

CATECHIST CORNER

Special Religious Education (SRE or Scripture) is resuming over the next three weeks in the State schools in our Parish. Praise the Lord! Unfortunately, some of our dedicated catechists are unable to resume teaching due to the "COVID environment" and their health status. We are inviting parishioners to join the team to fill in during Term 3, or for the rest of the year. A Working with Children Check and some mandatory training (Child Protection in particular) would be required. Pre-prepared lessons that are age-appropriate and easy to use will be supplied. It's as simple as clicking through a PowerPoint. Classes are about 30mins duration each week. Grab a yellow catechist flyer at the Church doors and talk to a catechist after Mass. Or call Alain (0414273654) for more details.

COVID UPDATE

Late last night the New South Wales government released the latest amendments to the Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 4) Amendment Order (No 2) 2020, effective from 24 July 2020.

In summary the changes relevant are:

- the number of people allowed inside a place of public worship is the lesser of 'one person per 4 square metre' rule or 100 persons.
- the number of people allowed at a funeral is the lesser of 'one person per 4 square metre' rule or 100 persons.
- The number of people allowed at a wedding to have a capacity of the lesser of 'one person per 4 square metre' rule or 150 persons.
- places of public worship must complete and adhere to the most recent approved COVID Safety Plan AND register as a COVID Safe business via the NSW Government website

- https://www.nsw.gov.au/register-your-business-as-covid-safe.

In addition to these amendments in the Public Health Order, the COVID Safety Plan for Places of Public Worship has also been updated. In summary the relevant changes are:

- Music is permissible if conducted safely. Musicians should be distanced 1.5 meters. Woodwind instruments should be discouraged. Singers should maintain at least 3 meters of physical distancing.
- Mingling and gathering after services should be suspended or adjusted.
- Continued need to record names and contact details of those present at services along with the date and time they attended.

We are providing musicians at our 5 pm, 10.15 am & 6 pm Masses, however, we discourage people from joining in the singing as suggested by NSW Health.

NEXT WEEKEND

Our CWF August Appeal, the first in the 20/21 Finance Year commences next weekend and envelopes are available at all pews today in readiness. These may be placed in the 2nd collection box near the York Street exit door.

The Diocese of Broken Bay Charitable Works Fund (CWF) is a Diocesan-wide Appeal that runs three times a year to raise funds for charities in the Diocese.

Which charities does the CWF support?

Donations to the CWF are distributed to five charities that directly support the people in our Diocese.

1. CatholicCare Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Practitioner Program

Over the last year, the Pastoral Care Practitioners have visited over 3,000 individual patients, 700 family members of a patient and more than 180 hospital staff members.

2. Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)

In our Diocese, there are almost 1,000 volunteer catechists (Catholic Religion teachers) who have received specialised training to provide 16,500 school students with a Catholic education. CCD staff and volunteers are committed to providing quality Catholic age-appropriate education in both primary and high schools. Without your support thousands of students in our Diocese will not receive Catholic education.

3. St Lucy's School

St Lucy's School is a Catholic K-8 school (moving towards K-12 in 2024) in the Dominican tradition for students with disabilities. We provide a holistic education, operating outstanding academic programs taught by special educators. At St Lucy's we view each child individually in order to unlock their unique potential and to encourage them to become independent.

4. St Edmund's College

St Edmund's is a 7 -12 high school for students with a wide range of disabilities including sensory impairment, intellectual disability and autism. St Edmunds creates a holistic learning environment incorporating academics and personal wellbeing through co-curricular activities.

5. The Ephpheta Centre

Ephpheta means "Be Open" and the Ephpheta Centre provides pastoral care, sacramental services, support and advocacy for all people who are deaf or hard of hearing. The chaplaincy team visits people confined to their homes, nursing homes, hospitals and those in prison, as well as friendship community gatherings catering to people across Sydney and the Central Coast.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

'God's reign is like ...'

There is a story of an Indian monk who found the world's largest diamond. In a nearby village a man had a dream that if he went to a certain monastery he could gain enormous wealth beyond all his hopes. The villager arrived at the monastery and told the monk his dream. The monk explained, 'The dream probably refers to this,' and handed over the diamond to him. The villager returned home with great joy, but that night tossed and turned. The next week he returned to the monastery, utterly exhausted and begged, 'Give me the wealth that enables you to give away this diamond so easily.'

The two parables today remind me of this Indian tale. Jesus says that the reign of God is so great a treasure that it is worth giving up all you have. People who have had profound experiences often struggle to find the words to describe this for others. They find themselves resorting to images - 'It was like ...; it was as if ...'. In the parables Jesus tries to find ways of explaining why the reign of God has so captivated his own imagination. Of course Jesus speaks of a treasure and a pearl he has already found, while the disciples and later Christians only glimpse God's reign in moments of insight. And yet even these brief and veiled alimpses have been enough to sustain disciples for two thousand years and even today there are many prepared to give all they have in following Christ. These men and women have found the wealth that enabled the monk to give away the diamond.

Paul, whose letter we are currently reading, is an example of one who lived out this parable with utter recklessness. Paul's encounter with the Risen Jesus led him to know the overwhelming love of God is not determined by following the Law, but is an utterly gracious gift of God to us. He reflects today, could anything get in the way of this love God has for us; and Paul concludes, there is nothing that can separate us from God's love. This is the treasure that Paul found, enabling him to put aside all the lawful requirements of Judaism he previously thought were the only way to salvation. Paul had once been a Pharisee, one completely dedicated and given over to his Jewish traditions and teaching. Yet, when he comes to know Jesus, he is able to let all this go, to 'hand over the diamond' of his previous life and take up a new calling to spread the Gospel he has now discovered. In the reading from Romans today, it is as if we are listening in to Paul's astonishment at the depths of God's love, a love of us that enabled God to give us Jesus. In a sense, Jesus is God's diamond, given over to us in love. Recognising this enables Paul to give over the diamond of his own life.

The third parable in the collection that Matthew offers picks up the theme of last week's parable about the weeds and the wheat growing together. Today's parable shifts the image from gardening to fishing where the net hauls in a wide catch of both good fish and worthless things. Once again, there will come a time when sorting will happen but not in the middle of the fishing process. Only when the fishing work is over, will the catch be sorted.
