THE SEASON OF ADVENT

A Time of Hope, Joy and Promise Advent is a time of reflection cycle of the Liturgical Year and promise. It opens up a new and turns our minds to prepare for the coming of the Lord, not only the birth of Christ but his coming at the end of all time. In this season the prophets offer us a vision of the future and us to look at our lives and recognise our need for God. John the Baptist challenges us, pointing to the anointed one and his promise of a kingdom of justice and peace. In the final week, Mary, the pregnant mother, is presented as the of discipleship. This time of preparation is like no other; its tone is one of joyful expectation which springs from our desire be ready to meet Christ when he comes. Advent, then, a time of hope, joy and promise. Advent provides us with assurance that Christ will indeed come again. We are the also reminded that the renewal of the world has already begun. Christ is among us now; we are already a redeemed people. The Church lives between Christ's coming in the flesh and his cosmic presence at the end of time. Advent brings into focus that we our lives working towards a kingdom of a new heaven and a new earth and await the final coming of Christ in glory. The twofold character of Advent helps us to prepare not only for the coming of Christ at Christmas but also this second coming of Christ. It will be at a time that we do not know or expect. As people of faith we possess hope but we do not always see it. Our lives must be lived in readiness. Advent and the Liturgical YearAs we begin the new A Cycle of the Liturgical Year, the four weeks of Advent focus us on the coming of the Lord. We ponder not only the incarnation but also the end of the world. We mindful that these two events frame the whole mystery of Christ: his coming among us, his death and resurrection into glory. More than a timeline of monthly observances, the seasons of the Liturgical Year are expressions of this central mystery of our faith in Christ Jesus.

- Advent celebrates the promise of Christ's coming again for all time God's time is eternal



The liturgical seasons provide a human context for a reflection on these mysteries in all their richness. Advent is an important expression of aspects of this mystery. It is of note that the emphasis at the beginning of Advent on the second coming has already been evident in the weeks leading up to Advent. The last Sundays of Ordinary Time are associated with Christ's coming at the end of time, culminating in the Solemnity of Christ the Universal King. Blessing of an Advent WreathThe Book of Blessings is a collection of more than 70 ritual prayers that are suitable for a variety of needs and occasions. In these rites all aspects of life are made holy and directed to the glory of God, for God is the source of all goodness. Chapter 47 of the Book of Blessings contains the Rite of Blessing of an Advent Wreath. It can take place during Mass, within a celebration of the Word, or as a stand alone short rite. Visit LiturgyHelp to view the Book of Blessings. The Time of AdventThe time of Advent is the four week period of preparation for the season of Christmas. Advent begins the cycle of the Liturgical Year and focuses on the coming of the Lord. The first weeks offer a vision of the future, looking to the end of time when Christ will come again. The final weeks point more specifically to the birth of Christ. Christ, the promised one, is awaited with joyful expectation. The First Sunday of Advent follows the final Sunday of Ordinary Time and the season concludes on Christmas Eve. Special considerations for Sunday Masses in Advent include the advent wreath and lighting of the candles each week and also the omission of the Gloria.

CATECHIST CORNER

Our catechist team has had a hectic week with combined Christmas Assemblies at five of the State schools in our Parish area. On these occasions, all students enrolled in Special Religious Education (SRE), Catholic and Protestant alike, come together to celebrate the occasion. There will be three more Assemblies next week in the Mountains area and then it will be the end of SRE lessons for the 2019 year.

It is a delight watching the children respond to the various portrayals of the Christmas story. This year there were three different approaches. At two schools, Y9 students from St Phillips Christian College lead the Assembly with a Nativity play, a "true/false" game and carols. At another two schools, two presenters from Quiz Worx Kids' Ministry delivered the message "Jesus is a real person who lived in a real time, in a real place, for a real reason". And finally, at the other schools, the SRE teachers and children themselves organized and participated in the Assembly with Bible readings, video clips, carols and group prayer.

DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS!

Another calendar year is fast coming to a close, and as a Church we begin our new liturgical year with the start of Advent. I invite you at this time to take a moment to reflect on the past year, and also to open yourselves to new possibilities in both your personal spiritual life, as well as our common spiritual life as a parish.

Each year that I am here as parish priest I would like to provide some universal guidance for this important reflection by introducing a new annual theme. When I arrived to the parish in February, I announced a Year of Trust. Over the last few months, we have had a special opportunity to reflect on, learn and renew our trust in God, in the Church and in others that are around us. We hosted different priests and guest speakers to help us further our understanding of trust. In almost every parish bulletin we have had a reflection or a prayer for trust. Year of Trust candles with a beautiful prayer for trust attached were available to purchase and take to our homes and share with others. Those of us who wanted to use this opportunity to reflect on Trust had many opportunities to do so. It is my hope that this year of trust helped many of you to trust more than before and to open your hearts for the next step in your spiritual life.

