

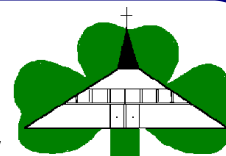

TODAY IS ABORIGINAL & TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY

This year's theme is: **BECAUSE OF HER ... WE CAN** celebrating the strength of women, and our Mother Mary as inspiration. Broome resident Erica Bernard sees lots of similarities in her Catholic faith and her Yawuru/Gidja spirituality. Erica is the Community Liaison Officer for the Broome Catholic Education Office and below she shares how Our Lady is reflected in the many strong women in her life. **BECAUSE OF YOU MY FAITH IS STRONG**

'Because of Her, we can' is this year's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday theme. So, I find myself reflecting on what that means to me, as an Aboriginal Catholic woman. While sitting at the grotto of Our Lady Queen of Peace Cathedral in Broome with my Mimi Cissy, [my grandfather's sister] I asked her what should I write, she sat there for a moment and said well it should all start with her, pointing to Our Lady. On this day, we were getting ready to pray to her for the loss of a family member and as always in my home town of Broome, every family gathers to say the rosary when someone dies, for an anniversary or when someone needs our prayers. This led me to see how Our Lady is reflected in my mothers, grandmothers, aunties, sisters, cousins, daughters and nieces, all the women in my life.

It brings to mind the Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the announcement by the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary that she would conceive a son through the power of the Holy Spirit and he shall be called Jesus Christ (Luke 1:26-38); for her to bear a child that will grow into a man that will die for me. Which brings to mind a story I have heard a few times about a group of women in a remote community wanting a statue of Our Lady and coming to the consensus that they would choose the Pieta, Michelangelo's statue of the Blessed Mother with the broken body of her son which lay across her lap, nursed in her arms. The amount of tragic circumstances that many of our mothers / grandmothers go through in losing a child is so evident in my family and communities on a daily basis, but as I look at my mothers, aunties, grandmothers and wonder what is it that holds them together, I see their devotion of love and prayer to Our Lady and to her son Jesus, and through prayer is where they connect and get their strength to keep going, keep living. For every day that I will rise I'll pray that the Lord will grace me with his presence to do God's will, to set an example through my actions in what I do and all that I am, for my children and my people. And that 'Because of her...'Mary Our Mother, I know I can...'

FAST FACTS IMPACTS OF DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE

Domestic and sexual violence is a major health and welfare issue.

HOMELESSNESS **IPV IMPACT** **HOSPITALISATION**

72,000 WOMEN, 34,000 CHILDREN, 9,000 MEN sought homelessness services in 2016-17 due to domestic violence. (AIHW, 2017)

Intimate partner violence is the GREATEST HEALTH RISK FACTOR (greater than smoking, alcohol & obesity) for women aged 25-44. (Ayre et al, 2015)

8 women a day are hospitalised after being assaulted by their spouse or partner. (CAHW, 2018)

1 in 12 women hospitalised for partner violence were pregnant. (AIHW, 2018)

DOMESTIC HOMICIDE **CHILDREN'S EXPERIENCE OF ABUSE**

1 woman a week was killed by a current or former partner in the 2 years from 2012-15 to 2015-16. One-quarter of homicide incidents are due to a current or former partner. (Brown & Brooker, 2017)

1 in 6 women, 1 in 9 men were physically and/or sexually abused before the age of 15. (ABS, 2017)

Women who, as children, witnessed partner violence against their parent were more than twice as likely to be subjected to partner violence themselves. (Cotton & Walker, 2016)

EXPERIENCE & RISK

Groups at greater risk of domestic and sexual violence: INDIGENOUS WOMEN, YOUNG WOMEN, PREGNANT WOMEN, WOMEN SEPARATING FROM THEIR PARTNERS, WOMEN WITH DISABILITY, WOMEN EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL HARDSHIP. (AIHW, 2018)

54% of women who had experienced current partner violence experienced more than one violent incident. (ABS, 2017)

Women who are about to, or who have recently ended a relationship are at greater risk of experiencing violence. (Baker et al, 2010; Phibbs et al, 2010; Kim & Gray 2008)

BISHOP PETER SPEAKS ON DOMESTIC & SEXUAL VIOLENCE

"As Church, the living body of Christ, we cannot remain silent. We must collectively and personally denounce a violence which erodes the human person in every way. We must work to build communities of peace, safety, true reconciliation, and relationships that seek alternatives to violence. Pope Francis tells

"if violence has its source in the human heart, then it is fundamental that non-violence be practised before all else within families ..."
"I encourage you to do whatever you can to act on this issue. Do not be a bystander. Find out now what you can do to help those who are suffering in silence within your community."

To assist, our Diocese has issued a kit with vital information on understanding the cycle and the impact of violence, which provides help numbers and a prayer to end domestic violence. Please check our website for the full kit, a limited number of which are at our foyer.
