

GOD'S LOVE AND REPENTANCE

God loves sinners. His love is undeserved and extends to all sinners of all kinds for all times. He loves the ungodly, the degenerate, and the unwilling—like Paul, who considered himself the worst of sinners (1 Timothy 1:15)

God's love has a purpose. He loves to claim sinners and change their lives, bringing them into a close relationship with himself and altering their behavior. We don't change in order to earn our acceptance from God. No, while we were still sinners Christ died for us. That love from God prompts us to follow his path, not our own. We are changed to love God and our neighbor—the two great commandments that summarize all of God's commands (Matthew 22:37-40). We become new creatures and abandon our old sinful ways.

We understand the simple principle. But so many others do not understand either God's love for sinners or the way it changes sinners. God loves all sinners just as they are—unbelievers; atheists; murderers; thieves; idolaters, including those who persecute and slaughter children, and families; Christians, adulterers; homosexuals; violent disturbers of the peace. All of them. You can add to the list from any newspaper or discussion you encounter.

But God's love is not tolerance. He does not pat sinners on the head and say, "There, there, I love you. It's all okay."

He loved us sinners so much he gave his Son so we will have eternal life. But his love does not enable us to continue in our self-destructive ways. We don't treat our children that way. We love them unconditionally, but we don't stand by and allow them to continue in behavior that will bring them trouble or pain. We don't let them attack their siblings or neighborhood children and say, "I love you, and it's okay to do it again."

We shouldn't mock God by suggesting that he accepts and condones all behavior and all opinions. He has said something much different. When Jesus began his ministry, Mark and Matthew both identified his message, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near" (Matthew 4:17; see also Mark 1:15). Repentance is always turning away from a wrong path to God's. His path of gracious love and forgiveness brings change, but the path away from God's leads into the abyss of self-destruction. So we turn toward what God wants by the very power he gives in the gospel.

It's a simple principle even if our sinful natures want to distort and dilute it. Love is not tolerance. It does not excuse what is wrong. It does not enable the sinner to continue in sin. Does God love the murderer? Yes. It murder acceptable? No! When he says that sexual perversion is wrong, does he love those who participate? Yes! Does his love become only a bland and blind tolerance that enables it to continue? No! Does he love the domestic abuser? Yes. Does he excuse the violence? No! He threatens to punish all who transgress, but even that threat is a loving rebuke to lead to repentance and change.

We are to love God in gratitude that he first loved us and gave himself for us. We are also to love others—sinners of all kinds—just as he did but without enabling them to continue in sin and rebellion. Be ready, as Peter says, to respond with gentleness and respect (1 $\,$ Peter 3:15). We seek to bring others to know Jesus so they may proclaim his light by their confession and by the way they live. It is God's plan for us and for all sinners.

PORT PIRIE BISHOP TO BE INSTALLED NEXT MONTH

Fr Karol Kulczycki SDS, Bishop-elect of the Diocese of Port Pirie, will be installed on October 28 after being ordained in Poland later this month.

FR KULCZYCKI'S EPISCOPAL ORDINATION

Will take place on September 29, the Feast of the Archangels, in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Trzebinia – the church in which he was ordained a priest in 1994.

Archbishop Adolfo Tito Yllana, Apostolic Nuncio to Australia, will be the principal celebrant, assisted by the Archbishop of Krakow and the Auxiliary Bishop of Wroclaw.

The ordination Mass, which will be celebrated in English, will be live-streamed through The Salvatorian Website at 7pm Australian Eastern Standard Time. https://www.sdsau.com/bishop/

Fr Kulczycki, who became an Australian citizen during his 21 years of ministry in the Archdiocese of Perth and Diocese of Geraldton between 1997 and 2018, is expected to travel to Australia in early October before serving two weeks in quarantine.

He will be installed as the 12th Bishop of Port Pirie (formerly Port Augusta) on October 28. The celebration will have limited attendees due to COVID-19 restrictions, but bishops from the Adelaide Province, which includes the Northern Territory, will be present. The installation will be live-streamed.

Port Pirie Bishop Greg O'Kelly SJ said the people of the diocese are very much looking forward to welcoming their new shepherd.