As we continue our faith journey together at St Patrick's community I would like to announce a different theme for this new liturgical year which we begin today! The next step after we learn how to trust is to love. This is why, together with the parish pastoral council, I have decided to launch the YEAR OF LOVE in our parish!

The theme for this year will be based on a fragment of 1 John 4:7 "Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loves is born of God, and knows God."

In the YEAR OF LOVE I would like to invite all of us to reflect on love in the same way as we did with trust. We will reflect on how to love God, His Church and one another. This will be an opportunity for different generations in our community to reflect on love, to learn how to love with a pure heart and how to renew our love. During this year I will once again invite different guest speakers and in the parish bulletin we will have a different reflections and prayers for love. We will also organise different events and prayer times to help us all better understand love as well.

Love is not all hearts and flowers or what is presented in a sappy romantic film, Pope Francis said.

- "Love is something else. Love is taking responsibility for others."
- "Love isn't playing violins, all romantic," the pope said in his homily at Mass. "No. Love is work."
- "Do I remain in the Lord's love? Or do I leave it, seeking other things, forms of fun, other ways of leading my life?" the pope told them to ask. "To remain in his love is to do what Jesus did for us. He gave his life for us. He was our servant; he came to serve. The love Christians are called to show others is not something that should be occasional "but must be a constant in our existence."
- "This is why we are called, for example, to care for the elderly as a precious treasure and with love, even if they create economic problems and difficulties. But we must care for them... This is why we must give every assistance possible to the sick, even at the last stages. This is why the unborn always must be welcomed."
- "Life always must be safeguarded and loved from conception to its natural end... This is love."

With this short reflection of Pope Francis I would like to encourage you to start this journey of love together so we as St Patrick's Parish community will grow in our understanding of love and share it with one another. I would also like to invite the three local schools, St Joseph's, St Edward's and St Patrick's, to join us and reflect on love together, building a whole community in our area founded on Christ who is love, and learn from him how to share and reach out with love to others in our parish and school communities.

Let us pray together that we all will be filled with God's love and will share it with one other!

SALVATORIAN FOUNDATION DAY ANNIVERSARY

FOUNDED 8TH DECEMBER 1881

- 1881 Father Francis Jordan founded the Salvatorians (formerly Apostolic Teaching Society) in Rome.
- 1888 Mother Mary of the Apostles (now Blessed) co-founded the Sisters branch of the Salvatorians in Tivoli, Italy near Rome.
- 1914 The Society of the Divine Savior celebrated the first international congregation.

Stay awake, you must be ready.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The first reading of the first Sunday of this liturgical year contains a vision of universal peace and an invitation to participate in that peace by fidelity to the word of God. This vision of the future describes the eschatological age of complete faithfulness to God and the peace and harmony among people that will flow from it. Although the peace depicted here can come only from God, people do in fact play a very important role in its advent. Because this eschatological age has not yet come in its

fullness, this vision is a promise, and an invitation that will continue to be relevant to each succeeding generation.

The responsorial psalm, a song of Zion, is an individual hymn of joy and praise of one who had the opportunity to go to the temple in Jerusalem. The city was built on Mount Zion, a hill that towered above much of the neighbouring low-lying terrain. This not only gave it a vantage point from which one could to survey the surrounding territory, an important asset in case of possible attack, but its height enabled it to be seen from a distance, thus creating the impression of watchfulness and protection. Peace, as spoken of here, incorporates more than the absence of war or strife. It includes prosperity, well-being, and completeness. It is for this peace that the psalmist requests prayer.

Paul speaks about the decisive time of fulfilment, the kairós, the period of transition from the present age of sin to the long-awaited age of fulfilment. He employs several images to characterise this division of time: 'this age' is like slumber, or night and darkness; 'the age to come' is like wakefulness, or day and light. The statement 'already but not yet' acknowledges that the age of fulfilment has already dawned, but it has not yet been brought to completion. The new life that Christians are called to live is characterised as putting on clothing - armour, because they face spiritual warfare. To 'put on the Lord Jesus Christ' means to become identified with him.

The gospel reading is a lesson on the character of the parousía or future coming of the Son of Man. It addresses the sudden nature of this imminent time of fulfilment and of the need to be ready at all times for its dawning. In order to explain this, Jesus draws an analogy with one of the stories of ancient Jewish tradition, and then sketches two very ordinary experiences of life as demonstrations. He concludes with a kind of parable that teaches a lesson. All of these teaching devices follow the same twofold pattern: 1) the people had no idea of what was in store for them; 2) calamity befell them because they were unprepared. The message here is clear: 'Stay awake!' 'Be prepared!'
