A LETTER FROM FR GREG

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

You would have seen in the bulletin that for the last few weeks we have been raising money for a new project in the parish – the installation of air-conditioning in our church.

I am sure that you are more aware than I, that during summer our church gets extremely hot and in winter it gets bitterly cold. We have many elderly parishioners in our community, and my experience here so far has shown that during summer many people became unwell, with some even requiring an ambulance due to the effects of the heat. During winter, many people have shared with me that it is too cold for them while they are sitting and praying in the church. Not only is this uncomfortable and distracting, it has actually resulted in numerous people leaving our parish to look for churches that have air conditioning. After receiving countless comments about this issue, I felt compassion towards you and compelled to do something about it. After a few weeks of raising money for this project I have further seen that there are many of you who are very supportive of this and wish for it to happen. While I acknowledge that some people have been concerned that we are spending a lot of money on one project and not investing it in different ways, I do not believe the before-mentioned situation can not be ignored, and has to be a priority for the comfort and health of our community.

Since the beginning of this project we have investigated different quotes, which have come in between \$38,000 and \$77,000, each having a different system and method of providing warm or cold air. After a few weeks of working on this project with the finance committee, parish council and the air conditioning companies, I have chosen the one which I believe is the most economical and practical option for this parish. This option will cost us \$38,000 including other necessary installation costs such as extension of power and woodwork. Please note that this is much less than was previously advertised in the parish bulletin.

I am incredibly grateful for all the donations and your generosity which has supported this project so far. To date, we have raised more than \$17,500, which is already half of the full amount. Due to the urgency of this situation with summer around the corner, it has been decided that we will cover the rest of the cost using money from our long term saving account with the view to undertake further fundraisers and activities to return the used money to the parish within 12 months. There are already arrangements underway for an activity which will provide us with a new regular income which will be communicated to you shortly. Please be assured that, together with the finance committee, I am working to make sure that we have multiple of sources of income for the parish to support the many projects we undertake. We still greatly appreciate and need your support, prayers and donations. If you wish to contribute towards this project, there are still envelopes at the back of the church or please contact one of our priests or the parish office.

We are also aware that air-conditioning has running costs, so before we install it I wanted to ensure the power bill will not deplete the parish finances and be prohibitive to use. As you may be aware we received a bequest from one of our departed parishioners, and have be keeping this money in our long term deposit account. The interest has not been justifiably profitable and therefore, together with the finance committee and parish council, I have decided to invest some of this money into solar panels. By doing this, we will save between \$5000-\$7000 every year, which means that after 4-5 years it will have paid for itself and will continue to save the parish a significant amount of money into the future, as well as cover the ongoing expenses.

I feel confident that this and other projects in the parish will be very well received by you and you will continue to show the parish your support. All that I do is for you and this parish community to make sure that not just the spiritual needs but also the physical needs of those who are here are met.

Together with the parish staff, we have been working hard to make sure you feel welcome, and the environment is conducive to you encountering Jesus, therefore nourished spiritually.

I ask that you please keep in your prayers the finance committee, parish council and all the parish staff, that we may continue to work together to make this parish community grow more in love for God and for our neighbour.



FEAST OF ST FRANCIS

The 4th October is the Feast Day of St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology, merchants, animals and Italy. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare and the Third Order of St. Francis for lay people.

In 1223, Francis arranged the first Christmas nativity scene.

In 1224 he received the Stigmata which would make him the second person in Christian tradition after St. Paul (Galatians 6:17) to bear the wounds of Christ's Passion.

In 1209 he composed a simple rule for his followers ("friars"), which came from verses in the Bible. The rule was "To follow the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ and to walk in his footsteps".

Francis set out to imitate Christ and literally carry out his work. This is important in understanding Francis' character, his affinity for the Eucharist and respect for the priests who carried out the sacrament.

He believed that nature itself was the mirror of God. He called all creatures his "brothers" and "sisters", and even preached to the birds. St. Francis gives us striking witness that when we are at peace with God we are better able to devote ourselves to building up that peace with all creation which is inseparable from peace among all peoples." Francis's spirituality was simply to "observe the Gospel."

As a summary of the elements of Franciscan spirituality, a Franciscan should live:

- in communion with Christ poor and crucified,
- in the love of God,
- in brother/sisterhood with all people and all of creation,
- · participating in the life and mission of the Church,
- in continual conversion,
- in a life of prayer liturgical, personal, communal,
- as instruments of peace.

For those who could not leave their homes, he formed a fraternity composed of either laity or clergy whose members neither withdrew from the world nor took religious vows. Instead, they observed the principles of Franciscan life in their daily lives. The Third Order is now titled the Secular Franciscan Order.

Secular Franciscans can be recognized by the Tau Cross they wear.

Conditions for admission to the Order are:

- · to profess the Catholic faith,
- to live in communion with the Church,
- to be of good moral standing, and
- to show clear signs of a vocation.

Membership in the Order is attained through a time of initiation, a time of formation, and the Profession of the Rule.

Professed members use the letters OFS after their name in line with the official name of the Order.

A number of Popes have been members of this Order.

He leased his vineyard to other farmers.

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when

the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone.

This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

In the first reading, the people of Israel challenge the justice of God. The issue is the question of retribution, the manner in which God rewards righteous living and punishes wicked behaviour. A counter accusation claims that it is not the ways of God that are unfair, but the ways of Israel. Two situations are described – the sin of a righteous person and the repentance of a sinner. God metes out punishment in the first situation and grants a reward in the second. Here we see that the justice of God corresponds to the character of one's present manner of behaviour, to the kind of person one has become. How is this injustice on God's part?

The words 'way' and 'path', found in the psalm response, are associated with the wisdom tradition and refer to a manner of living, specifically the way of righteousness or the way of evil. When used in reference to God it can mean either God's own ways of acting or the ways that God teaches humankind to follow. This psalm seems to allow for both meanings. Understood from God's perspective, it refers to the salvation accomplished by God (v.5), to God's covenantal commitment expressed in covenant language such as 'compassion' and 'lovingkindness', (v.6), and to God's own uprightness, which is shown to both sinners and the 'humble' (v.8). Finally, the psalmist prays: Teach me your ways.

Today's second reading contains one of Christianity's most exalted hymns of praise of Christ. Paul offered this magnificent vision of Christ's self-emptying as a stirring incentive for the Philippians' own attitudes of mind and heart. The message that Paul is preaching here is unity within the church. The basis for Paul's appeal for unity is fourfold: the Christians' common experience of Christ; the love that Christ has shown them; their communion in the Spirit; and the compassion and mercy of Christ. After exhorting the Philippians to live in such unity, Paul offers Christ as their model. He describes Jesus' humiliation (vv. 6-8) and his exaltation by God (vv.9-11). The exaltation of Christ is as glorious as his humiliation was debasing.

Jesus tells a story about two sons. The first one refuses to obey his father, a serious breach in patriarchal kinship behaviour. However, he repents and eventually obeys his father. The second son does not disrespect his father with refusal, but neither does he obey him. Jesus asks his adversaries to interpret the law: Which son did the father's will? Without knowing it, they condemned themselves with their own answer. In a paradoxical fashion, Jesus tells them that sinners will enter the kingdom of God before these who appear to be righteous. The story demonstrates how fidelity to God's will is more than a question of words; it is a matter of deeds. Jesus has tricked his opponents, thereby enhancing his own reputation in the minds of the people..


