingly, and not just in our parish, a majority of people are late to Mass most of the time. This suggests a constellation of obstacles both organisation and attitudinal. Traffic and carparking are constants which we take into account when planning to get to an event we consider important. How important is Mass to me?

If it's important that I give an hour of worship to God each week, then let's make it a full hour, and a good hour, where I arrive not just on time (for the first word of the first hymn), but a few minutes early so that I can both greet my fellow parishioners, and have a few minutes of quiet prayer to prepare myself.

If you're not already doing this, then perhaps this might be the best and most fruitful Lenten commitment you could make this year. To give God and worship of God the extra few minutes it takes to make it a priority for the six weeks of Lent, which might be enough to kick start a long term good habit.



Hello, dear friends. Seminarian Matthew here. As you now know, this year I'll be here with you in this great parish of Epping-Carlingford, as I continue my journey towards priesthood.

You know, I was only a small boy when I first served up on the altar. I still remem-

ber the lessons from my parish priest – everything from how to genuflect on the correct knee, ringing the bells at the right (and wrong) time, getting drenched by the holy water asperges, and competing with my brother to make the fewest mistakes possible.

Only later did I begin to appreciate the beauty, truth and goodness contained in the Mass.
