

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we all know, we are living in unprecedented times with the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Today I would like to ask you to reflect upon this time of the pandemic and to trust that God is always present to us in our parish, in our community and in our homes among our families, even though our local church and all churches across Australia are in lock down and unable to hold public celebrations. From gathering in our local church we now need to move towards gathering together as family units - our family churches - where we can further build our love for God and for our neighbours, especially in this Year of Love in our parish. Our love for God has really been put to a test during this time as we are afraid of what is happening around the whole world. But I strongly believe that after this crisis is over we will be renewed and strengthened in our faith and love.

The our church building in Gosford is closed, but our faith and love for God is still alive and open for worshiping Him in our hearts. This current situation is like a retreat for us. Especially as this is the season of Lent, it is a time to reflect even more closely on the gift of the Holy Eucharist which we can't receive for a while. I believe that our current fasting from receiving Holy Communion and not attending Masses will help us all to better understand the importance of the Holy Eucharist in our lives.

I know that for many of you it is very difficult to accept some of the decisions of our government and Church leaders, but these are necessary to make sure that we are all safe. Please pray for each other but especially for those who are struggling to cope with the current situation and decisions. Please look after those of our parishioners who are lonely and sick - it is very important to make sure that we support each other.



Together with Deacon Paul and our parish staff, we are working hard to make sure that you are provided with spiritual nourishment in whatever ways we can. As you may be aware, we began live-streaming Masses, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the rosary (we were the first parish in the diocese to do this!). The church is closed but the mission of our parish is still very vibrant and has kept all of us very busy.

Our Staff are prayerfully monitoring this fluid situation and will continue to be in communication with you in the coming weeks. Your spiritual life and personal health are a priority. Thank you for your prayerfulness, patience and dedication. We may not see each other every day but may we meet each day in our prayers.

We miss you and are keeping you all in our hearts and prayers



MASS OFFERINGS FOR THE INTENTIONS OR SOULS OF OUR LOVED ONES

Please know that you may still have a Mass said for your loved one simply by either dropping the envelope into the parish [via the letterbox under the window] or contacting the parish office where your intention will be recorded, and you may make your donation over the phone. We know that it is very important for some to have these Masses offered and we will do our very best to ensure that this will remain in place for you.

AM I ABLE TO STILL RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION?

As you all are aware, the church building has to be closed and as such we cannot offer this sacrament in that environment. However, we do ask you to contact the Parish Office to discuss the opportunity to make an appointment to receive this sacrament within the boundaries of the restrictions placed on all the people of Australia.

SACRAMENT OF 1ST RECONCILIATION FOR THE CHILDREN:

The children completed their third of four lessons but sadly the restrictions came in when they were on the precipice of receiving the sacrament and we have now suspended the programme until restrictions are lifted.

AM I ABLE TO RECEIVE THE BLESSING OF THE SICK?

This is only available for people who are sick and at the end of their life. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for Father to give the blessing.

WHAT CAN I DO NOW I AM NOT ABLE TO RECEIVE THE EUCHARIST?

We understand how hard this for everyone and encourage you to recite this prayer daily.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN ON PALM SUNDAY AND AT EASTER

 Firstly, Fr Greg will bless palms and they will be available from a basket at the Mural garden area outside of the Parish Office. If you wish to have one and could collect it when you are out for your walk, then you are welcome to take one. We ask you to please bring your hand sanitiser and clean your hands before and after taking a palm.

We may have need of a few more palms, it's hard for us to determine the number required, so if you have a palm tree that could use a little trim, please let us know.

- 2. Our Curia has advised that a decision is yet to be made whether the Mass of the Oils will be live streamed or cancelled until a later time.
- Our Curia has yet to make a decision about the best way to approach the services of the Triduum but you can be certain that if we are given approval our services will be livestreamed and that we will send you resources for your own private prayer.

At the moment, the answer to that is 'YES'; however, how long that will continue we can only guess but we certainly will be in touch when we know.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

I am the resurrection and the life.

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life.

If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me

will never die.

Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.' Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb:

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

Ezekiel uses bodily resurrection as a metaphor of the re-establishment of the nation after its exile in a foreign land. The restoration envisioned is likened to creation. In the beginning, the creature that had been formed from the dust of the ground became a living being when God breathed the breath of life into it. Here, those in the grave live again when they are raised from the dust of death and are given God's own spirit. Both original creation and this resurrection from the dead are unconditional gifts from a magnanimous God. The passage absolute testifies to God's and unconditional control over the powers of life and death, destruction and restoration.

The psalm response comes from one of the Penitential Psalms. It opens with a cry for relief, which is followed by an acknowledgment of the helplessness of sinful human beings, a confession of faith and an acknowledgment of God's covenant love. The psalmist contrasts

two ways of understanding God's manner of dealing with sinners: retributive justice and compassion. Were God ever to mete out the exact punishments that human sin deserves, no one would be able to endure it. Instead, God shows mercy to sinners and grants them forgiveness. God's willingness to redeem Israel from all its sins is the basis of the psalmist's own trust in God's graciousness.

Paul contrasts two ways of living: life in the flesh and life in the spirit. When Paul refers to the flesh, he is speaking of human nature in all of its limitations which sometimes incline one away from God and the things of God. On the other hand, life in the spirit is attuned to God. Paul's **ANNIVERSARIES**: denunciation of life in the flesh is unqualified. Such a Denis Brennan, Ric Comensoli, George Goudie. life-direction cannot please God. Life in the spirit, on the other hand, is a form of union with God. He assures the **REMEMBRANCES:** Christians that they are in the spirit, if the Spirit of God dwells within them. The real point of this passage is the resurrection of those who are in union with God. The Spirit of God who raised Jesus will raise those who here and now live in the Spirit of Christ.

The death and resurrection of Lazarus proleptically point to Jesus' death and resurrection. Jesus' discussion with his disciples prepare for his instruction of Martha. She had hoped that Jesus would heal her brother. She had no idea that he would bring Lazarus back from the dead. Her response to Jesus' assurance that Lazarus will rise, shows that she shared the Pharisees' view of a general resurrection and judgment at the end of time. Jesus proclaimed that he is the resurrection and the life, and faith in him will guarantee life for others. Martha may not have known that Jesus is about to accomplish the impossible, but her faith and trust in him were secure.

Dianne Bergant CSA was a Professor of Biblical Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where she taught from 1978 to 2014. She holds a BS in Elementary Education from Marian College, Fond du Lac, WI; an MA and PhD in Biblical Languages and Literature from St Louis University. Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible Today (1979-2005), Biblical Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and abroad and has written numerous books, articles and chapters in books.
