


THE EXTENT OF GOD'S LOVE.

In the gospel reading, the extent of God's love is drawn in bold lines in two different ways. The first is the scope of divine love; the second is the price that God is willing to pay because of that love. The author maintains that God's love for the world is so deep and so magnanimous that nothing is spared for the world's salvation, not even God's only Son. God gave/sent this Son first in the incarnation and again in his saving death. This Son was truly a gift from God. However, the Son had a sacred, all-encompassing mission to perform. The world, though created good, often stands in opposition to God and, consequently, is in need of being saved. It is this sinful world that God loved (v.16); it is into this sinful world that God's only Son was sent (v.17).

Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible Today (1979-2005), Biblical Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and abroad and has written numerous books, articles and chapters in books.

Firstly may we thank those of you who converted to a monthly debit against their credit card [or debit card with a Visa or Mastercard facility] to support the church either [or both] in the 1st and 2nd collections as it has been a massive help during these lean times. At the same time we also thank those who have either credited the Church Account or dropped in their giving at the office. You have helped us survive!

HOW YOU CAN HELP NOW

As this financial year comes to an end and our delivery of new planned giving envelope packets arrives it would be very helpful to know if those who converted to a monthly direct debit would like to stay in that system thereby eliminating the issue of envelopes, and whether others may like to convert to giving via direct debit.

The advantage to the parish of giving in this manner is that it is easier to budget against a known contribution so we would ask for your serious consideration of giving via this method.

2ND COLLECTION

- Budgeting for depreciation and potential projects, repairs and maintenance.
- Church supplies [wine, church ware etc]
- Pastoral programmes [Adult Faith Education, Youth, Young Adults etc]
- > Repairs & Maintenance to the buildings in the complex [church, Parish Office, Jordan Room, Monastery Building, Patrick Terrace, grounds surrounding all buildings]
- > Staff Wages inclusive of Superannuation etc
- Support of the clergy [cars and relevant expenses, accommodation etc]

Attached to the bulletin you will find a form which we'd ask you to complete and submit [emailing is perfectly acceptable] to direct us to either enrol you in our planned giving programme or if you're already in it, to indicate the method of giving and the amount of weekly or monthly donation.

As you have read, the parish relies on your support and whilst we will do all we can to apply for grants for major projects [e.g. the carpet which was an incredible win] we ask you to consider a level giving that is both comfortable for you and beneficial for your parish.

NEW TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

'God loved the world so much he gave his only Son.'

As a child I learnt about the Trinity in terms of three persons in one God - a short summary of a very complex history of debate about God, Jesus and Spirit. John's Gospel says this with much greater simplicity in the one word 'love'. Too often the language of 'trinity' begins to sound mathematical: three in one, one in three. Trinity is a way of trying to put words on an unfathomable mystery of the inner life of God. A life we could never have imagined, A reading from the second letter of St except it was first experienced. Within Judaism, there were a number of ways of naming the Holy One – Elohim, the generic term for God; YHWH the personal name and experience of God in Israel. The ancient writers of Israel constantly struggled to name the paradox of a God who was utterly transcendent, and yet a God who was present to them. To maintain the sense of God's transcendence, when they spoke of the immanent experience of God various groups used different words. The Prophets said, 'The Word of the Lord came to me,' and 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me'. The wisdom teachers spoke of Holy Wisdom being present in the order and elegance of the natural world as well as in human history. Later the rabbis used an Aramaic word 'Shekinah' as a way of speaking of the presence of God within the cosmos. The life of Jesus of Nazareth and his ongoing risen life within the Christian community stretched the theological concepts and

language of Israel to find a new way of naming God. Trinity is the distinctively Christian way of naming our experience of God as a communion of life and love.

The very nature of God is to love - to reach out to another in relationship. In this conversation with Nicodemus Jesus describes why he has come into the world (Greek: kosmos); for love of this extraordinary cosmos God gave us a most precious gift in Jesus. John's Gospel makes the promise that those who receive this gift in faith will become children of God (John 1:12) which is this Gospel's way of describing salvation. This means of course that you and I are invited to be drawn into the very heart of God, to be drawn into the Trinity as part of God's own household.

Earlier in the conversation Jesus spoke to Nicodemus about being born again in water and Spirit - a phrase Nicodemus could not understand. The Johannine community understood that with the gift of the Spirit they were in a sense reborn into a new quality of life. John calls this eternity life, which is a way of naming the life God lives in eternity. I use the translation 'eternity' life, rather than 'eternal' life to convey the concept that we are reborn not into ordinary human life that goes on forever, but into a new way of existence. We are born into the family of God, able to call God 'Father' and each other sisters and brothers. In the first reading, this is what Moses begs for when he asks, 'adopt us as your heritage'. If you want a living example of the Trinity look at a family where children participate in the life and love of their parents.

Today, as we celebrate the feast of the Trinity, we are not celebrating an esoteric doctrine from the past; we are celebrating One who is a dynamic relationship inviting us to be participants in this dynamism.


