RCIA RITE OF ELECTION AT THE CATHEDRAL TODAY

The Rite of Election is for our Catechumens, those who have not been baptised previously, to be presented to Bishop Anthony at the Cathedral today, Sunday March 1. Once this has taken place they are no longer called catechumens but the Elect,

STATIONS OF THE CROSS DURING LENT

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE FOR THE DIOCESE

Given the continuing level of public concern about the coronavirus, but in light of the fact that the virus is currently contained in Australia, Bishop Anthony instructs that the principles outlined at the end of January, be maintained in the Diocese of Broken Bay until the end March 2020.

The situation will be constantly monitored and his instruction reviewed should changing circumstance necessitate.

Summary of the principles:

- 1. The chalice is not to be shared at any Masses but is to be reserved to the Celebrant(s) only.
- 2. All Ministers of Communion (Ordinary and Extraordinary) are to be diligent in the use of hand sanitizer prior to the distribution of Communion.
- 3. These measures are to be publicly and clearly communicated to all congregations at Mass.

POSITION'S VACANT: YOUTH MINISTER: 5.5 HOURS PER WEEK

An exciting opportunity has arisen to become part of the vibrant team at the Catholic Parish of Gosford.

The Youth Minister aims to uphold the following goal for Youth Ministry in the Parish of Gosford – 'To develop and maintain a young Catholic community of disciples that really lives the Gospel'. The Youth Minister will work under the leadership of the Parish priest and with other parish staff and leaders, and will be responsible for the youth programs and events in the parish.

Personal attributes:

It is vital that the Youth Minister:

- has a deep faith and a strong relationship with Jesus.
- demonstrates love in serving others through this ministry.
- engages the young people of our parish community
- is highly motivated and pro-active in leadership skills
- can work effectively in a team and can work well with adults and students.

Classification: Casual Sunday Nights: 5.5 hours.

Qualifications (Education/ Background)

- Tertiary or certificate qualification in comparable field of study is recommended.
- Applicants who are currently undertaking study will be considered.
- Completed Higher School Certificate or equivalent is necessary.
- A good knowledge in theology would be an advantage.
- Must have good on-line communication skills (facebook, twitter, youtube)
- Any experience in marketing or advertising would be advantageous.

Responsibilities

The Youth Minister would be responsible:

- to manage and run Sunday night youth group sessions.
- to manage and run the various ministries at the Sunday evening Youth Mass [readers, welcomers, offertory etc]
- to identify, train and mentor other young leaders from the parish to assist with the running of youth groups and other activities.
- manage a database of all youth contacts, parents and older students.
- provide duty of care pastoral care
- prepare forms, permission notes and sign in sheets and other forms for youth groups.
- manage online communication and advertising via facebook, twitter, youtube of photos and video footage from youth groups.
- manage fundraising activities for youth projects in the parish.

The Youth Minister is required to work under the direction of the Parish Priest. After six months there will be a review of the work undertaken, conducted by the Parish Priest.

The Youth Minister will take on a leadership role as part of the team at Gosford Parish and must act at all times as a representative of the Parish, displaying care, responsibility and integrity in all that they do.

Interested applicants are invited to write a cover letter of interest outlining why they would be suitable for this role. Particular reference must be made to the 5 personal attributes [mentioned above] and how the applicant demonstrates these qualities.

The successful applicant will require Working With Children Check (WWCC) verification.

A reading from the book of Genesis

Creation of our first parents, and sin.

The Lord God fashioned man of dust from the soil. Then he breathed into his nostrils a breath of life, and thus man became a living being.

The Lord God planted a garden in Eden which is in the east, and there he put the man he had fashioned. The Lord God caused to spring up from the soil every kind of tree, enticing to look at and good to eat, with the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

The first reading features three episodes: the creation of the first man; his placement in the garden; and the sin. The man is formed of the ground, as are the animals and the trees of the garden. This establishes from the beginning a physical bond between humans and other creatures of the earth. The story is filled with allusions to wisdom. Eden is in the East, the place of enlightenment because the sun rises there. The tree of temptation is the tree of knowledge. The sin was disobedience, but the inclination that gave rise to it was a form of hubris – the desire to know like the gods know.

psalm response is a familiar penitential psalm. It includes a plea for mercy, a confession of sin, a prayer for transformation, and a request for the opportunity of praising God. The psalmist appeals to God's covenant dispositions: goodness and compassion or womb-love, the kind of attachment that a mother has to the child she has carried within herself. A thorough transformation is required and so the psalmist prays for a clean heart and a right or true spirit. The response ends with a prayer to be empowered to praise God. This request shows that the covenant relationship, forgiveness of sin, transformation of heart, and the ability to praise God are all gifts of grace from God.

Paul sets up a comparison between the universal effects of sin and death and the all-encompassing power of forgiveness and life. He contrasts the actions of Adam the first man and Christ his unrivalled counterpart. While it may appear that the contrast is between Adam and Christ, it is really between the epochs that each inaugurated. Adam inaugurated the era of sin and death; Christ established the eschatological era of acquittal and life. At each stage of Paul's comparison, we see the surpassing power of the salvation won by Christ. In his conclusion, Paul argues that as condemnation came through one sin, acquittal comes through one righteous act; disobedience brought death, obedience brought life.

The Gospel passage is an account of the temptation of Jesus. Jesus' responses to the temptations posed by the devil all come from Deuteronomy's version of Israel's testing in the wilderness. This suggests that Jesus is here being compared with that ancient community. This account is replete with messianic meaning. It shows that the Son of God has chosen not to use divine power to establish his reign on earth. He will be open to the word of God, allowing it