"Bishop-Elect Karol will arrive at an unusual time in the history of our diocese, our country and our world, but we plan to ensure he receives a welcome befitting the new ministry he is undertaking," he said

"We continue to pray for him, and will do so especially on the 29th of September, when he is ordained bishop."





MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS

FOR THE 106TH WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES 2020

Like Jesus Christ, forced to flee. Welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating internally displaced persons. At the beginning of this year, in my Address to the members of the Diplomatic Corps accredited to the Holy See, I pointed to the tragedy of internally displaced people as one of the challenges of our contemporary world: "Situations of conflict and humanitarian emergencies, aggravated by climate change, are increasing the numbers of displaced persons and affecting people already living in a state of dire poverty. Many of the countries experiencing these situations lack adequate structures for meeting the needs of the displaced" (9 January 2020). The Migrants and Refugees Section of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development has issued the document "Pastoral Orientations on Internally Displaced People" (Vatican City, 5 May 2020), which aims to inspire and encourage the pastoral work of the Church in this specific area. For these reasons, I have decided to devote this Message to the drama of internally displaced persons, an often unseen tragedy that the global crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic has only exacerbated. In fact, due to its virulence, severity and geographical extent, this crisis has impacted on many other humanitarian emergencies that affect millions of people, which has relegated to the bottom of national political agendas those urgent international efforts essential to saving lives. But "this is not a time for forgetfulness. The crisis we are facing should not make us forget the many other crises that bring suffering to so many people" (Urbi et Orbi Message, 12 April 2020).



In the light of the tragic events that have marked 2020, I would like this Message, although concerned with internally displaced persons, to embrace all those who are experiencing situations of precariousness, abandonment, marginalisation and rejection as a result of COVID-19.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

In the first reading, the people of Israel challenge the justice of God. The issue is the question of retribution, the manner in which God rewards righteous living and punishes wicked behaviour. A counter accusation claims that it is not the ways of God that are unfair, but the ways of Israel. Two situations are described - the sin of a righteous person and the repentance of a sinner. God metes out punishment in the first situation and grants a reward in the second. Here we see that the justice of God corresponds to the character of one's present manner of behaviour, to the kind of person one has become. How is this injustice on God's part?

The words 'way' and 'path', found in the psalm response, are associated with the wisdom tradition and refer to a manner of living, specifically the way of righteousness or the way of evil. When used in reference to God it can mean either God's own ways of acting or the ways that God teaches humankind to follow. This psalm seems to allow for both meanings. Understood from God's perspective, it refers to the

salvation accomplished by God (v.5), to God's covenantal commitment expressed in covenant language such as 'compassion' and 'lovingkindness', (v.6), and to God's own uprightness, which is shown to both sinners and the 'humble' (v.8). Finally, the psalmist prays: Teach me your ways.

Today's second reading contains one of Christianity's most exalted hymns of praise of Christ. Paul offered this magnificent vision of Christ's self-emptying as a stirring incentive for the Philippians' own attitudes of mind and heart. The message that Paul is preaching here is unity within the church. The basis for Paul's appeal for unity is fourfold: the Christians' common experience of Christ; the love that Christ has shown them; their communion in the Spirit; and the compassion and mercy of Christ. After exhorting the Philippians to live in such unity, Paul offers Christ as their model. He describes Jesus' humiliation (vv. 6-8) and his exaltation by God (vv.9-11). The exaltation of Christ is as glorious as his humiliation was debasing.

Jesus tells a story about two sons. The first one refuses to obey his father, a serious breach in patriarchal kinship behaviour. However, he repents and eventually obeys his father. The second son does not disrespect his father with refusal, but neither does he obey him. Jesus asks his adversaries to interpret the law: Which son did the father's will? Without knowing it, they condemned themselves with their own answer. In a paradoxical fashion, Jesus tells them that sinners will enter the kingdom of God before these who appear to be righteous. The story demonstrates how fidelity to God's will is more than a question of words; it is a matter of deeds. Jesus has tricked his opponents, thereby enhancing his own reputation in the minds of the people.


