

GRACED CONVERSATIONS

Bishop David came and talked about trust, trust in self and the negative implications that can come of trust in self above trust in God.

Bishop David went on, using various passages from the Bible like The Prodigal Son and Pharisees and the publican, The Servant in the field and Mary and Martha. In each case, the person doing the work is depicted as someone with pride; someone who trusted themselves above others.

Bishop David went on to talk about Luke 14:11; 18:14; "All who exalt themselves become humbled, but all that humble themselves will be exalted".

And then there is the quote from CS Lewis;

"A proud man is always looking down on things and people; and, of course, as long as you looking down, you cannot see something that is above you."

An Oriental Saying:

The mountain lords it over the molehill, but the stars dwarf both.

Bishop David pointed out the meaning of the saying. If you take the mountain as the reference point, the distance between the top of the mountain and the molehill seems great. But, if you take the stars as the point of reference; the distance between the molehill and the mountain is as nothing. So, here we can picture ourselves as the top of the mountain and God as the stars. We may be able to do some things better than others, but in comparison to God, we are as nothing.

Consequences of trust in self above trust in God.

Trust in self leads to pride in self.

In summary, we should consider the consequences of trust in ourselves rather than faith and trust in our Lord. A genuinely thought-provoking talk, from a genuinely humble and gentle man.

I am sure all us in attendance went away with a full tummy and full heart, contemplating the greatness of God compared to ourselves.



"My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to

stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours."

'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

The gospel paints a picture of radical reversals. The man who during life was treated as a castoff enjoys the bliss of heaven, while the one who savoured the pleasures that life had to give ends up in great torment in the netherworld. Why is Lazarus rewarded while the rich man suffers? The answer is found in the understanding of covenant responsibility. Both men are somehow associated with Abraham and therefore belong to the people of Israel. The rich man was indifferent to the needs of the covenant brother who lay at his gate. When he asked that Lazarus be sent to warn his brothers to change their way of life (metánoia), he was told that they had the religious tradition that clearly charges the wealthy to meet the needs of the poor. If they were not attentive to that tradition, they would not heed a resurrected Lazarus.
